

One of my favorite hymns is "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Over the past few months, I've found myself returning to it again and again—but not to the verse most people remember. It's the third verse that has stayed with me:

We share our mutual woes, our mutual burdens bear, and often for each other flows the sympathizing tear.

I want to thank each of you for sharing the burden my family and I have been carrying and will continue to carry. It hasn't been lost on me that you've done this for someone you barely know, someone who only joined this presbytery a short time ago. Your kindness, care, and faithfulness say so much about who you are as the body of Christ that is Providence Presbytery. It makes me both grateful as the one receiving care and proud as your Executive Presbyter.

Throughout Lorie's cancer journey, we were surrounded by incredible people who walked with us every step of the way - including the hospice care team who provided much-needed comfort in her final weeks. There's a sacredness to this particular season of life, I found. The boys and I felt it every time we stepped into the hospice house; every time family and friends visited, every time a prayer lifted up from afar. The ties that bind, y'all! When Lorie first went into hospice, one of the nurses gave me a small booklet titled "Gone From My Sight: The Dying Experience." It offered practical, compassionate guidance in simple language around what to expect as someone nears the end of life - ranging from three months out to the final hours. My boys found it especially helpful, giving them some

sense of what to expect and helping them meet those moments with courage and peace. It's the kind of thing I wish I'd had when I was pastoring, to share with congregants who found themselves in a similar season.

Because of that, I've ordered 50 copies for our pastors/CREs/educators on a first come/first served basis. If you're a pastor/CRE/educator in our presbytery and would like a copy, please reach out to **Rose** and she'll be happy to mail you one (multi-staff churches: just request one per church, please). There's no cost for this - consider this my thank you for your support and care over the past couple of months. (and if you want to purchase more, you can get them at www.bkbooks.com).

As my family and I figure out life going forward, I want you to know that I'm grateful to be in relationship with you. I'm glad to begin re-engaging some of the things we had to pause over the past couple of months, visiting your churches and restarting our Quarterly Coffees in September (stay tuned!), and, most of all, hearing your stories of the good you're doing and the good you're dreaming of.

Thank you for being part of the tie that binds us to each other and to the God who holds us all.


#### Free Church Pews

During times of disaster, the community is often in need of pastoral crisis intervention, and SC PDAT is always in need of this specialty to help our communities and congregations.






