

Teachers may assign additional work to ensure that students who have been absent have sufficient opportunity to master the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) or to meet subject or course requirements. The assignments shall be based on the instructional objectives for the subject or course and may provide greater depth of subject matter than routine make-up work.

Sec. 2.16.1. TESTS AND MAKEUP WORK

Students shall be expected and will be permitted to make up assignments and tests after absences. All students will receive credit for satisfactory makeup work after an absence, including excused, unexcused absences and absences due to suspension from school.

A student will be given a reasonable time, or to the end of the current nine weeks grading cycle to makeup tests and other missed assignments in class. Students will receive a 50 for any assignment or test not made up within the current nine weeks grading cycle.

For any class missed, the teacher may assign the student make-up work based on the instructional objectives for the subject or course and the needs of the individual student in mastering the essential knowledge and skills or in meeting subject or course requirements. Parents and teachers will work together to ensure that students master the content covered during the absence and complete all assignments.

A student shall be responsible for obtaining and completing the make-up work in a satisfactory manner and within the current 9 weeks grading cycle.

Sec. 2.16.2. LATE PROJECTS

Teachers may accept all late projects and assignments up to two weeks prior to the end of the current 9 weeks grading cycle. Any projects or assignments assigned in the last week of the grading cycle must be completed 3 days prior to the close of the current grading cycle.
