A LETTER FROM OUR CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

At HOPE worldwide, we believe our strength lies in our interconnectedness. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. said, "We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny." These words resonate deeply with our mission to help those in poverty, reminding us that our work is about building a global community where everyone can inspire greater hope.

Throughout 2023-2024, our staff and volunteers united to support those in need worldwide. I personally witnessed our network in action through life-saving work in places like Singapore, Malaysia, and El Salvador.

Our network of mutuality also embraced victims of the wildfires in Maui as well as victims of Hurricane Beryl in the Caribbean and Gulf Coast. Our Global Disaster Response Team, in collaboration with partner organizations and churches, assisted many families who lost everything. In the U.S., our 100 local chapters provided thousands of hours of training and supported programs like Saturday SPARK Academies, HOPEww Scouts, and food distribution.

Volunteers in Africa, India, Asia, Europe, and the Americas developed new partnerships and supported children and families through sustainable programs. In Papua New Guinea, in collaboration with Wine to Water, our water filter distribution in one river village helped decrease waterborne illness by 99%. Our programs in ten countries in Africa provided nutrition, education, and job training to over 500,000 people.

In Ukraine, we continued to feed refugees and provide psycho-social support. In India, we supported over 250,000 people with education and resources. Our micro-funding program, LendHOPE *worldwide*, has empowered more than 150 entrepreneurs in 10 countries, including 40 women-led businesses in Honduras.



HAITI - FOOD INSECURITY

Response Story Hurricane Helene

After Hurricane Helene struck North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Florida on September 27, 2024, HOPE worldwide's Disaster Response team and dozens of HOPE worldwide volunteers got to work mucking and gutting homes, cutting out drywall, removing damaged items, and providing air conditioners, generators, and other essential supplies.

The flooding and wind caused massive amounts of destruction to homes and businesses in the affected areas such as Asheville, Augusta, Tampa and Sarasota. Our disaster response truck and trailer delivered aid in Asheville, NC such as water, diapers and hygiene kits. In Augusta, GA we delivered water and supplies. In Florida, teams cleaned up debris and assisted families along the Gulf Coast.

9 MILE URBAN CLINIC



U.S. Secretary of State visits HOPE worldwide's clinic in Papua New Guinea

HOPE worldwide was honored to receive recognition for our "9 Mile Urban Clinic" in Papua New Guinea (PNG) through a visit from U.S. Secretary of State, Antony Blinken. His historic visit to the clinic underscored the significant impact of HOPE worldwide's initiatives in collaboration with local government officials in PNG.

The 9 Mile Urban Clinic operates as part of HOPE worldwide's ongoing efforts to provide crucial healthcare services to underserved communities. The Clinic's dedicated team continues to make a remarkable difference in various areas, including HIV prevention and treatment, help for victims of violence against women, and overall healthcare. The 9 Mile Urban Clinic, along with three other clinics operated by HOPE worldwide in Papua New Guinea, serve over 90,000 patients annually.

Clean Water Saves Lives

Local government officials in PNG reported that the rates of waterborne illnesses were increasing in remote villages, and even had resulted in several deaths. A plan was developed among HOPEww PNG, HOPEww Australia, and HOPEww Global Disaster Relief teams to purchase and deploy water filters, that are normally used to treat contaminated water during disasters, to these remote areas.

Traveling by canoe for many days, with delays from stormy weather, HOPE *worldwide* staff delivered the water filters to over 300 families and trained the villagers on how to use and maintain them. **Some of the villagers said it was the first time in their lives they had seen clear drinking water!**

Eleven months after the delivery, official cases of waterborne illnesses in those villages were reduced by over 99%, dropping from over 700 cases down to only three. Seeing the profound impact on the village's health, the provincial government of Papua New Guinea is now partnering with HOPE *worldwide* to make water filters even more accessible to other rural parts of the country.

HOPE worldwide South Africa (SA) conducts Early Childhood Development (ECD) programs, partnering with preschools and parents to give young, vulnerable children a better future.

WALMART AND MASSMART PARTNERSHIP

Thanks to a generous partnership with Walmart/ Massmart, 68 preschools were refurbished, making the school environments more conducive to learning.

LEGO PARTNERSHIP

With support from the LEGO foundation and Walmart, 22,000 parents received training in various areas of early childhood development, including responsive and playful parenting. By equipping parents with knowledge and skills, we helped them foster nurturing home environments that would further enhance their children's growth and well-being.

CHILDHOOD NUTRITION

Collaboration with prominent partners, such as KFC, Futurelife, and the Dischem Foundation, allowed us to address the critical issue of child nutrition. Our joint efforts resulted in providing nutritional support to over 65,000 children, ensuring they received the essential nutrients necessary for healthy growth and development.

DISASTER RESPONSE

Responding to a natural disaster, HOPE worldwide SA stepped up during the devastating floods in and around Durban, KwaZulu-Natal by providing food parcels to hundreds of devastated families and assisting in repairing preschools that were affected.

