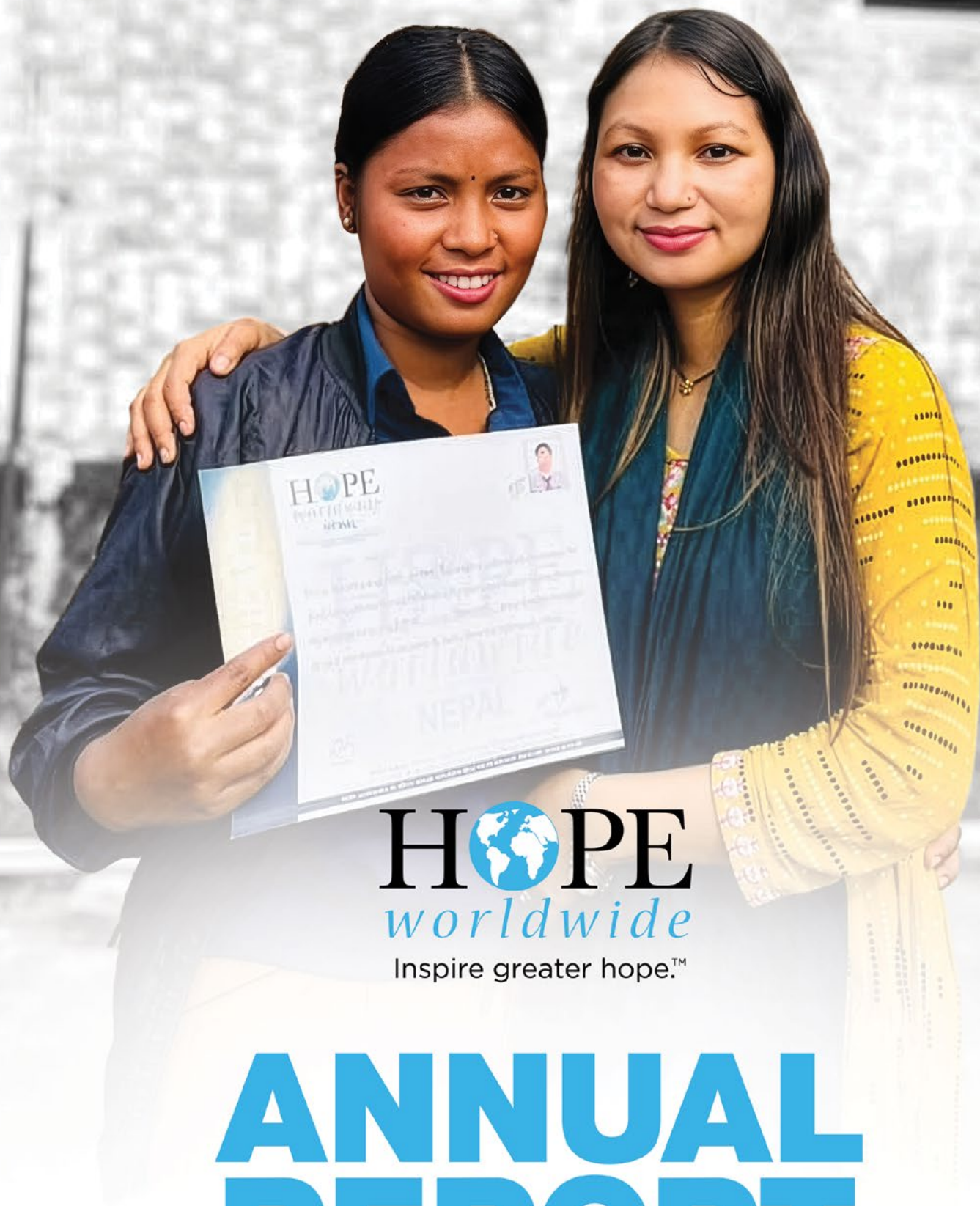

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Letter From Our CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

At HOPE *worldwide*, we are continually reminded that our greatest impact happens when we move together—across communities, across countries, and across lines that might otherwise divide us. We have learned that hope grows strongest when people choose to see one another not as strangers separated by geography, language, or circumstance, but as neighbors connected by our shared humanity and responsibility to care for one another. This belief shapes how we respond to need, how we build partnerships, and how we continue to grow a global community rooted in compassion and shared responsibility.

