A Message from the Rector



Over Christmas we had a family walk to Stonea Camp, the late Iron Age fort that was occupied by the Romans just three or four decades after the death of Jesus. It reminded me of one of my favourite films when I was a teenager, Monty Python's *Life of Brian*. Like the defeated Iceni tribe, John Cleese, the leader of the Jewish resistance in the film, rallies his followers by demanding, 'What have the Romans ever given us?' After an embarrassing pause, the answers start flowing: the aqueduct, sanitation, irrigation, roads, medicine, education, wine, public baths and safe streets at night.

Like Jerusalem, North Africa, and much of continental Europe, England also benefitted from Roman imperialism during the *Pax Romana*, when there was peace between countries within the Empire. The foundation of modern England owes much to Roman legacy. But there were some things that the Romans did that we would find abhorrent. They crucified people.

The Romans crucified people in their thousands. For miles the roads to Rome were lined with the corpses of captured prisoners of war nailed to crosses. Crucifixion was the normal punishment for a slave. The cross was a symbol of terror, Roman domination and power. It kept the poor, on whom the rich depended for their cheap labour, in their place.

Yet there was one person who died on a cross who changed the whole Roman Empire. Christians believe (and so do most historians) that Jesus died on a cross outside the walls of Jerusalem in the 30's AD. Over 500 people saw him resurrected back to life on several different occasions. It took 300 years before the Roman Emperor also became a Christian, and the rest, they say, is history. England also became a Christian country. Instead of a symbol of terror the cross became jewellery, a thing of beauty.

Plough Sunday

This year Plough Sunday, held at the beginning of January, was celebrated at Wimblington Church.

For many generations, each Autumn, it has been the tradition to celebrate and give thanks for the harvest. The work then starts again as the farmers get busy preparing the ground and sowing the new crops. After Christmas, the farming community would get together to celebrate the beginning of a new year. At the Plough Sunday service, a plough would be brought into the church to be blessed, the plough being a symbol that links the partnership of the farmer with God.

It would have been inconceivable to a child born on a working farm in 1926 to imagine how much farming would change over their lifetime. Horses were the mainstay of the farm and would have been used for all of the heavy activities, including pulling the plough. Once the harvest was ready, a “binder” (drawn by horse or tractor) cut the stalks that were then tied into sheaves. These bundles were stacked upright and left in the field to dry. A contractor, such as W H Betts from March, would visit the farm with a threshing machine which would separate the kernels from the straw. The process was very labour intensive and would involve all of the family including the children, as the bundles were fed into the machine and the grain was bagged.



How things have changed in such a relatively short time. Machinery has got bigger, faster and “very clever”. Huge amounts of wheat are cut at a time, processed and grain dropped immediately into the accompanying trailer. The driver will be in an air-conditioned cab, with satellite mapping and laser guided steering! In addition, the changes off the farm, in research and development, means the yield from the crops has doubled.



There has also been a change in the church’s role in the community. The harvest is still celebrated, but gone are the days of the harvest supper and sale, donations are now made for the local food bank and there is no plough in the church for Plough Sunday, but we still remember our farming community.

A farmer was looking over his field of growing crops when his local vicar stopped by, the vicar said “Isn’t God great to produce such wonder” to which the farmer replied “I think it is more of a partnership, as you should have seen it when He was left to look after the field on his own!”

We are pleased to advise that the DNPNG met with Fenland District Council (FDC) in early January, and they told us that they are happy for us to take the Regulation 14 Plan to open consultation. FDC said they recognised the huge amount of work that has already gone into the project. This is a significant milestone and as Chair, I am very grateful to all the group for their time and effort in bringing it to this point.

So, the next stage is to open the public consultation on **Monday 2nd February** for 6 weeks (to 16th March). During this time the draft Plan will be available for feedback and can be viewed on the FDC and Doddington Parish Council websites along with all the supporting documentation.

The plan will be shared with key stakeholders, and local businesses and hard copies will be available to view at several locations and organisations within the village and beyond. Regular updates will be posted on Facebook and the community notice boards.

Mind your health

Daisy Fancourt is an award-winning scientist and British researcher, professor of psychobiology and epidemiology at the UCL. She specialises in the relationships between health (including mental health) and lifestyle choices.

Her most recent book, "Art Cure: The Science of How the Arts Transform Our Health", discusses the proven links between physical health, mental health and the practice of art. By "art", she is referring both to the activities that are carried out for their beauty or emotional expression; that includes the creative aspect but also the consumption of art, such as going to a museum or listening to music (listening to music, not just having it play in the background). Her book is full of references to medical research and studies that prove how art has a direct, causal, provable impact on health.

