



Guide to the AGM procedure 3rd December 2025.



- The Agenda will be published on the website 14 days from the AGM where members can download it, and bulk email out to everyone.
- 2. The chairman will open the meeting and conduct No's 1-12 on the agenda.
- 3. At No 13, Election of Officers the Chairman will stand down, and the Captain will take his place and once a chairman is elected, he will continue with the AGM.
- 4. There is no longer the use of the term AOB (*Any other Business*). This has been replaced with the term Agenda Item to fall in line with the way the current committee files their reports. If an issue is to be raised at the AGM, an Agenda item must be submitted in writing (email is acceptable) to the Chairman and or the Secretary, 14 days before the AGM. The closing date for submissions is the 19th of November 2025.



- 2. Enable two-factor authentication (2FA): This adds an extra layer of security by requiring a second form of verification when signing in.
- 3. Change your password regularly: Regularly update your passwords to prevent hackers from guessing them.
- 4. Be cautious of phishing and email spoofing: Avoid clicking on links or downloading attachments from suspicious emails.
- 5. Review security alerts: Check your email for any security alerts and take appropriate action.



Alternative Option for Stroke and Distance Rule for Seniors Non-Qualifying Winter Competitions

This is a new local rule that provides an alternative to stroke-and-distance relief for a ball that is lost outside a penalty area or out of bounds for *Non-Handicap Qualifying* winter competitions or casual play when playing with your friends

This is an alternative to the traditional stroke-and-distance penalty in golf, which is found in Model Local Rule E-5, which allows a player to drop a ball in the fairway for a two-stroke penalty. This local rule, recommended for casual play and *Non-Handicap Qualifying Competitions*, lets the player drop in a relief area between the estimated point where their ball was lost or went out of bounds and the nearest point on the fairway not closer to the hole than their original ball.

This option helps speed up play by preventing players from having to return to their previous spot to re-hit. This is an alternative to hitting a provisional ball, but if you have played a provisional ball then this option is not available.

How it works:

- 1. **Estimate the spot:** Determine the point where your ball was lost or went out of bounds.
- 2. **Find the fairway reference point:** Locate the point on the fairway of the hole being played that is nearest to your estimated spot but not closer to the hole.
- 3. **Drop in the relief area:** For two penalty strokes, you can drop a ball in the relief area. This area extends from the fairway reference point, not closer to the hole than your estimated spot.

Result: This means if you have lost a ball on your first stroke, you can drop a ball in the fairway as detailed above and your next shot will be your 4th shot, which is the consequence of adding two penalty shots



Golf Rule Scenarios in Winter Golf

As winter approaches and we play winter rules, I highlight some of the issues you may face, especially with lifting and cleaning your ball and if your ball is lost in Abnormal Course Conditions

When can you clean your Golf Ball?

Sometimes during the play of a hole, you may have the ball in your hand for various reasons, and it is *Rule 14.1c* that details when you are not permitted to clean it. Be warned, cleaning it when you are not allowed to do so will result in a penalty. First though, it's worth reiterating that you are always allowed to clean your golf ball:

1. When you've reached the safety of the putting green and are able to mark, lift and clean

- 2. Between the play of two holes.
- 3. Whenever you are taking free relief or a penalty drop, when your ball is in a penalty area and you take a penalty drop you can take relief or if your ball is plugged in its own pitch mark off the fairway, you can take free relief, therefore you can clean your ball.
- 4. Winter Rules When Preferred Lies are in play and your ball is in the fairway.

However, you may have the ball in your hand for other reasons before you reach the green, and there are four specific scenarios where you need to be careful.



- **5.** When lifting your ball under Rule 4.2c to determine if it is cracked or cut and therefore eligible for substitution during the play of a hole. If the ball proves not to be cracked or cut, you are not allowed to clean it before placing it back where it was and continuing play.
- 6. When lifting your ball to identify it

under *Rule 7.3*. In this scenario, cleaning is allowed only to the extent necessary to be able to identify your ball. So, you could clean away any mud perhaps covering your identification mark, but no further cleaning is permitted before placing the ball back where it was and continuing play.



- **7.** When your ball is interfering with play for another player, who requests you to lift it (e.g. on their line on the fringe and they want to putt or when it is too close to their ball for their next stroke). You are **not** allowed to clean your ball in this situation, so you need to either hold it carefully or place it down somewhere carefully before then replacing it once the other player has played their shot.
- **8.** When lifting your ball to see if it lies in a condition from which relief is allowed. A good example here would be when checking to see if your ball is definitely embedded in its own pitch mark or has just settled into a little indentation. If it's the latter, you are not allowed to clean your ball before placing it back down, but if you do end up taking relief under a Rule (e.g. the embedded ball rule) then you are allowed to clean it. If you clean your ball when not permitted to do so, or more than is necessary when cleaning your ball to identify it, you will be penalised one stroke under *Rule 14.1c*.

Lost Golf Ball in Abnormal Course Conditions.

If your ball is lost in an abnormal course condition (ACC), such as ground under repair or temporary water, you can take free relief under *Rule 16.1e*, provided you are "virtually certain" the ball is in the ACC. If you can't be certain, you must take stroke-and-distance relief, which means adding a penalty stroke and playing another ball from where you last hit. To take free relief, find the nearest point of complete relief and drop a ball within one club-length of that point, not closer to the hole. #

One place this is likely to occur at Welton through Winter is in the dips in the ground on the right of the 13th Fairway near the bunkers that fill with water, so if you and your playing partners are *certain* the ball has gone into this area and you can't find it, you are entitled to a free drop as detailed below. If you're not certain the ball is in the Abnormal Course Condition, then is stroke and distance relief is your penalty.

What to do if you are certain the ball is in an Abnormal Course Condition.

Verify the condition: Confirm the area meets the definition of an abnormal course condition, such as ground under repair (marked with white paint or signs), or temporary water. Mere sogginess does not automatically qualify as an ACC.

Identify the nearest point of complete relief: Find the spot on the course that is closest to where your ball lies but is not in the ACC. This spot should be the point where the ACC no longer interferes with your stance, swing, or the ball's lie.

Determine your relief area: The relief area is one club-length from the nearest point of complete relief, in any direction, but not closer to the hole.

Drop your ball: Place your ball within this one-club-length area.

What to do if you are not certain.

Take stroke-and-distance relief: If you are not "virtually certain" (approximately 95% sure) that the ball is in the ACC, you must proceed as if the ball is lost in the general area and take stroke-and-distance relief.

Add a penalty stroke: Play another ball from where you made your previous stroke.