Over the past year, our teams and volunteers have met both urgent needs and long-term challenges with consistency and care. In South Africa, more than 10 million meals were provided to children, supporting their health and development during critical stages of growth. In India, sustainable agriculture initiatives expanded access to fresh, locally grown food while creating income opportunities for families. In Switzerland, weekly community meals offered nourishment and connection to individuals experiencing homelessness. And across the United States, our U.S. Chapters partnered with local organizations to serve families in need, ensuring that support remains close to where it is needed most.

This same spirit of partnership and presence extends across all areas of our work. Through disaster response, we have walked alongside communities navigating recovery. Through Community Service Brigades, we have provided essential healthcare services to thousands. Through economic empowerment initiatives like LendHOPE *worldwide*, entrepreneurs have been equipped to build businesses, generate income, and strengthen their local economies.

What continues to define this work is not only what is done, but how it is done. Volunteers show up with compassion and humility. Partners bring collaboration and expertise. Donors make it possible for this work to grow and reach further. Together, these efforts reflect a shared commitment to strengthening communities and ensuring that hope is not only present in moments of need, but sustained over time.

As we look ahead, we remain committed to deepening our impact and expanding our reach, while staying grounded in the relationships that make this work meaningful.

EARLY LEARNING & EDUCATION

EARLY LEARNING & EDUCATION HIGHLIGHT: SOUTH AFRICA

HOPE *worldwide* is strengthening early childhood development by supporting children, caregivers, and early learning centers across South Africa. Working across all nine provinces, the program equips communities with the tools and training needed to create safe, nurturing environments where young children can learn and thrive.

Through a network of more than 2,000 early learning centers, HOPE *worldwide* provides critical support, including caregiver training, practitioner development, infrastructure improvements, and access to learning materials. These efforts strengthen both the quality of care and long-term outcomes for children in under-resourced communities.

Programs such as Caregiver Learning Through Play equip parents and caregivers with practical skills to support early childhood development at home, reinforcing the role of families as a child's first educators. In parallel, partnerships with government and sector leaders help strengthen early learning systems and expand access to quality programs nationwide.

In 2025, these efforts reached more than 137,000 children and over 21,000 caregivers, while supporting more than 2,000 early learning centers—reflecting a sustained commitment to building strong foundations for lifelong learning.

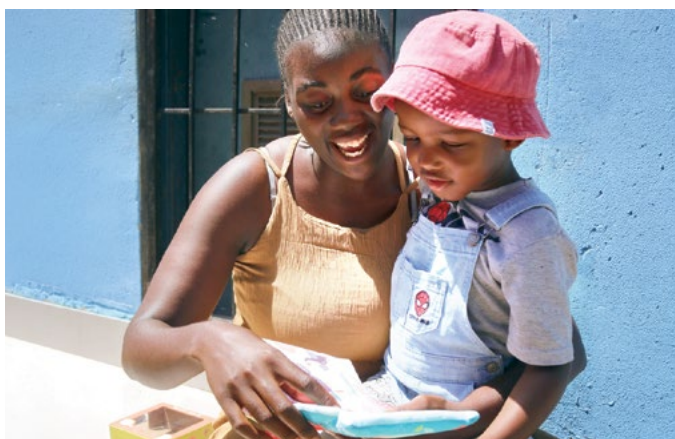

Across global communities, HOPE *worldwide* is strengthening early learning by expanding access to education, equipping caregivers, and creating environments where children can develop the skills needed to thrive. This work spans multiple countries, including the following highlights.

ZAMBIA

In Zambia, HOPE *worldwide* supports children across four communities in Lusaka through early childhood education, caregiver training, and nutrition support, helping 126 children build strong foundations for school readiness and long-term development.



TIJUANA

In Tijuana, HOPE *worldwide* supports children and youth in under-served communities through academic reinforcement, personalized tutoring, and alternative education pathways in partnership with Mexico's National Institute for Adult Education (INEA), helping prevent school dropout and re-engage students in their education.

