Ride United Transportation Access increases rides to six per calendar year

Ride United is a program to support United Ways and 211s in reducing transportation barriers for people in need by offering on-demand Lyft rides. They are increasing the ride limit of their transportation program from 2 lifetime rides to 6 total rides in the year 2023.

Assuming a person's situation meets all other eligibility, a client who has received rides in the past is now eligible for 6 rides this year. All other eligibility remains the same (including the \$22 fare estimate to destination).

Hopelink's Mobile Market is up and running!

The Mobile Market distributes food to targeted areas with food insecurity throughout East King County. It distributes prepacked boxes of assorted fresh locally grown produce, which contain seasonal fruits and vegetables. It also distributes prepacked boxes of shelf stable foods such as peanut butter, pastas, soups, beans, rice and canned fruits and vegetables. When available we will have fresh dairy and frozen meats as well. All of this food is free! There is no need for an appointment.
