April 2025 Executive Summary

Calls for Service

- Monthly Overview: April was a needed break after a busy start to the year. We saw a modest increase in calls for service over last year (14 this year vs. 11 in 2024). Llano County is finally starting to see some of the rain we need to alleviate our drought conditions. Warmer weather also means lake recreation, and we had our first call on Lake LBJ last month.
- ESD 5 Breakdown: Of 13 local calls, 65% were in District 1 (Sunrise Beach). Average response time was 4:53, with a 90th percentile of 6:26.
- YTD Update: Fiscal year-to-date, SBFD handled 130 calls (projected 222 annually), with 65% being EMS-related. Average response time is 3:56, with a 90th percentile of 9:24.

Fleet & Equipment Readiness

• Engine 259 (86E184): Limited to tender use; no further budget allocated for fire pump repairs. Will be retired upon delivery of the new engine.

Update on New Engine (11E230)

- Progress: Brindlee Mountain Fire Apparatus reports that the truck is being prepared for paint and cabinet coating application. Following the paintwork, the truck will go to our fabrication team for the completion of compartment modifications and shelving installation. They are still waiting on a few steering components to arrive.
- Timeline: On track for late June to early July completion.

Update on Fire Station 1

 Progress: The majority of the structural steel is now installed. The next steps involve replacing the building's metal siding, installing a new roof, pouring concrete for the second floor, and leveling the main floor to accommodate the expanded interior space.

Llano County-wide Wildland Task Force

Update: A proposed county wildland fire response task force agreement
has been submitted and is being reviewed with a likely discussion and
possible vote to adopt in June. The proposed plan divides the county into
east and west divisions, with each contributing to a brush fire task force
for major events requiring more than two departments to control or
extinguish.

Llano/Burnet County Lake LBJ Task Force

 Update: SBFD met with Granite Shoals FD, Granite Shoals PD and Horseshoe Bay FD to start work on developing a joint Lake LBJ Task Force agreement. Modeled after the existing Lake Travis agreement in Travis County, the plan will enable rapid notification and deployment of resources from Llano County, Burnet County, and Texas state agencies for emergencies on Lake LBJ, including preplanned communications for PSAPs and responders.

Texas Fire Chief's Association (TFCA) Conference

 Update: Chief Cates attended the annual TFCA conference in Waco on April 14-17. Discussions and workshops on fire service budgeting and finance, leadership strategies, operational lessons learned, and updates on ISO surveys and EV/lithium-ion battery fires were among the topics covered. This event provided 11 continuing education (CE) hours required for Head of Department certification with TCFP.

Annual CAPCOG Regional Wildfire Resiliency Summit

 Update: Chief Cates attended this summit in Austin on April 22. Lessons learned from the Parmer Lane WUI fire in Cedar Park in August 2023 were presented along with productive fire evacuation planning and interoperable communications discussions with regional partners.