NEPAL

In Nepal, HOPE *worldwide* provides free, high-quality education at the Asha Vidhyashram School in Kathmandu for children of migrant workers who would otherwise lack access to strong primary education. Expanded learning environments include a modern library with over 3,000 books and digital resources that enrich learning for more than 120 students.

ZIMBABWE

In Zimbabwe, HOPE *worldwide* equips over 200 caregivers annually through early childhood parenting programs in Harare, contributing to improved child development and a 40% reduction in malnutrition among participating families.

CLEAN WATER ACCESS

ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER NOT ONLY IMPROVES HEALTH, BUT ALSO SUPPORTS EDUCATION, ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY, AND OVERALL QUALITY OF LIFE.



Access to clean water remains one of the most immediate and transformative ways to improve health, stability, and long-term opportunity for families and communities. Across global programs, HOPE *worldwide* expands access to clean drinking water by distributing high-quality filtration systems that provide safe, reliable water for years.

Through this approach, thousands of water filters have been deployed across multiple regions, including parts of Southeast Asia, Central America, and communities throughout the Caribbean. Programs have reached countries such as Nepal, the Philippines, Papua New Guinea, and Jamaica, among others, extending sustainable solutions to families facing limited access to clean water.

Delivering these solutions requires more than the filters themselves. Programs include the assembly, distribution, and in-country transportation of supplies, as well as the coordination of local partnerships to ensure effective

and culturally relevant implementation. This integrated model allows teams to reach communities efficiently while supporting long-term program success.

By pairing practical solutions with strong local partnerships, HOPE *worldwide* helps communities move beyond immediate need toward greater stability and resilience. Access to clean water not only improves health, but also supports education, economic opportunity, and overall quality of life.

U.S. PROGRAMS

The HOPE *worldwide* Chapters in the United States strengthen communities through consistent volunteer service and local partnerships. Between July 1, 2024 and June 30, 2025, 7,752 unique volunteers contributed 61,282 hours of service across the national Chapter network.

U.S. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT



SPARK ACADEMY

One of the most notable areas of growth was in **Early Learning & Education** and youth support. Through Saturday SPARK Academies, tutoring programs, mentoring, and educational initiatives, Chapters served 1,625 children and teenagers between the ages of 7 and 17.

Food Security also remained a central focus. Twenty-one percent of all Chapter-sponsored engagement involved food pantries, community kitchens, or school-based food distributions, addressing the ongoing needs of families facing food insecurity.

Chapters also supported **Disaster Relief** efforts through close collaboration with HOPE *worldwide*’s Global Disaster Response team. During the January 2025 wildfires in Los Angeles County, volunteers from the Lifeway, Westside, Coastal, and Lighthouse Chapters contributed more than 1,000 volunteer hours at wildfire survivor resource hubs.

That response helped facilitate a \$100,000 grant to expand SPARK Academy programming for children affected by the wildfires. SPARK stands for Special Program in Arts Resiliency for Kids. This program helps to nurture and fortify the wellbeing of children after life-altering crises.

Later in 2025, the San Antonio Chapter also mobilized to support communities impacted by severe flooding in central Texas.

FOOD SECURITY HIGHLIGHT



HOPE *worldwide* addresses food security through integrated programs that ensure children receive consistent, nutritious meals during critical stages of development. In South Africa, initiatives such as Feed the Future South Africa and KFC Add Hope provide daily meals to preschools and households, helping combat childhood malnutrition and support healthy growth.

The Book & Breakfast Initiative further strengthens this approach by pairing a nutritious meal with early learning resources, ensuring children receive the nourishment they need to start their day healthy and ready to learn. Together, these programs prioritize consistent access to food while supporting overall child wellbeing.

Through strong partnerships with government agencies, corporate partners, and local organizations, HOPE *worldwide* continues to expand the reach and sustainability of these efforts.



HOPE *worldwide* believes that families everywhere should have access to healthy, nutritious food. Through partnerships and community-based programs, this work spans communities across the United States and around the world, addressing both immediate needs and long-term food security.

