Next week brings Thanksgiving, and the wise among us are already making preparations—confirming family plans, ordering the turkey, and pulling together the rest of the menu. Many of us will find ourselves encouraging our congregations to give thanks. Thankfulness is a momentary act, a response to something good that happens to us or around us. It's what we feel when we see a familiar face across the table, when a prayer is answered, when we catch our breath at a sunset. It's real and important - but it's also fleeting, dependent on circumstance.

Gratitude, though, goes deeper. Gratitude is a way of living rather than a reaction to life. It roots itself not in what we have or what has happened, but in who God is and who we are in God. Gratitude holds joy and sorrow together - it allows us to say "thank you" even in seasons of uncertainty or pain, because we trust that God's presence abides. Living in gratitude shapes how we see others, how we give of ourselves, and how we lead. It turns our attention from scarcity to abundance, from fear to faith.

Every day I try to find something to be grateful for. Sometimes it's as simple as watching my dogs chase each other around the backyard and pausing to soak in the joy they bring. Later, on our walk, I notice the colors of the turning leaves - signs of beauty in a season of change. And then there are moments of deeper gratitude, like sitting in a presbytery meeting (yes - a presbytery meeting!), scanning the room and seeing so many of you - faithful colleagues guiding the church of Jesus Christ into its hopeful, unfolding future. Each of these moments reminds me that gratitude is not just something we feel, but something we practice, again and again.

In this season, may our thankfulness give rise to gratitude that endures beyond the holiday table - gratitude that forms our ministry, our communities, and our daily walk with Christ. Thank you for the ways you embody that grateful living in your service and care. Know that you are remembered with deep appreciation these days.

More than a year after the 2024 hurricanes, months after it has left the headlines, the work of long term recovery is just beginning for many.

One of the best ways we can take part in this important work is by taking a work team to one of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance's host sites. There are already two churches considering 2026 trips, and teaming up is always a great option.

The Presbytery of Western North Carolina runs three host sites. PDA's website provides the following information:

- Western North Carolina Presbytery is hosting volunteers in response to Hurricane Helene at Canton Presbyterian Church, New Hope Presbyterian Church and Spruce Pine Presbyterian Church.
- Please email Anne Waple to schedule a time for your group to serve.

- Minimum age: 16
- Maximum team size: 18
- Each church sets their own pricing (usually between \$20-\$30 per person, per night).

Providence Presbytery's Missions Coordinator Eric Robinson's church in Sarasota, Florida (First Presbyterian) also recently opened as a PDA host site. Neighborhood is excited to offer a trip for local disciples to travel
to Frontera de Cristo in Agua Prieta, Mexico. This is where our
missionaries, Mark Adams and Miriam Maldonado are serving.
We will spend 7 days learning about the work that they and their
Mexican partners are doing.

Some of the places we will visit are the Migrant Resource Center, CAME and the Lily of the Valley Presbyterian Church. Cost-Each traveler will pay for their own air travel to Tucson. The Basic cost per person will be \$700. This will include dormitory style lodging, meals, and transportation from the airport and while we are in Agua Prieta. We have a detailed Mission Handbook which we give to anyone who is interested in the trip.

New Workplace Justice Initiative

Our Presbytery is launching a new workplace justice initiative, and we need your help. Our first step is to use the gifts and skills in our Presbytery to create a "safety net" of sorts. Imagine how folks within our communities might benefit from the following:

 An employment lawyer to advocate for legal recourse in regards to unfair working conditions

- A realtor to help ensure people have the best housing option available
- Someone specializing in health care to help find affordable insurance
- A resume writer and interview coach to help navigate a potential employment change
- A financial coach to assist with budgeting and money management
- A social services expert to help navigate SNAP and other benefits

This is the exact type of network we want to build, a network of professionals in our Presbytery who are willing to donate their time and expertise. The initial vision is that it will work as a referral process. If there is someone in, or connected to someone in one of our churches who desires help, we would connect the person with a professional in our network would could provide assistance.

A \$96,000 SCHOLARSHIP OVER 4 YEARS FOR PRESBYTERIANS

The Presbyterian Promise Scholarship is a commitment by Presbyterian College to recognize students for their merit and affiliation with the Presbyterian Church. PC seeks to develop students academically and spiritually in this signature scholarship. Students who are members of Presbyterian churches, or who attend Presbyterian/Reformed secondary

schools, will receive a scholarship for a minimum of \$24,000 per year for up to four years—that's a \$96,000 commitment to you.
