Brother Knights, please help me in making Council 1150 a strong right arm of St. John's. There to support our parish, grow spiritually, possibly have some fun.

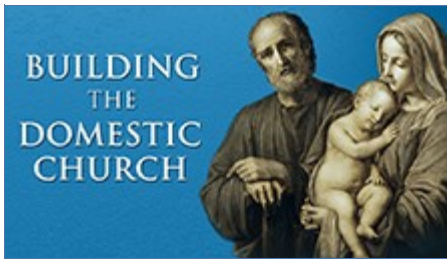

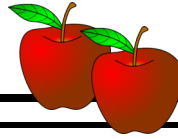
