Entering into Worship (*responsive*):

Liturgist: Holy God, We stand before you to confess. We carry sorrow in our hearts for the things we have done and for the things we have left undone. We have not sought to do Your will with our whole hearts. We have not loved ourselves as You love us. We have not lived with gratitude, nor loved others as Christ has loved us. Let us confess our sins in the presence of God and of one another.

Leader: You offered us Your blessings when You announced “Blessed are the poor in spirit.”

All: But we can be rich in greed, and often chase possessions instead of finding contentment in You. We confess that our materialism often blinds us to the suffering behind what we buy.

L: You bless those who mourn.

A: But we choose to close our eyes to the suffering of those exploited by forced labor, long hours, and unlawful wages. Forgive us for our indifference.

L: You bless the meek.

A: But we are a stiff-necked people. We seek to boast of our accomplishments instead of walking humbly in Your ways.

L: You bless those who hunger and thirst for righteousness.

A: But we fill ourselves with the trivial. We fail to seek justice where oppression thrives.

L: You bless the merciful.

A: But we can be quick to judge. Make us instruments of mercy and healing.

L: You bless the pure in heart.

A: But our hearts tend to seek selfish gains and pleasures rather than Your wants for us. Cleanse us from our desire for comfort that can cost our neighbor their freedom.

L: You bless the peacemakers.

A: But we treasure our comfort and often avoid reconciliation where we have caused harm. Give us courage to make peace and repair what we have broken.

L: You bless those who are persecuted for righteousness’ sake.

A: But we cower from opportunities to challenge those people and systems that wreak havoc in our world. We tend to prefer acceptance rather than truth.

L: You bless those who are insulted or spoken against because they follow You.

A: But we are often slow to show how we belong to You.

L: Open our eyes to see the ways we support systems of oppression. Where we over-consume, teach us contentment. Where we close our eyes to the costs of convenience, give us the courage to see the truth of their toll on our vulnerable neighbors. Free us from our pasts which we cannot change, and open to us futures filled with Your transforming Grace.

A: Amen. Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy.

L: Hear this good news. Blessed are those who confess and turn to God, for they shall be comforted. God, who is rich in mercy, makes us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. Know, in the deepest part of all you are, that in Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. May Almighty God strengthen all of us with the power of the Holy Spirit, that Christ may dwell in our hearts through faith.

A: Amen.