SWITZERLAND (GENEVA)

In Switzerland, HOPE *worldwide* Geneva supports individuals experiencing homelessness through weekly community meals, providing hot soup, bread, and cheese in a welcoming environment that fosters connection and care. These gatherings create consistent access to nourishment while building relationships that strengthen overall wellbeing.

INDIA

HOPE *worldwide* India, in partnership with HOPE *worldwide* UK, strengthens long-term food security through sustainable agriculture and community-led farming initiatives. Across 4 acres of cultivated land, they have planted 2,000 banana plants and a variety of vegetable crops including chili, brinjal, and tomato. These efforts have produced over 3,300 pounds of bananas while expanding access to fresh, locally grown food. This diversified approach supports more consistent nutrition for families, while also creating opportunities for income generation through the sale and use of harvested crops. By strengthening local food systems, the program helps build long-term resilience and sustainability within local communities.

UNITED STATES

Across the United States, many HOPE *worldwide* Chapters support food security through partnerships with local organizations to meet community needs. These efforts include hosting food pantries, organizing food drives, and serving hot meals to individuals and families experiencing food insecurity, including those facing homelessness.

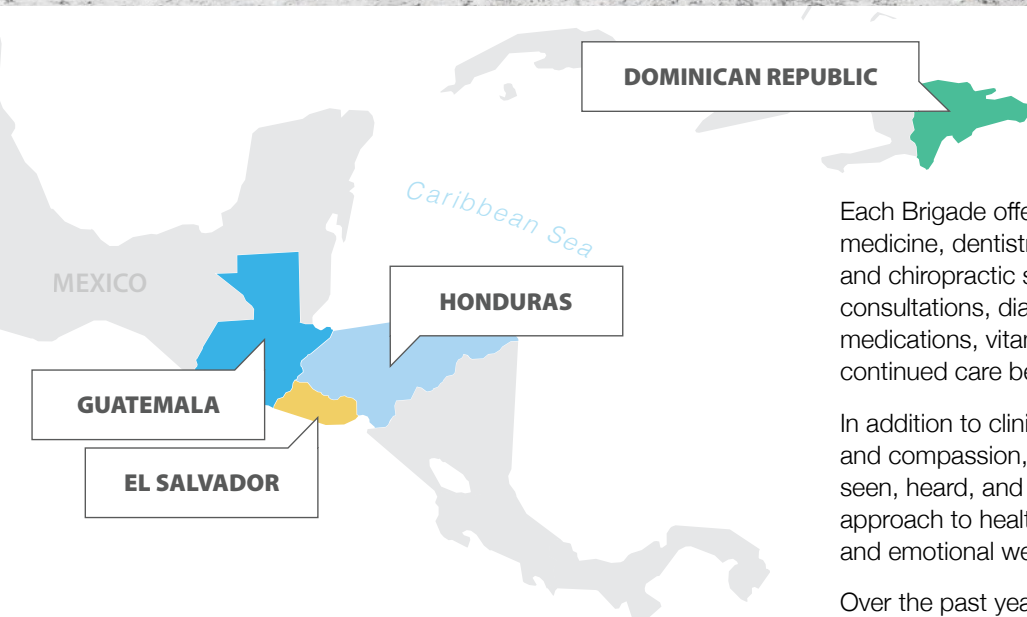
Through these partnerships, volunteers respond to both ongoing and urgent needs, including supporting meal distribution during times of crisis and disaster. This broad, community-based approach allows HOPE *worldwide* to extend its reach across diverse communities, ensuring consistent access to food while strengthening local systems of care.

AREA OF IMPACT

HEALTH & WELLNESS

Through our Community Service Brigades (CSB), HOPE *worldwide* expands access to essential healthcare by mobilizing volunteer medical professionals to serve communities with limited access to care. These Brigades bring together teams of doctors, specialists, and healthcare providers to deliver comprehensive, high-quality services in areas where resources are often scarce.



Each Brigade offers a wide range of care, including internal medicine, dentistry, gynecology, ophthalmology, psychology, and chiropractic services. Patients receive free medical consultations, diagnoses, and follow-up guidance, along with medications, vitamins, and nutritional supplements to support continued care beyond the initial visit.

