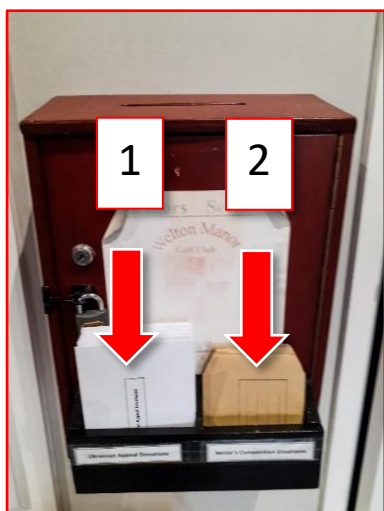

Importantly for me the charity funds research into many projects including fibromyalgia".

Bryan Bakewell and myself attended a presentation ceremony at the Lincs and Notts Air Ambulance along with various other organisations and individuals who were offering donations. We were warmly greeted by Charlotte and Jac who explained how the operation

works before we went out to the helicopter to present the proceeds from our Air Ambulance charity competition in the amount of £425 which was very gratefully accepted. In the hanger the doctor and paramedic on duty explained that the ground



ambulances kept there carry exactly the same lifesaving gear as the helicopter. We learned that they are getting close to having enough donations to purchase a second helicopter which will vastly improve their lifesaving capability. It was a very enlightening experience that everyone in the Welton Manor Senior Section can



be very proud of supporting. **Steven Wells.**

Steve Wells & I visited the Lincs & Notts AirSmbulance event where we presented the cheque for £425 generously donated by yourselves. A lot of work goes into putting on these events and a huge amount of time is invested by their volunteers as well as the officers of the Charity.



The presentation included a harrowing report from a gentleman who had a car crash and received what could have been life changing injuries which, thanks to the fast response and the quality of the attending team, after a few months he was back walking and running.

We saw inside the helicopter which, with a full compliment of staff and any patient, is fairly cramped. We were also shown one of the ground response vehicles, a top of the range Volvo which had been donated. The equipment is amazing but at a cost. The load, in the back of the car, was in the region of £30,000 and some items are one use only and can be as much as £2000 each.



This highlights the need to raise funds on an ongoing process. They are hoping to have a 2nd helicopter by the end of this year and have already raised just short of the required amount of £7,000,000.

The organisations that attended the event had raised around £4000 which is enough to cover the cost of 1 helicopter mission or 2 ground missions.

We left the station in awe of the professionalism of the crews and the backroom staff. It makes our Competition to raise funds well worthwhile. **Bryan Bakewell.**

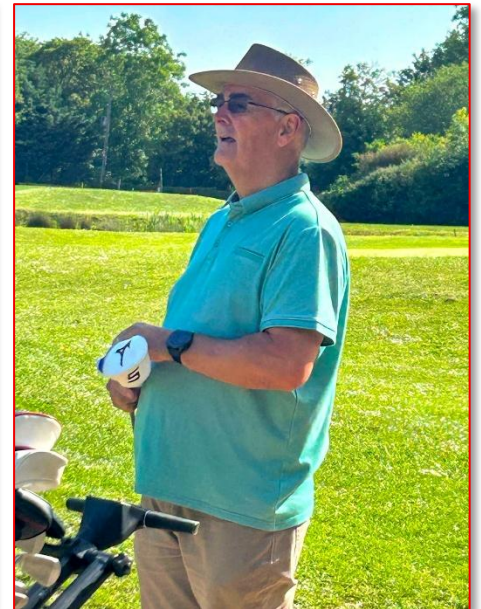

Rules Made Simple:

Can I back into a tree to take my stance?

Is your ball stuck in some foliage? I'll try to explain how to get it to it without falling foul of the rules



What constitutes fairly taking a golf stance? If you have ever played a round of golf, this has happened to you?

Let's set the scene. A player's ball rolled through the fairway, through the first cut, and stopped almost under a relatively small tree or bush.

The ball wasn't under the branches but to hit the ball the player had to back into the tree bending it over to take a stance. The question is: Is it OK to back into the tree or bush bending it over and not breaking it or should they have taken it as unplayable and dropped appropriately?"

Rule **8.1b** deals with what you're allowed to do when you're taking actions that improve conditions affecting the stroke. There are nearly a dozen actions that are permissible, but we're going to set our eyes down on number six.

It says that a player can fairly take a stance by taking "reasonable actions to get to the ball and take a stance".

Does that allow you to bend the branches of a tree or bush? Well, it does if it's the only reasonable way of getting to the ball.

There is a but though. You must use the least intrusive course of action to deal with the particular situation.



