## A Message from the Rector



For over 800 years St Mary's church has witnessed the ups and downs of life in Doddington and while we continue to enjoy some of the old traditions we also evolve and introduce new things.

The Harvest Festival is certainly one of the old traditions, and as there has not been a Flower Festival at St Mary's since COVID, we are going to combine the two events to make it a weekend of celebration. The theme for the weekend will be just that, "CELEBRATIONS", which will tie in nicely with the theme of this year's Carnival. There will be more information in next month's Doddington Diary about how you can get involved (whether you are a flower arranger or not!), but in the meantime make a note of the date, the 2<sup>nd</sup> - 4<sup>th</sup> October.

There are a couple of new things that have recently started, the Café Church, meeting in the Church Rooms on the second Tuesday of each month is an informal and relaxed way of worship and at St Peter's Church in Wimblington they have just started Breakfast Church. This is at 9:30 on the first Sunday of the month, and we were delighted to see almost 40 people of all ages gather for the launch in February. Families from Doddington would be more than welcome.

At the same time, we love building on the links we already have. The church's Open the Book team enjoy sharing bible stories with the children at Lionel Walden School, and the children are now having some of their Religious Education lessons in the church itself. In the church we can show the children how connecting with Jesus is something we can do today, even amid our busy lives.

I also want to pay tribute to the Thrift Shop team, who recycle our pre-loved stuff and keep it out of landfill. Last year the team wanted to donate some of their earnings to charity and gave £600 to the Guide Dogs for the Blind Association. The Church Rooms also host the Community Living Room as a welcoming and warm space on Friday mornings.

Finally, we could really do with some help. We are looking for a Secretary of the Parochial Church Council to work with me to further the mission of the church. There are four meetings a year, and you would need to have computer skills to manage our online documentation, communication and publicity. A full role description is available. If you think you'd like to be part of building community with both tradition and relevance, then I'd love to hear from you.



## Lionel Walden Primary School



Over the past month, our school has enjoyed a wonderful series of events that brought our community together - both in the dining hall and in the digital world. Our latest round of **Parent Lunches** was a huge success, with families joining us to share a meal and spend meaningful time with their children during the school day.

### Safer Internet Day 2026

On **Tuesday 10th February 2026**, the whole school came together to mark **Safer Internet Day**, with this year's theme focusing on the rapidly growing presence of **AI** in young people's lives. Pupils explored how artificial intelligence is used in the world around them, the exciting ways it can help with learning and creativity, and the cautions they should consider as technology continues to evolve.

Across the school, children took part in workshops and discussions centred on:

- Understanding how AI works and where they already encounter it,
- Learning to think critically about information online,
- Exploring how AI tools can be used responsibly,
- Recognising how communication, kindness and empathy remain essential - even in digital spaces
- Young people were thoughtful, curious and mature in their discussions, showing a developing awareness of how their choices online shape their experiences.

A particular highlight this term was the work completed by our Year 5 pupils as part of the Fenland Cluster project **Online Voices, Kind Choices**. Schools from across Fenland came together to highlight the importance of how we communicate and interact online, recognising that positive digital habits must be nurtured from an early age.



Working in collaboration with **20Twenty Productions**, a full week of activities was planned to engage, inspire and teach the children about thoughtful and respectful online behaviour. The sessions ranged from drama-based workshops and practical discussions to creative tasks designed to help pupils think deeply about the impact of their words and actions online.

Throughout the week, Year 5 explored:

- How to communicate clearly, kindly and responsibly
- How their own "digital voices" influence others
- What to do if they encounter unkind or unsafe behaviour online
- How positive choices can shape safer, happier online spaces



As part of their learning, the children created a reflective **Q&A video**, a collection of original **poems**, and a vibrant set of **posters** that captured their understanding of kindness, safety and digital wellbeing.

Their work demonstrated maturity, empathy and a strong sense of responsibility—qualities that will serve them well as they continue to grow up in an increasingly online world.

### **A Fantastic Turnout for Our Big Online Safety Quiz**

To celebrate the children's achievements, we invited parents into school for a special showcase event. Families watched the Year 5 Q&A video, browsed the poems and posters proudly displayed, and then joined their children for our **Big Online Safety Quiz**.



The atmosphere was brilliant - full friendly competition and lots of conversation about staying safe online. The quiz sparked excellent discussions between parents and children, encouraging families to think together about how they use digital devices and how they can make the online world safer.