In addition to clinical services, CSB emphasizes dignity and compassion, creating spaces where individuals feel seen, heard, and supported. These efforts reflect a holistic approach to health—one that addresses both physical needs and emotional wellbeing.

Over the past year, CSB mobilized more than 700 volunteers across multiple countries, delivering over 17,000 medical services to 3,394 individuals and contributing more than 17,500 volunteer hours.

Across global programs, *HOPE worldwide* expands access to essential healthcare and wellness services by addressing both physical and emotional needs within underserved communities. This work extends across multiple regions, reflecting a broad commitment to improving health and wellness worldwide.

TIJUANA CENTER OF HOPE

The dental clinic at the *HOPE worldwide* Centro de Hope provides patients with access to essential treatment they could not otherwise afford. These services address pain, infection, and ongoing oral health needs. For both children and adults, this care restores oral health and helps individuals speak, smile, and engage with greater confidence, improving overall quality of life.

BOLIVIA

In Bolivia, *HOPE worldwide* supports vulnerable children and families through community-based programs that integrate health, nutrition, and family support, reaching more than 7,200 individuals, including over 5,500 children, and strengthening wellbeing across underserved communities.

LEBANON

In Lebanon, *HOPE worldwide* delivers its What About Me? (WAM) program to support adolescent mental health, equipping young people with tools to manage stress, build resilience, and develop healthy coping skills through structured, school-based sessions. Amid ongoing instability in the country, these programs have reached more than 1,000 children, creating safe spaces for healing, connection, and emotional growth.

AREA OF IMPACT

DISASTER RELIEF

This year brought an extraordinary number of disasters, and HOPE *worldwide* responded alongside communities facing urgent need. Across four major disaster responses, 528 volunteers contributed 3,597 hours supporting recovery efforts around the world.



LĀHAINĀ, HAWAII

In April 2025, nearly two years after the August 2023 wildfires in Maui, 100 volunteers traveled to the island to build retaining walls for affected neighborhoods, saving the community more than \$20,000 in labor costs. Long after public attention fades, HOPE *worldwide* remains committed to supporting communities through the slower stages of rebuilding.

LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

In January 2025, wildfires devastated areas of Los Angeles County, including Pacific Palisades, Altadena, and Pasadena. Volunteers logged more than 1,100 hours supporting multi-agency relief operations, helping secure a \$100,000 grant from the California Community Foundation to expand recovery support through SPARK Academies.

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

In May, a tornado struck North City near St. Louis. Volunteers helped establish a relief supply hub, distributing nearly 4,000 bottles of water, 678 hygiene kits, 154 cleaning buckets, and 570 hot meals. Eighty-one volunteers contributed 414 hours during the response.

KERR COUNTY, TEXAS

Over the July 4th weekend, flooding impacted Kerr County, Texas, where teams deployed for debris removal, cleanup, and meal distribution while continuing longer-term recovery support with local partners.

JAMAICA

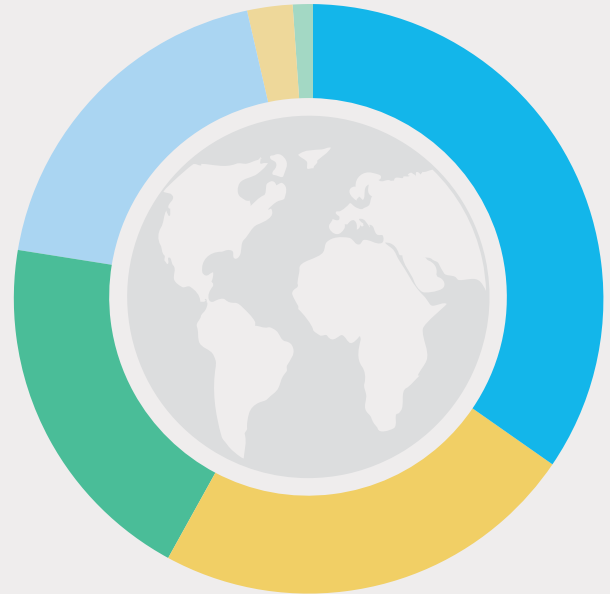
Following Hurricane Melissa in late October 2025, HOPE *worldwide* focused disaster response efforts in five of Jamaica's hardest hit parishes. Working alongside local partners and volunteers, teams responded quickly to address immediate needs while supporting communities through the early stages of recovery.