When referencing arts, she is obviously talking among others of painting and singing, but includes in the list arts such as reading, knitting, cooking and more.

Obviously, some of these claims are self-evident (dancing is good for the body), some are well-known (patients with dementia who cannot remember the names of their children but can sing along word-perfect to songs of their youth), and some are easy to understand (creativity reduces depression).


Other aspects are more surprising as we discover the result of recent investigations and research into the interaction between art and health. Art has a lot of multi-sensory activities that assist in diets, sleep and recovery. Arts activate reward mechanisms in our brains, producing dopamine and reducing inflammations. Arts also impact biological ageing by energizing links in our brains that would deteriorate with age.

Many examples illustrate her concepts: overcoming the physical degradation of a stroke through painting, hospitalised children who required less pain medication when distracted by theatre. These effects have more impact than just entertainment value.

This does not mean that art is some sort of panacea and some of the common beliefs are debunked (e.g. making newborn children hear Mozart does not influence their IQ, however singing to and with children does have an effect).

This book includes tips as to things **you** could do in **your** everyday life.

The group is run by Steve Wright, who explained some of the rules like, “you must walk and not run, you can only take three touches before passing to someone else and the ball should not go over shoulder height”. He said that this made the game much more inclusive, including the less mobile and inexperienced.

In the interviews that followed some of the players were asked why they attend. Some very familiar voices said, “following retirement, it keeps you active and involved, it is a fantastic thing to do” and “it has helped me through some difficult times”. While they obviously enjoy the football, they equally enjoy the banter and tea afterwards. They all acknowledged the benefits to mental health that the social side of the group brings, as they meet up away from the football for curry nights, and local trips out, that generally involved investigating the local pubs!

Steve says that the sessions are held every Monday and Wednesday morning: come rain, sun, bank holidays, broken biscuits, sugar shortage, summer holidays, sleep deprivation etc. We kick off at 10.00am so if you wish to join in, come early so we have time to sort the teams and warm up.

Parish Council Report

Parish Precept 2026/2027

At its recent meeting, the Parish Council agreed to increase its annual precept by £3,000 to £68,000. A precept of £68,000 for Parish Council purposes works out at an annual charge on residential dwellings of £76.40, an increase on the current year's element of £3.37 or just over 6p per week.

Village Improvements

During the current financial year, a significant number of village improvements have taken place or are scheduled to be completed before the end of March 2026.

The Aerial Runway (Zip wire) and a Cone Climber within the Abbey Recreation grounds have been installed as additional recreational features for the children. In addition, the Pavilion's existing fire safety provisions have been updated and improved.

Nine new public seats to replace those around the village have been ordered for delivery and installation during February.

100th Club



Doddington 80 Years Ago : February 1946

Mr Alan Conway was appointed Surgical Superintendent at the hospital succeeding Dr J.M. Scott Slater who had resigned. Mr Conway had served in the Royal Army Medical Corps during the war seeing service in North Africa, Palestine and Europe, holding the rank of Surgeon Major.

Mr Alfred Stokeley, 55 High Street, retired as a baker after 40 years in Doddington. His business was transferred to Mr CT Saunders of March.

The Parish Council was in negotiations to re-purchase the old fire engine house from the Rural District Council to use as a storeroom.

The Rural District Council issued compulsory purchase orders for the land required for their Manor Estate housing development 10 acres from Messrs Deptford Brothers and the 0.6 acres site for prefabricated housing, now Peyton Close, from Mr JP Miller.

The ashes of Mrs Adelaide Bostock were interred in the churchyard, only the second occasion on which ashes had been buried here. Mrs Bostock died in Taunton aged 84, she was the daughter of the late Gideon Infield and her ashes were interred in the family vault.

Mr Jack Duffield, who had been a prisoner in the Far East, married Miss Mary Crofts of Leicester.

Doddington 50 Years Ago : February 1976

Doddington Hospital will not close and it will not be run down. It would become a general surgical hospital if only the right staff could be attracted to work in Fenland. These were firm promises given to a meeting in Wimblington by the chairman of the Area Heath Authority.

A television programme was made by Thames Television showing the work of community nurse Mrs Joan Bliss of the Nurse's House, Brickmakers Arms Lane.

The Parish Council were proceeding with the purchase of the Royal British Legion Hall for use as a village hall.

The Women's Institute gave their first performance, since forming a concert party under Mrs Franks, to the 100th Club. The performances included songs, recitations, sketches and funny stories.

Former Doddington village police constable Roger Minett was promoted to Chief Superintendent. He had left Doddington in 1959 when promoted to Sergeant.
