## IF YOU'RE BEING THREATENED, YOU'RE NOT ALONE

Sexual Extortion is a form of blackmail where someone threatens to reveal private or sensitive images, videos, or information about you unless you obey their demands. These demands may include sending more explicit content, providing money, or performing unwanted actions.

They may even go so far as threatening to send sensitive photos or videos to your parents, friends, or post them online.

Someone who is trying to exploit you may even start as an online romantic relationship or friendship to gain trust and information.

They may even use Ai to create **FAKE** photos or videos of you that look real.

**Block and Don't Respond** – Stop all communication with the person, but don't delete your profile or the messages.

Don't Pay or Send More Images – This won't stop them.

Save Evidence – This is not your fault. Sextortion is a crime, and the extortionist is to blame. Take screenshots of messages, usernames, and threats.

Report It – Report the incident to local law enforcement (911) and the CyberTipline (1-800-THE-LOST / report.cybertip.org)

Tell Someone You Trust – Don't isolate under the pressure.

Ask a parent, teacher, or counselor to help.
