

Special Lenten Reconciliation March 16–27, 2026. Monday–Friday at 5:30 pm - 6 pm.

GENERAL NORMS ON ABSITINENCE AND FAST

General Norms: All the faithful who have made First Communion are bound to worthily (celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation) receive Holy Communion during the Easter season.

On Abstinence: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

On Fast: Everyone eighteen years of age or older but under the age of sixty is also bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, you may consult any of the priests assigned in the parish or your confessor. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK:

The Gospel for the 2nd Sunday of Lent focuses on the Transfiguration of Jesus. Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a mountain. There, His face shines like the sun, and His clothes become white. Moses and Elijah appear with Him. A voice from a cloud says, "This is my beloved Son... listen to Him." The disciples are afraid, but Jesus tells them not to be afraid.

This Sunday reminds us that Jesus is more than a teacher. He is the Son of God. It also reminds us to listen to Him, even when we are confused or scared. Lent is a time to grow closer to Jesus. We can do this through prayer, listening, and spending quiet time with Him. The Transfiguration shows a glimpse of who Jesus is, and it gives us hope for what is to come.

PENSAMIENTO DE LA SEMANA:

El Evangelio para el 2º Domingo de Cuaresma se centra en la Transfiguración de Jesús. Jesús lleva a Pedro, a Santiago y a Juan a una montaña. Allí, Su rostro brilla como el sol y Su ropa se vuelve blanca. Moisés y Elías aparecen con Él. Una voz desde una nube dice: "Este es mi Hijo amado... escúchenlo". Los discípulos tienen miedo, pero Jesús les dice que no teman.

Este domingo nos recuerda que Jesús es más que un maestro. Él es el Hijo de Dios. También nos recuerda que debemos escucharlo, incluso cuando estamos confundidos o asustados. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para acercarnos más a Jesús. Podemos hacerlo a través de la oración, la escucha y pasando tiempo en silencio con Él. La Transfiguración muestra un vistazo de quién es Jesús y nos da esperanza de lo que está por venir.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading – Genesis 12:1-4a: The LORD commands Abram to leave his homeland and go to a new land that God will show him. God promises to bless Abram and make him the father of a great nation, and Abram obeys, leaving his home as directed.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 33: Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

Second Reading – 2 Timothy 1:8b-10: Paul encourages Timothy to join in suffering for the gospel, reminding him that God has saved and called them to a holy life, not because of their own deeds, but because of God's grace and purpose, which has now been revealed through Christ's appearance and victory over death.

Gospel – Matthew 17:1-9: Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a mountain where he is transfigured before them, shining with a bright light, and they see Moses and Elijah talking with Jesus. A voice from heaven affirms that Jesus is God's beloved son, and the disciples are told not to speak of the event until after Jesus has risen from the dead.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera Lectura – Génesis 12:1-4a: El SEÑOR le manda a Abram que deje su tierra natal y vaya a una tierra nueva que Dios le mostrará. Dios promete bendecir a Abram y hacer de él el padre de una gran nación, y Abram obedece, dejando su hogar según lo indicado.

Salmo Responsorial – Salmo 32: Señor, ten misericordia de nosotros.

Segunda Lectura – 2 Timoteo 1:8b-10: Pablo anima a Timoteo a participar en el sufrimiento por el evangelio, recordándole que Dios los ha salvado y llamado a una vida santa, no por sus obras, sino por la gracia y el propósito de Dios, que ahora se han revelado a través de la aparición de Cristo y su victoria sobre la muerte.

Evangelio – Mateo 17:1-9: Jesús toma a Pedro, Santiago y Juan y los lleva a una montaña, donde se transfigura delante de ellos, brillando con una luz resplandeciente, y ellos ven a Moisés y a Elías hablando con Jesús. Una voz del cielo afirma que Jesús es el hijo amado de Dios, y se les dice a los discípulos que no hablen del evento hasta después de que Jesús haya resucitado de entre los muertos.


