This ministry is led by two to four elders. It coordinates a variety of programs and activities that encourage growth in faith, knowledge, and community.

Key programs under the LEARN Ministry include:

- Children's and Adult Sunday School classes
- Small Group Bible Studies
- Presbyterian Women
- Vacation Bible School
- Youth and Young Adult Ministries

In addition to these ongoing programs, the LEARN Ministry may initiate and oversee special projects and events such as:

- Churchwide spiritual life retreats
- Hosting special guest speakers
- Seasonal studies (e.g., Advent or Lenten studies)

The ministry's overarching goal is to equip and inspire individuals and groups in their journey of discipleship, creating opportunities for deeper connection with God and one another.
