Heat Advisory - Northern Hill Country, I-35 Corridor, Coastal Plains



Key Messages

- Heat Advisory in effect each day Thursday through Sunday for the northern Hill Country, I-35 Corridor, and Coastal Plains.
 - Extreme Heat Warning possible this weekend.
- High temperatures up to 105 degrees.
- Heat index values up to 113 degrees.
- Heat related illness possible for those not taking proper precautions.
- Drink plenty of water, take breaks out of the sun, and check up on relatives and neighbors.
- Limit strenuous activities to early morning or evening and know the symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

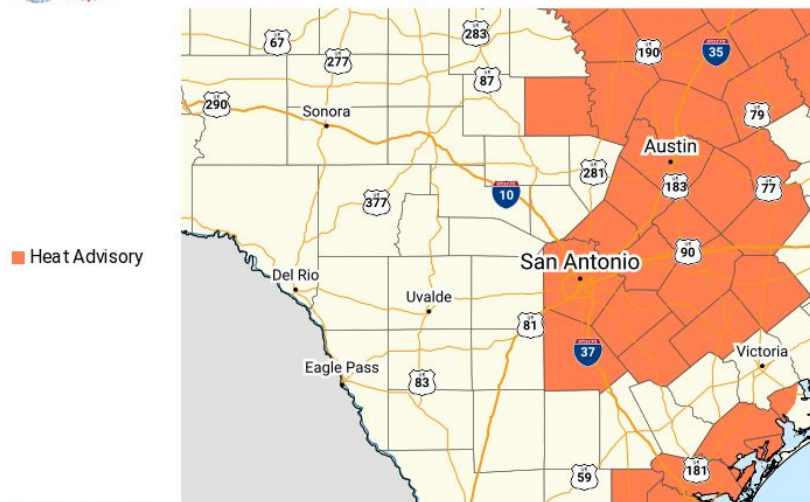

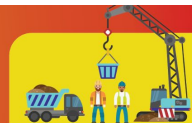
