

# MCS FAMILY INTERVIEW

# The Adler Family

### Tell us about your family?

After two decades living in the hustle and bustle of Los Angeles, in August of 2020, we moved our family of five to Santa Barbara. (While Josh is originally from the east coast, Conor was born and raised here in Santa Barbara). We spent countless weekends driving up to escape LA, got married here, and our dream was to eventually make it back-up here to raise our family in this beautiful community. We feel incredibly blessed to have been able to make that dream a reality. Along with Stella (7 yrs.), Maggie (5 yrs.), and Cooper (2 yrs.), we love an adventure. We adore all things Santa Barbara, especially walking, surfing, and swimming at the beautiful SB beaches, and try to take daily advantage of the convenience and community of this beautiful town.



### How did you discover MCS?

Having grown up in Santa Barbara, many of Conor's childhood friends attended MCS, so she was familiar with the community and teaching philosophy. When we moved to Santa Barbara, it was the obvious choice for our eldest daughter, Stella. Our middle daughter, Maggie, soon followed. This coming year Stella will be a second year in Aqua Door and Maggie a third year in Silver Door.

### What made you choose the Montessori philosophy and in particular, MCS for your children?

We chose Montessori Center School, first and foremost, because of the focus on the whole child. We've since experienced the very real benefits of a rich social-emotional curriculum, the peace education, and an unparalleled educational philosophy that strives to encourage a love of learning. Developing one's self-confidence, and an understanding of each individual's responsibilities to the environment and global community felt tantamount, especially in the midst of a worldwide pandemic. For us, our ultimate goal as parents is to inspire our children to be life-long learners, inclusive and accepting of all, as well as strong and independent thinkers. We believe Montessori Center School fosters an environment, and provides the necessary support, for all children to work towards being just that.

### What stands out about the faculty and staff?

We have consistently been impressed with how accessible and supportive the MCS staff and faculty are. The respect and kindness modeled for the children is both earnest and refreshing. While all MCS families likely cherish their teachers, Stella and Maggie have truly had the most generous, loving, engaged, and motivated

teachers. The girls have so much gratitude for the excitement and passion that each teacher and specialist continuously brings to their individual classrooms on a daily basis.

# How do you feel MCS handled the COVID-19 pandemic?

In addition to the Montessori philosophy, and MCS's ability to implement it so beautifully in our present world, we were drawn to MCS because of the exceptional way they were handling the COVID-19 pandemic. We were extremely impressed by how nimble and creative they were in utilizing outdoor spaces (with proper sun coverings), installing air purifiers, and, later in the pandemic, incorporating coordinated testing efforts. We found the level of communication around the pandemic to be honest, transparent, and remarkably helpful. We were especially impressed with how each and every staff member, including the directors and administrators, worked to ensure the health and safety of the entire MCS community, as a whole.

### In what ways do you enjoy volunteering at MCS?

As parents, we appreciate having the opportunity to volunteer at MCS. The ability to help foster a feeling of community, while simultaneously creating a stronger connection to our children's daily lives, makes for a win-win scenario. It has been our small way to show our appreciation for our teachers, staff, and the larger MCS community.

### What do you love most about MCS?

There are so many things to love about MCS. Specifically, though, we relish how MCS fosters a true sense of community. Even through the pandemic, our children felt a particularly close connection to their classmates and teachers. MCS continues to offer such a wonderfully rich and supportive environment, even during an uncertain time.

# What does your child enjoy most about the Montessori approach to learning?

When Stella and Maggie are asked what they appreciate and enjoy most about Montessori, a smile slowly grows on each of their faces ... "The teachers! They are so respectful and they understand what each kid needs. I love that each specialist has their own unique personality." There's definitely a bit of extra love around our house for Leane.

# How did the outdoor learning environments benefit your child this year?

Our temperate coastal landscape offers the perfect environment for outdoor learning. We are so pleased to see MCS utilizing this gift in such an extraordinary way. We continue to experience huge benefits from the outdoor learning environments at MCS and strongly believe in the research that shows increased levels of concentration and engagement, as well as reduced stress levels.

