

<u>Director's Note</u>



Citizen Kane, often regarded as the greatest film ever made, is lauded for its technical achievements in cinematography and its unconventional (for the time) nonlinear story structure. *Abbey Road*, with its expansive concluding medley of song snippets blending seamlessly from one to another, stands out amongst even The Beatles' prolific and experimental decade of recording. *The Sound of Music*, awarded on both stage and screen, is inspired by a true story, has the historical significance of depicting a pre-War Austria, and is packed to the gills with earworm songs.

What do Orson Welles's first film, The Beatles' final record, and a Rodgers & Hammerstein musical have in common? They've all been bestowed the shiny nametag of "classic."

The thing that makes a piece of art truly timeless are its themes. Themes echo across eternity because they are what speak to us about ourselves and about the human condition. They are what make each of these works "classic," whether it is the yearning for youthful innocence in Kane, or the message of "The love you take is equal to the love you make" from The Beatles.

As a piece of art, *The Sound of Music* is especially potent, because it tells us that artwork and the act of creating are essential to a fulfilling life. After his wife's passing, Captain von Trapp has receded into himself and his children have turned into marching, obedient automatons. Why? Because the Captain has all but banished music from his home; it is too painful to face now that he is a widower. But then, as you'll see, in comes Maria with guitar in hand; things change, and things get better with art and creative play in the house again.

How do you keep art in your life? Is it by catching a movie on TCM that still speaks to you even though it's over 80 years old? Did you listen to your favorite band on the drive to work today? Do you cook, scrapbook, or even just doodle while you're on the phone? You may not be aware how much art means to your life, or why you keep revisiting the classics again and again.

As you enjoy *The Sound of Music*, I hope that its story of connection and creation inspires you to celebrate the artwork you already have in your life or encourages you to seek out something new to enjoy, even if that "new" thing is actually a decades-old classic.