HOPEww Kenya works with youth, orphaned and vulnerable children, marginalized and key populations, poor communities, and the general public to improve their quality of life through responsive and innovative health programming in Kenya. The DREAMS program empowers adolescent girls and young women with tools to reduce their HIV risks through access to education, economic opportunities and prevention of gender-based violence.

In 2023, we served 101,554 adolescent girls and young women aged 10-24 years through our programs. These programs build confidence in young women by teaching them communication skills and how to seek help when in trouble.

HOPE worldwide Kenya won two awards and recognitions, namely the Integrity and Inclusiveness Award and the Volunteer Organization of the Year Award.



HSPE worldwide MEXICO CITY



HOPE worldwide Mexico City was one of the original three international HOPEww programs established in 1991. It all started with a Center of HOPE medical facility in the heart of Mexico City.

Today it serves thousands of children and families each year, proving free dental care, medical checkups, and other tangible resources to communities in need. Our goal is to prevent the spread of infectious disease and chronic conditions by providing access to basic health services, low-cost medications, and preventative education.

One of the major ways we deliver this support and tangible resources to the community is through our Medical-Dental Brigades in Mexico City. The Brigades focus on the prevention, detection and treatment of different medical and dental conditions. With the help of our Mobile Medical Dental Unit, the service is provided twice a year in each chosen community, carrying out a total of 12 Medical-Dental Brigades during the year.





H&PE worldwide TIJUANA CENTER OF HOPEWW





The Tijuana Center of HOPE is empowering orphans, vulnerable children and families in northwest Mexico and helping to inspire greater hope in these vibrant communities.

The Center hosts community programs including dental services, Early Childhood Development (ECD) programs, literacy and tutoring, nutrition, and English language instruction. The Center serves children in nearby migrant shelters, daycare ministries, and schools and orphanages, including the only orphanage for HIV positive children in Baja California.

The dental care is offered on-site to people in communities without access to consistent health resources. This ensures regular, sustainable care for local children and families. The ECD program focuses on aspects of "nurturing care" in the lives of children which include good health, adequate nutrition, responsive caregiving, security and safety, and opportunities for early learning. The Center also helps children grow and thrive by supporting youth literacy and education throughout their primary and secondary years. To make resources available to help address the needs of children, including migrant children, the Center offers a



children's lending library. Throughout the school year, the Center also provides 60 children with a Nutrition Program with a full-time cook where we provide free breakfast before school. These are children whose parents or caregivers lack the resources and availability to provide a consistent nutritious breakfast before school.

The Center is managed by local staff and volunteers and serves 270 children, of whom 120 are orphans. It is a tremendous community asset that serves the vulnerable with programs that promote childhood literacy, nutrition and community health.


HOPEww South East Asia Conference

In 2024, HOPE worldwide program staff from all over Asia joined together in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia for the HOPEww South East Asia Conference, organized by HOPEww Malaysia and Country Director, Darick Wong.

Not only did the HOPEww program staff meet with each other to discuss growing their impact and best practices, but they also served in the local community, including helping at a rooftop farm that provides healthy food for those in need.

This conference highlighted the effectiveness of our global programs, as well as the shared commitment of all HOPEww programs to come alongside our neighbors in need with love and compassion.

Thanks to a sponsorship with Starbucks Malaysia, HOPE *worldwide* was able to conduct a sustainable agricultural education workshop, teaching an impoverished Malaysian community new ways to repurpose food waste with innovative tools.

HOPE worldwide Singapore was honored to receive the People's Association Community Spirit Award 2024! This award is a testament to the amazing spirit of our volunteers who bring our mission to life every day.

HOPE worldwide Singapore serves the local community through impactful programs and services for families, youths and elderly, regardless of their race and religion.

We serve about 2,000 beneficiaries and engage around 1,000 volunteers annually. We work very closely with key stakeholders such as the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF), the National Council of Social Service (NCSS), the Central Christian Church, community partners, donors, volunteers and staff to inspire greater hope in the lives of the poor, disadvantaged and emotionally suffering in Singapore.





Essential Aid for Economically Disadvantaged Seniors

HOPEww continued our "Outreach to Rental Flats" initiative by distributing monthly care packages to residents staying in seven rental flats in Punggol. This initiative benefited an average of 380 seniors living alone and 500 low-income families in 2023.

These care packages consisted of food items such as biscuits, bread, and instant noodles as well as non-food items like toothbrushes, toothpaste, body wash, and handwash.

Additionally, grocery vouchers are provided to the beneficiaries so they can purchase their own items.

In early June 2023, we partnered with Feiyue Active Aging Centre to extend our outreach to 120 seniors residing in two rental flats in the Senja area.

HOPE worldwide UKRAINE







With compassion for families in crisis, over the past three years, HOPE *worldwide* has distributed food, medicines, and resources for Ukrainians in need. Together, with our church partners and donors, we delivered tangible impact by...

