REformed flection

from Steve

In the days following the ICE shooting in Minneapolis earlier this month, I came across a quote in my Facebook feed that has stayed with me - and I suspect will continue to do so. It's from British-Indian poet Nikita Gill:

*The rage you are feeling
Comes from the same place
Inside your heart as the love.*

I find this deeply resonant, no matter where one stands on today's hot-button political issues. We are living in a rage-filled - indeed, raging - society, where it is all too easy to become upset, fly off the handle, demonize the other. And often this happens precisely because there are things we care deeply about - people, principles, values. The mistake we sometimes make is letting our passion for those things supersede the people involved - and when that happens, our love can quickly slip into rage.

Our country is divided. Those divisions frequently surface within our communities and institutions - families included, and yes, the church. This is nothing new for us as Jesus-

followers. Roughly three-quarters of the New Testament consists of letters written to churches, nearly all of which address some form of conflict. Much of that conflict arose among passionate people who cared deeply about their faith and their communities - and when tensions emerged, their love gave way to rage.

But here's the grace-filled truth: when we step back and make room for the Spirit to do its work, we begin to see the wisdom Gill names so beautifully - that it all begins with love. And from that place, with God's help, we see those around us the way Jesus sees them, choosing to return to love rather than slipping into rage. After all, this is what Jesus taught and embodied with every his breath:

*I give you a new commandment, that you love one another.
Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.*

The love Jesus calls us to is rooted in a deep sense of right and wrong, of justice and injustice - but never at the expense of another person's dignity or worth, much less their very life. We are most fully the church of Jesus Christ when we recognize the love at the heart of all that we cherish and hold dear, and allow that love to lead the way.

May 23-29, 2026

Neighborhood is excited to offer a trip for local disciples to travel to Frontera de Cristo in Agua Prieta, Mexico. This is where our missionaries, Mark Adams and Miriam Maldonado are serving. We will spend 7 days learning about the work that they and their Mexican partners are doing.

Some of the places we will visit are the Migrant Resource Center, CAME and the Lily of the Valley Presbyterian Church. Cost- Each traveler will pay for their own air travel to Tucson. The Basic cost per person will be **\$700**. 

SC5 School of Theology: Registration Opens Late January



SC5 School of Theology 2026 Spring Semester March 27 & 28

The **SC5** School of Theology is sponsored by the five presbyteries in South Carolina: Charleston-Atlantic, Foothills, New Harmony, Providence, and Trinity.

What is the SC5 School of Theology? Theological training for elders and church leaders. There are two tracks:

- **Enrichment Track** – for Ruling Elders who have received a diploma from the SC5 School of Theology **and** for those who want personal enrichment for teaching or leading in their congregations.
- **Commissioned Ruling Elder (CRE)/Commissioned Pastor (CP) Track** – for Ruling Elders who want to become a CRE or CP.

For Whom? Classes are for:

- Church Leaders interested in learning more.
- Ruling Elders interested in learning more.
- Ruling Elders interested in being commissioned to serve and lead congregations.
- Faith Formation Leaders interested in better equipping themselves to teach.

When? Friday, March 27 through Saturday, March 28, 2026

Where? The SC5 School of Theology classes are held at Presbyterian College

Spring 2026 Semester Courses

- Old Testament (Core)
- Church History (Core)
- Worship & Sacraments (Core)
- Presbyterian Polity (Core)
- The Joyous Letter to the Church at Philippi (Elective)
- One Thread: Crafting Worship That Unravels (Elective)

Costs:

- Course and 2 meals: \$75 for Enrichment Track, \$95 for CRE/CP Track