Don't go bending and breaking branches if you can get to the ball in an easier fashion. You'll be rewarded with the general penalty (two shots or loss of hole in match play) for that bit of senseless vandalism.

And don't take liberties, either, when it comes to how you set up to the shot. You are not entitled to a "normal

stance or swing".

If you're still a touch worried, there are some clarifications on this rule that spell out what you can and can't do in a little more detail.

The first clarification that should help to set your mind at rest.

You can, for example, back into a branch if that is the "only way to take a stance for the selected stroke". That's the case even if "this moves the branch out of the way or causes it to bend or break".

You can also bend a branch with your hands to "get under a tree to play a ball when that is the only way to get under the tree to take a stance".

But another clarification, warns that deliberately moving, bending, or breaking branches simply to get them out of the way of a backswing or stroke will bring a penalty, as will hooking a branch onto another, or using a hand to bend a branch "that obscures the view of the ball after taking the stance".

If you could have taken your stance without doing so, "bending an interfering branch in taking a stance" will also bring pain and a penalty.

So, be careful when your ball is in the trees or bushes, you can reasonably back into a tree or bush to take a stance, but you can't move, bend or break a branch to improve your swing path or stroke. This will incur a general penalty of **2** shots.

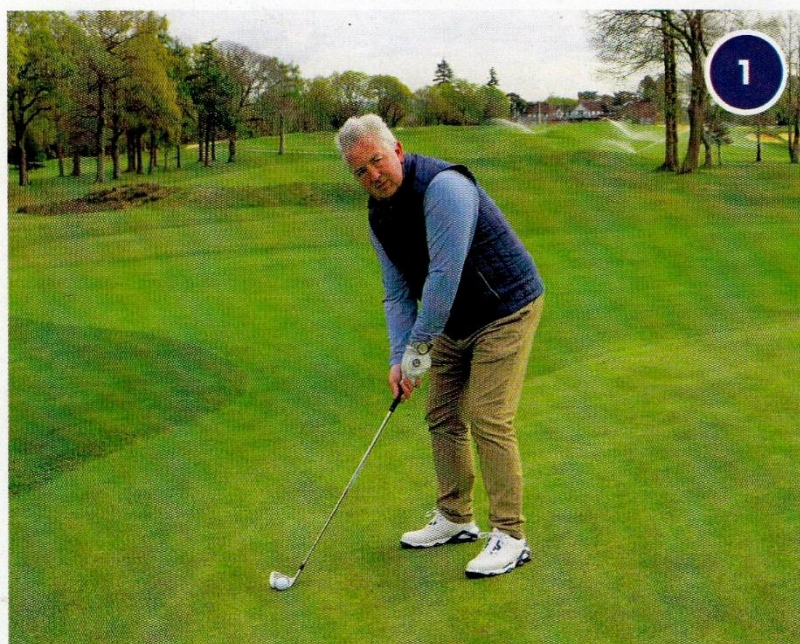

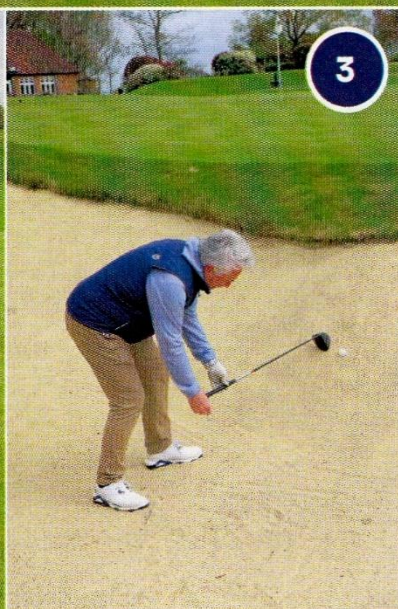
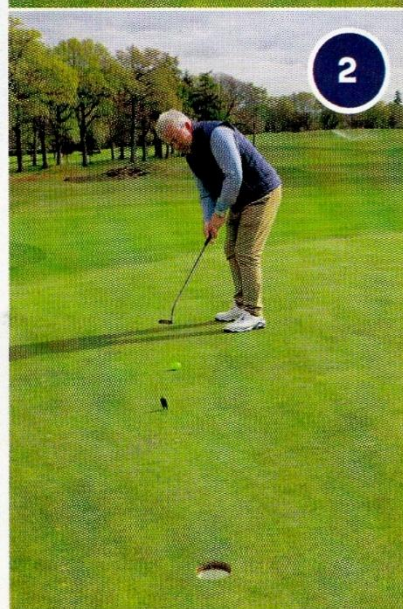

- B. There is no penalty and Alison must replay her approach shot.
- C. There is no penalty and Alison can drop a ball away from the vehicle.