# What are a few aspects of the learning at MCS that you hope your children will carry their entire lives?

As parents who strive to raise strong and independent thinkers, the idea of auto-education was very appealing to us. We very much believe in the notion that doing for a child, what they can do for themselves, does them a grave disservice and it's one of the core principles that immediately drew us to Montessori. We value freedom of thought, freedom of exploration, and freedom of expression. Providing that sort of space to a child, from the outset, lays the foundation for self-aware, self-able, and self-confident adults. What parent doesn't want that for their children?

# STRATEGIC PLAN

# Year Three in Review

In 2021-2022, MCS successfully provided a safe, academic environment for learning and growth. In fall 2021, we welcomed our students to campus for in-person learning and returned to operating as one unit within the classroom. By spring of 2022, we were able to invite families onto campus, host group gatherings, field trips and more. As we look to the future, our hope is to continue to reintroduce more of our signature Montessori activities and events for which the school is known.

As part of our five-year strategic plan, MCS established three key strategic plan initiatives to guide our faculty, staff and board daily:

- 1. A transformative school experience through exemplary Montessori academics, programs and relationships
- 2. Our sustainable future
- 3. An engaged, informed, collaborative community

Below we highlight several strategic plan accomplishments from the 2021-2022 school year.

### STEAM LAB OPENING

In alignment with Montessori Center School's commitment to academic excellence, the school opened its first STEAM lab. Funded by donations from friends and family members of MCS, the interactive space engages students in hands-on, age-appropriate projects, experiments, and activities that integrate the Montessori curriculum in science, art, technology, engineering, and mathematical concepts. Within the STEAM lab, students have the opportunity to flex their critical thinking and creative muscles to collaborate, problem solve, create and innovate — all pillars of 21st-century learning. Our STEAM Lab opening was featured on the front page of The Santa Barbara News-Press and other digital news outlets.

### GARDENING WITH EXPLORE ECOLOGY

The MCS gardens have always been beautiful extensions of the Montessori classroom. Gardening aligns with the school's commitment to honor and develop the whole child. In addition to expanding students' studies in botany, chemistry and math, it engages all the senses, refines fine motor skills, promotes peace and reinforces our core value, Respect for All.

In winter 2021, MCS expanded its specialist curriculum to include gardening. In partnership with local nonprofit, Explore Ecology, students received weekly instruction and learned how to grow their own organic food. Students have taken ownership of their classroom gardens and maintained the food and flowers produced in them.

### **COVID-19 HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES**

MCS prioritized the health and safety of its community. Working closely with the MCS COVID-19 task force of medical experts, board members and administrators, MCS navigated evolving guidelines and best practices from the California Department of Public Health.



During the 2021-22 school year, MCS implemented surveillance and rapid testing programs for children in kindergarten through sixth grade and offered off-site free testing in partnership with Aptitude Diagnostics. Additionally, MCS provided free at-home tests to all families during holiday breaks to reduce the spread of transmission. MCS has continued to successfully adjust its masking policy based on community transmission levels. As of June 2022, 100% of staff have received COVID vaccinations.

### STRENGTHENING OUR FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY — INVESTING FOR THE FUTURE

The Board of Trustees established an Ad Hoc Investment Committee to review our current investment policy statement, which was very conservative and geared towards funding the construction of the Hollister property as our future new campus. As this will take years to develop, the committee revised the policy to include less conservative investment strategies to increase the return of the investments.

The Committee also recommended using a firm to fully manage the investment portfolio to increase the return of the investments, with the flexibility of the revised investment policy statement.

The Board of Trustees voted to approve the revised investment policy statement and to transfer our investment portfolio to Frontier Investments to manage.

### **CAMPUS LIFE**

For the first time in two years, MCS welcomed the return of outdoor cross-classroom socializing within each elementary level, field trips, extracurriculars and events. In spring 2022, we hosted our Annual Auction Benefit, securing record-level sponsorship revenue. In June, we were able to invite our families to attend our outdoor promotion and graduation ceremonies as we honored our 2022 promotees and graduates.

### **ALUMNI RELATIONS**

MCS established an alumni committee to strengthen ties between our MCS community, alumni students and staff. The alumni committee met a few times during the year to identify short and long-term needs, as we plan for the next school year.