We are incredibly grateful to all the parents who attended. These events highlight how powerful it is when school and families work side by side to support children's digital wellbeing.

We talked for a long time about what we can do, The Doddington Horticultural Society started in 1892, and no one wants it to fold on our watch. We are proud of what we have achieved to date, and the committee and volunteers put in hours of hard work throughout the year.

We looked at lots of different options including downsizing, not having a marquee, not having stalls, cancelling the 2026 show and risk losing momentum, dispensing with prize money and engraving - but there were too many good reasons to carry on.

Thankfully the Doddington Horticultural Society would have the financial reserves to run the 2026 show at a loss, but this is not sustainable and it puts us at risk for future events. The aim is not to make a profit (any surplus funds go straight back into the show) but sensible and responsible fiscal management means we don't want to make a loss.

The committee has made some decisions, and we hope our visitors and exhibitors will understand and continue to support us.

- Entry fees for adults remain unchanged.
- Prize money remains unchanged.
- The number of classes and categories in the show remain unchanged.
- We will still have a marquee, stalls, an arena, a dog show and an evening event.
- Children will now pay £2 to enter as many classes in the children's section as they want.
- There will be a £1 admission fee on the gate for adults, children are free.
- The Grand Draw prizes will be reduced to £100, £50, £25 and other prizes.
- We will organise other events throughout the year to raise money for the show and we are currently looking at a Quiz Night and a Photography Competition.

- We will continue to look for grant and funding opportunities.
- We will offer the opportunity to make a real difference and become a **“Friend of the Village Show”** for a minimum donation of £20 per year. (These will all be acknowledged on show day). If you would like to become a Friend of the Village Show, please contact us to arrange payment:

Fenvision (formerly Isle of Ely Society for the Blind) is a registered charity established in 1923 supporting local people with visual impairment, within North East Cambridgeshire. The charity relies entirely on voluntary donations, legacies and grants to fund its vital work and it aims to improve the quality of life for all visually impaired people within Fenland.

Our resource centre holds lots of equipment that people can borrow and try before they buy and if we don't have an item, we can sometimes order it from a catalogue. We also have donated equipment which we can loan to members on a long-term basis, free of charge. We can help members with computer advice, and we have a large screen PC and keyboard which people can come in and use. We can also give advice on smartphones and I-pads. People often do not realise how useful these can be to someone with a visual impairment.

We also offer **Home Visits** to each of our members on registration with the Charity and to existing members on request as well as **Information and Advice** on low vision aids, equipment and services that are available at the March office and Resource Centre located in the Town Hall in March. We have equipment located in a cabinet at Aces Eye Clinic in Wisbech which can be purchased.

The Charity organises various social **Activities** throughout the year, including summer outings and Christmas parties. Each month our members enjoy meeting in The Griffin Hotel in March for lunch and a drink, or, if people prefer, they can just call in for a chat. We also meet once a month at The Lamb Hotel in Ely for coffee. Last year we organised two outings one to Carriages in Fen Drayton for an afternoon tea, which everyone thoroughly enjoyed, and then an outing to the Thursford Christmas Spectacular.

We keep in **Regular Contact** with our members through newsletters and birthday cards and we are always available and ready to help with your questions and problems.

## **Doddington 80 Years Ago : March 1946**

The month was dominated by local council elections the first held since 1937 owing to the War.

In the Isle of Ely County Council elections Joseph Norman of Wimblington defeated two other Wimblington candidates and was elected in the Benwick, Doddington and Wimblington (East) Ward and in the West Ward George Richards of Benwick defeated Rev Richard Ridge of Doddington.

In the North Witchford Rural District Council election for the Doddington Ward, HA Wool, FA Wood and TW Dack were elected, with RM Shaw, Mrs EE Darwood, Mrs DR Hardy and JW Edgeley being unsuccessful.

14 candidates contested the 9 Doddington Parish Council seats and H Wool, FA Wood, TW Dack, Mrs EE Darwood, RM Shaw, Mrs DR Hardy, SE Yardy, JW Edgeley and T Edgeley were successful. Losing out were R Watkinson, H Ellington, RR Driver, FW Driver and F Sutton. Mesdames Darwood and Hardy were the first women to be elected to the Parish Council since its creation in 1894.

At the annual Parish Meeting a vote was taken to attempt to purchase the field in Ingles lane as a playing field for the village.

The first consignment of bananas arrived at March grocers since before the War and were distributed to those under 18 years of age.
