LINDA'S STORY The Fairy Godmother Foundation of New York, Inc. was created to honor the legacy of an extraordinary young woman, Linda Shohatee (1997-2016). Linda spent more than half of her life in hospitals and despite the obstacles she faced, her story is one of strength and tenacity. Linda saw herself as a "survivor" and was relentless in her determination to live life to its fullest.

The Fairy Godmother Foundation of New York is committed to replicating the kindness and generosity that Linda experienced during her lifetime by granting manageable, meaningful experiences to enhance the quality of life of children and young adults living with medical or developmental challenges.

Linda loved Broadway; she performed with Dancing Dreams, dancing at Lincoln Center in the "Nutcracker in a Nutshell." She was a fan of Katy Perry, who visited and sang with Linda at NewYork-Presbyterian Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital (CHONY) when she was hospitalized with a serious illness. Linda made many big trips in her lifetime. She loved going to Camp Sunshine in Maine, where she sang in the Talent Show with her Camp friends. Thanks to the Marty Lyons Foundation, Linda was granted a "wish" trip to Disney World. Linda had a great sense of humor; she was direct and had no hesitation sharing her opinions.

Linda even co-authored an article in a professional nursing journal! A fashionista, Linda loved the Christie & Company Salon in Bayside and everyone there. She had several families: her family of birth, her healthcare families at Mount Sinai, CHONY, and St. Mary's, her school family at Marathon High School, and the Capitulo Family who met Linda when she was two years old. Ultimately, Katie Capitulo became Linda's very own "Fairy Godmother." Although Linda's life was full of challenges and far too brief, it truly was "Linda's Happy Life."

VIKTOR LESHCHENKO is an actor and performer in NYC, born and raised in Ukraine. Just 3 years ago Viktor was doing safety demonstrations for passengers onboard Boeing-787 Dreamliner aircraft and traveling all over Europe. The COVID-19 pandemic sent his airline into bankruptcy and became a blessing in disguise. It forced him to pursue his life-long dream – acting, having eliminated the 'flight attendant' as the last item on his list of plan-B jobs.

After finishing the AMDA, Viktor recently had his NYC theatrical debut, originating the role of Valentine in "Someone Has to Die" at Teatro Latea. Today he's a proud member of the NYC Gay Men's Chorus and he's inviting you to see their winter concert! A singer on a pink bus during the day, he clowns on the weekends at children's parties. He believes every child deserves to pursue their dreams, and live their lives to the fullest. He's immensely honored to be a part of this event.



### 2023 DREAM MAKER AWARD

### **★EMILY PERL KINGSLEY★**

Emily Perl Kingsley is an American writer who joined the Sesame Street team in 1970 and continued to write until her retirement in 2015. Her experiences with her son Jason, who was born with Down Syndrome, inspired her to include people with disabilities into the Sesame Street cast, including Tarah Schaeffer, an actress who uses a wheelchair, and Jason himself. In 1987, Kingsley wrote "Welcome to Holland," a widely published and translated essay which compares the experience of a parent learning their child has a disability to that of a person traveling to Italy and having their trip rerouted to Holland. The same year, Kingsley wrote "Kids Like These," a film about a middle-aged couple who have a son with Down Syndrome, which won numerous awards after premiering on CBS.

Kingsley has written over 20 children's books and two Sesame Street home video releases (Kids's Guide to Life: Learning to Share and Elmo Says Boo!). She has won 23 Daytime Emmys for her work with Sesame Street, three Equality, Dignity and Independence Awards and a Grand EDI Award from Easter Seals, and an award from the National Theatre of the Deaf. In October 2008, Emily received a special award from the Department of Health and Human Services in recognition of her groundbreaking work including individuals with disabilities on Sesame Street.



# 2023 DREAM MAKER AWARD ★JASON KINGSLEY★

Jason Kingsley is an American actor born with Down Syndrome. In 1975, Jason made his television debut on Sesame Street at just 15 months-old. Jason's role became a recurring one, appearing in 55 episodes in his Sesame Street career. He was one of the first people with Down Syndrome to appear on television. A trailblazer, Jason broke the glass ceiling for actors with disabilities. He also guest-starred in several TV shows, including The Fall Guy, All My Children, and Touched by an Angel.

Jason Kingsley co-authored "Count Us In: Growing Up with Down Syndrome" with friend Mitchell Levitz in 1994, detailing their experiences with Down Syndrome. In 2017, he co-starred with his friends Yaniv Gorodischer and Raymond Frost in the film "Far From the Tree," based on the New York Times bestselling book by Andrew Sullivan. The film explores the relationship between parent and child, particularly regarding differences in abilities. Jason, an advocate for people with special needs and disabilities, is sought after as an inspirational speaker and has appeared on the TODAY Show.



# \*WELCOME TO HOLLAND\*

I am often asked to describe the experience of raising a child with a disability – to try to help people who have not shared that unique experience to understand it, to imagine how it would feel. It's like this...

When you're going to have a baby, it's like planning a fabulous vacation trip – to Italy. You buy a bunch of guide books and make your wonderful plans. The Coliseum. The Michelangelo David. The gondolas in Venice. You may learn some handy phrases in Italian. It's all very exciting.

After months of eager anticipation, the day finally arrives. You pack your bags and off you go. Several hours later, the plane lands. The flight attendant comes in and says, "Welcome to Holland."

"Holland?!?" you say. "What do you mean Holland?? I signed up for Italy! I'm supposed to be in Italy. All my life I've dreamed of going to Italy."

But there's been a change in the flight plan. They've landed in Holland and there you must stay.

The important thing is that they haven't taken you to a horrible, disgusting, filthy place, full of pestilence, famine and disease. It's just a different place.

So you must go out and buy new guide books. And you must learn a whole new language. And you will meet a whole new group of people you would never have met.

It's just a different place. It's slower-paced than Italy, less flashy than Italy. But after you've been there for a while and you catch your breath, you look around... and you begin to notice that Holland has windmills... and Holland has tulips. Holland even has Rembrandts.

But everyone you know is busy coming and going from Italy... and they're all bragging about what a wonderful time they had there. And for the rest of your life, you will say, "Yes, that's where I was supposed to go. That's what I had planned."

And the pain of that will never, ever, ever, ever go away... because the loss of that dream is a very very significant loss.

But... if you spend your life mourning the fact that you didn't get to Italy, you may never be free to enjoy the very special, the very lovely things... about Holland.

**LAPTOPS** for several teens with cancer and and those who have undergone transplants.

BEDROOM FURNISHINGS for a 12 year-old with a severe blood disorder.

**DISNEY ON ICE EXPERIENCE** complete with princess attire and meals for a 3 year-old with complex medical needs and her family.

LIVING ROOM FURNITURE for a child with medical and developmental needs.

**ELMO EXTRAVAGANZA** for a child who has had multiple transplants (chair, toy chest, bedding, outfits, shoes, table)

**ADAPTIVE EQUIPMENT** car seat, stroller, chairs, and toys not covered by insurance for children with various complex medical needs.

BIKE AND HELMET for a teen with complex medical needs.

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




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

Christine made pills for the war effort at a factory on 22nd Street and Second avenue in New York City and had a picture taken, as a result of my father's birthday cake gift to the general.


## Robert Scott & Juana Vicens Scott