- Coordinating safe housing for over 1500 refugees and families in 37 cities.
- Setting up food kitchens and delivering food parcels, distributing over 1 million meals on the ground in Ukraine.
- Delivering over 15 tons of donated medicines and trauma supplies, valued at over \$28 million, to dozens of hospitals in Ukraine.
- Providing **psychosocial support to children and families** to help them cope with the traumas of war.

Thanks to you, three years later, HOPE worldwide is still on the ground in Ukraine helping those in need.

HOPE worldwide FINLAND



HOPE worldwide Finland works closely with local partner organizations to support those who are experiencing homelessness or the threat of becoming homeless. Through their monthly "Action Tuesday" program, they offer hope to those in need by bringing various generations together in local service projects, alongside individuals experiencing homelessness. In this way volunteers, members of the community, people experiencing homelessness, and individuals representing various age groups are encouraged to see each other as equals where everyone benefits from the collaboration.

One of the young people commented: "I have found volunteering very rewarding as a young person. I have been able to influence my own community through doing good and have been able to see its positive impact up close. Being involved in the program has been one of the most meaningful experiences of my life, and I know that other young people feel the same way."



One example of the projects carried out in partnership with unhoused individuals was the restoration of trout streams under the guidance of specialists from the City of Vantaa. Our first joint renovation project was in Kormuniitynoja. We celebrated its success when the first fish were seen in the creek. Another example was a series of trips to Sipoonkorpi National Park where we collaborated with people experiencing homelessness to clean parking lots, trails and campfire sites, along with sharing some good food and coffee together by the campfire.

LendHOPE worldwide celebrated its second year with many new micro-funds provided to local entrepreneurs, including many women-owned small businesses. In 2024, LendHOPEww also partnered with HOPEww Community Service Brigades to create a showcase in Honduras where entrepreneurs could

bring their businesses to the community.

- All funds are repaid or are in the process of being repaid.
- Repaid funds allow new LendHOPEww participants in the community to receive micro-funds and continue growing the local impact.
- Many recipients of micro-funds are women-led businesses.
- All the women entrepreneurs in Honduras were able to attend the LendHOPEww Showcase during the 2024 HOPEww Community Service Brigade.

LendHOPE worldwide aims to break the cycle of material poverty by empowering small business owners and career-motivated individuals through access to capital, high-quality mentorship, and local training.

The LendHOPE worldwide program is active in 10 countries and has funded more than 150 micro-funds, resulting in almost 100% engagement in reciprocal donations, allowing other entrepreneurs to have access to micro-funds.

The Greater Philadelphia Chapter partners with General George W. Meade School, offering consistent K-8 support to underserved students in North Philadelphia. This partnership has resulted in improved test scores, attendance, and parent engagement.

HOPE worldwide Chapters strive to reimagine volunteerism through community engagement, cultivating friendships, and amplifying the unique strengths of every individual.

We work to develop programs and partnerships that tap into the strengths of the local community and are based on mutuality and respect. To accomplish these goals, the U.S. Chapters, many times in partnership with community organizations, focus on addressing food insecurity, child education and tutoring, older adult outreach and school and community beautification.

HOPE worldwide conducts Respect and Relationship workshops to strengthen community engagement across the U.S. Chapters. This biblically based training helps participants engage with their neighbors relationally, seeing them as God does, and honoring their dignity. In 2023, 51% of U.S. Chapters received the training, up from 34% in 2022. As a result, efforts have shifted from "doing for" to "doing with", amplifying community strengths rather than only addressing needs.

HOPEww Volunteer Corps Builds Aid Post in Papua New Guinea

The HOPEww Volunteer Corps in Papua New Guinea helped build a medical aid post that serves over 7,000 people. It is located in a rural area where villagers, including pregnant mothers and the elderly, regularly had to walk for two days in order to access health services. The building is now complete, and even more good news has come from the program.

This collaboration showcases the effectiveness and flexibility possible in the integrated approach that HOPEww utilizes through its global programs.



It also highlights the dedication and teamwork required to bring essential healthcare facilities to rural areas where they are most needed.

In 2023-2024, our dedicated Community Service Brigade volunteers served in various countries, providing essential medical and dental care to those in need.





In 2024, the CSB program provided vital medical and dental care to a total of 5,906 individuals across Honduras, Guatemala, El Salvador, and the Dominican Republic.

We are deeply grateful to our volunteers, supporters and partners, such as Ob Hospitalist, the largest OBGYN network in America, who made these accomplishments possible. Together we experienced firsthand the transformative power of teamwork.

10 Years of Community Service Brigades in El Salvador

Doctors, nurses, and over 70 local volunteers joined HOPE *worldwide* staff in El Salvador to provide medical and dental services free of charge to local communities and celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the HOPEww Community Service Brigade in El Salvador.

Alongside the volunteers were members of the HOPE worldwide leadership team, including CEO Ben Barnett and CFO Jennifer Reyes, as well as Leonard Castiglione, the CEO of Ob Hospitalist Group, and Leonel Osorio and Juan Ramon Mateo, HOPEww Country Directors from Honduras and Guatemala. They all came together to support the rural community of Suchitoto, focusing on providing essential dental care and addressing urgent medical needs.