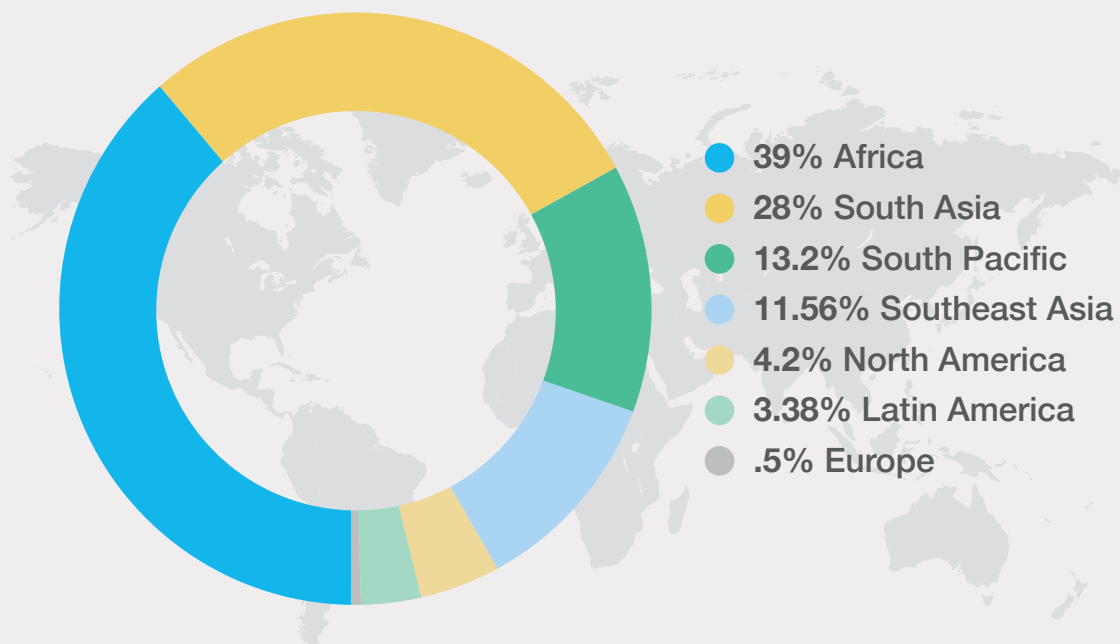

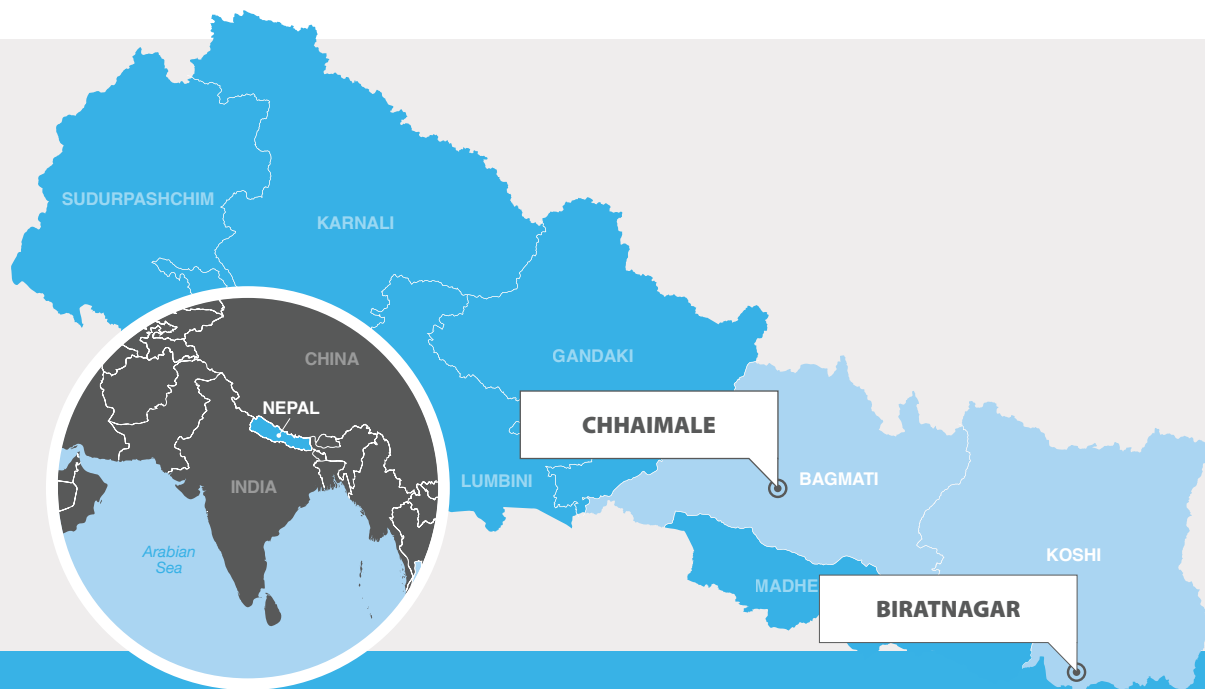
LendHOPE *worldwide*, a microfunding initiative of HOPE *worldwide*, expands economic opportunity by connecting donors with entrepreneurs in underserved communities across countries such as Honduras, Ecuador, India, and others. Many aspiring business owners have the drive to grow their businesses but lack access to capital. Through LendHOPE *worldwide*, donors help entrepreneurs expand small businesses, generate income for their families, and strengthen their local economies.

Each microfunding opportunity is evaluated by local partners who review the entrepreneur's business plan, financial needs, and potential community impact. Approved entrepreneurs are featured on the LendHOPE *worldwide* platform, where donors can learn about their goals and track the progress of the businesses they support. Donors can contribute through the LendHOPE *worldwide* website or mobile app. To date, the program has supported more than 100 entrepreneurs across 10+ countries, reflecting its growing global reach.

As a part of the LendHOPE *worldwide* community, each individual supports other local micro-funds over time through our process of reciprocal giving. This multiplies the impact of every donation and furthers sustainable development driven by the local community. To date 99% of funding has been re-donated back into the local communities.

