




Elise Mueller

What do Nashoba Board of Health Dental Hygienists Do?

The Dental Program of the Nashoba Associated Boards of Health provides both preventative dental hygiene services and oral health education for the elementary school children in its member communities. We aim to prevent dental disease and protect the oral health of children by providing easy access to preventative dental care and informative educational programming. It is our mission to instill healthy habits and wise choices to ensure a lifetime of good oral health.

Registered Dental Hygienists visit each school annually and offer:

- -No cost dental screenings for kindergarten children.
- -No cost dental exam, cleaning, fluoride and oral hygiene instruction for children in Grades 2 & 4.
- -In classroom presentations covering a variety of oral health topics and demonstrating good oral hygiene techniques for Grades K, 1 & 5.

Permission slips for the screenings and cleanings are distributed in the school a few weeks prior to each visit by the dental hygienist.

Referrals are sent home via mail to parents/guardians when additional treatment by a dentist is indicated.

Did you know that poor dental health impacts overall health and increases the risk for diabetes and heart disease?



- About 75 percent of people ages 60+ have only some of their natural teeth.
- Nearly 23 percent of adults ages 65-74 have severe gum disease.
- Many older adults suffer from dry mouth caused by prescription and overthe-counter medications. It contributes to significant tooth decay and gum disease.

For these reasons, it's important that we encourage our seniors to practice good oral health habits including regular dental check ups.

THE NEW BLOOD PRESSURE GUIDELINES ACCORDING TO THE AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION:

- NORMAL= LESS THAN 120/80
- ELEVATED= 120-129/LESSTHAN 80
- HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE= 130-139/80-89 (HYPERTENSION—STAGE I)
- HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE=140/90 OR HIGHER (HYPERTENSION—STAGE 2)
