Our October Family of the Month was

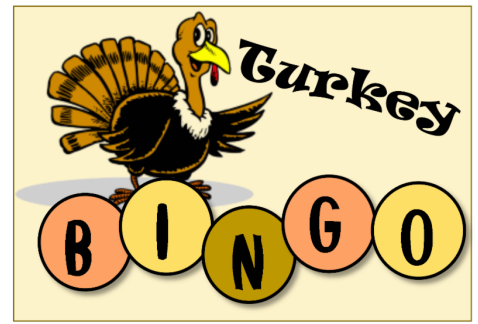