Through microfunding and redonation, LendHOPE *worldwide* creates a sustainable cycle of opportunity strengthening families and communities around the world.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT HIGHLIGHT: NEPAL

In Nepal, a tailoring training program in Chhaimale is equipping women with vocational skills that create pathways toward income, stability, and long-term independence. In Biratnagar, English and computer training programs are preparing youth from under-resourced communities with practical skills that support employment opportunities and future self-sufficiency.



HOPE *worldwide* Volunteer Corps

The HOPE *worldwide* Volunteer Corps (HVC) mobilizes volunteers from around the world to serve alongside local HOPE *worldwide* programs, strengthening communities facing material poverty, disaster, and social vulnerability. Through partnerships with local leaders, HVC connects volunteers of all ages and backgrounds with opportunities to support community-led solutions and expand the reach of HOPE *worldwide*'s global impact.

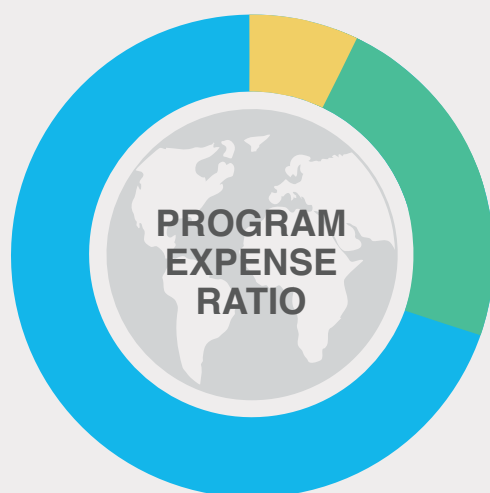
