Pastor's Message



Dear Parishioners,

As we come to the close of another year at Saint William, I am thankful for all that we have accomplished together and excited about what lies ahead. The 2025–2026 year has brought many blessings to our parish and many signs that our community continues to grow in faith, reverence, and service to others.

Our Faith Formation ministries had a wonderful year. More than 200 people participated in our Life in the Spirit Seminar in June. Our Lenten Mission with Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio and mini-conference with Dr. Edward Sri gave us opportunities for spiritual renewal and a deeper understanding of our Catholic faith.

It was a joy to welcome back Vacation Bible School, with 55 children participating in a week filled with faith and fun. Our Middle School and High School Youth Groups experienced tremendous growth, and our young people shared their faith with the entire parish through their presentation of The Living Last Supper before the Sacred Triduum. Our Family Faith Formation and Youth Ministries also continued reaching beyond our parish through their relationship with families at neighboring Sea Gate Elementary School.

We have also seen encouraging growth in our sacramental and liturgical life. We continue to welcome more children and their families through Baptism, celebrated many weddings, and saw Mass attendance continue to increase. The number of Holy Communions distributed increased approximately 8 percent over the previous year. This is one of the most encouraging signs of all because the Eucharist remains at the center of everything we do as a Catholic parish.

Our Music Ministry brought another dimension to our parish life. We were very happy to welcome back our Children's Choir. Our Advent Concert, mini-opera *Amahl and the Night Visitors*, and selections from Handel's *Messiah* brought hundreds of people into our church, including many from neighboring Catholic parishes and other Christian communities.

Our parish also continued its strong commitment to serving others. This year we welcomed the formation of the Saint William Columbiettes, joining our Knights of Columbus in strengthening service and fellowship within our parish and community. Our Lenten Fish Frys continued to grow, bringing together parishioners, families, and friends during the Lenten season. Our Catholic Council of Women saw the return of their Fashion Show & Luncheon in February, raising money for local charities.

The generosity of Saint William Parishioners was especially evident during our Thanksgiving Food and Turkey Drive, which provided enough food and supplies to help stock the Catholic Charities food pantry for approximately three (3) months.

Our commitment to those experiencing homelessness also continues through our participation in Catholic Charities HOPE Naples providing meals, clothing, necessities, companionship, and many other forms of assistance. During this past year, 11 individuals who were experiencing homelessness were helped into housing. The addition of an on-site nurse and volunteer hairdresser has allowed us to provide even more care and dignity to those we serve. And we look forward to the coming year when showers and lockers will be built in the Judy Sullivan Family Resource Center bringing us closer to the vision of a day center where services can be provided multiple days throughout the week.

These are only some of the many good things happening at Saint William, and none of them would be possible without you. I am grateful to our parishioners, volunteers, ministry leaders, staff, and everyone who gives so generously of their time, talent, and treasure. Your commitment is what makes Saint William the special parish community that it is.

My hope is that Saint William will continue to be more than simply the church we attend on Sunday. May it be a spiritual home where people feel welcomed, where families grow in faith, where our young people know they belong, and where we put our faith into action by serving others, growing our relationship with the Lord.

We have much to be thankful for and even more to look forward to. Together, with the Lord guiding us, I am confident that 2026–2027 can be another inspiring year for Saint William. May God bless you and your families, and may He continue to bless our beloved Saint William Parish.

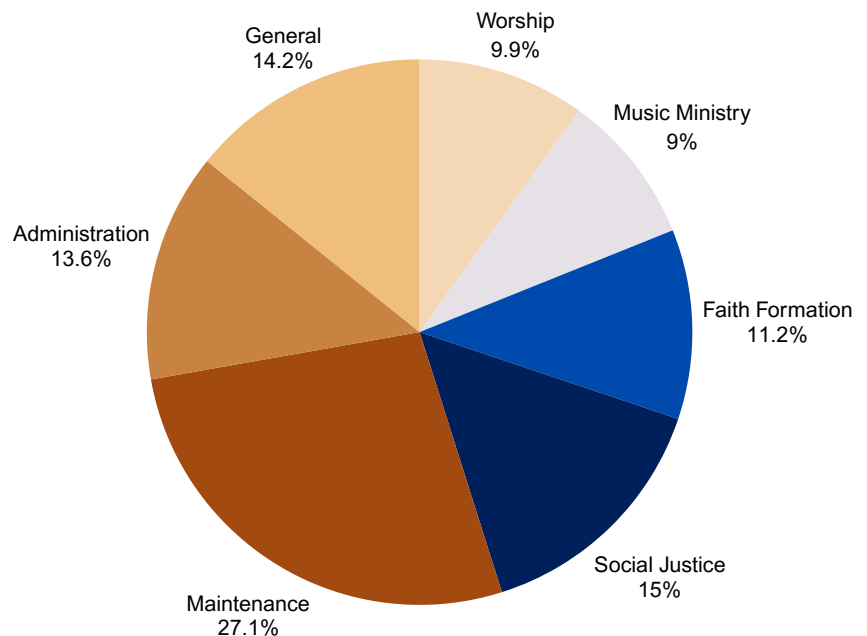

Adult Faith Formation

Adult Faith Formation at Saint William continues to deepen people's spiritual life while fostering an environment of true learning and faith development. As we grow in our knowledge and love of God, we increasingly desire to serve and evangelize the culture around us!

- **Walking With Purpose - Women's Bible Study:** Drawing women from every walk of life and a wide diversification of ages, this bible study has been highly instrumental in inspiring a greater love of Sacred Scripture in the hearts of hundreds of women who participate year after year!
- **Men's Groups:** Our parish enjoys two men's groups. Wednesday evenings men gather to share the Gospel of the coming week and enjoy a rich time of fellowship. Early Saturday mornings men come together and watch a video or share on a Catholic topic that is current and highly relevant to their lives.
- **Lenten Retreat & Mission:** This past year we had the return of three Religious Sisters from the Pro Ecclesia Sancta Community. They conducted a retreat entitled "Behold I Make All Things New: A Lenten Retreat with the Holy Spirit" which was warmly received and well attended! Our Lenten Mission was conducted by Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio and featured themes such as "The Lenten Journey: Tapping Into Personal Victory, The Difference the Spirit Makes, Prayer: Pathway to Joy."
- **Presentations:** We were blessed to have Mallory Smyth visit and give a presentation on Sacred Scripture entitled "Divine Revelation: How Praying with Scripture Changes Everything!" Dr. Edward Sri, a widely acclaimed national speaker, presented two themes "Going Deeper in Prayer during Lent and Into His Likeness: Be Transformed as a Disciple of Christ!"
- **Life in the Spirit Mini-Seminar:** We welcomed more than two hundred parishioners and guests for an interparish daylong event designed to deepen personal faith and invite a renewed openness to the Holy Spirit.
- **Ongoing Programs:** Small Christian Communities, Singles Groups, Intercessory Prayer Meetings, and various Video Series once again filled our four seasons with ongoing educational opportunities, fellowship, inspiration and growth in faith formation!



Family Faith Formation

The **Family Faith Formation** ministry experienced a year of growth, joyful participation, and meaningful opportunities to bring families closer to Christ. This year, 76 students participated in our faith formation program, and 26 children celebrated the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion. These sacraments were made possible through thoughtful preparation, dedicated volunteers, and the support of our parish community.

Throughout the year, we continued to offer Children's Liturgy of the Word most Sundays during our 9:00 a.m. Mass, providing our youngest parishioners with an age-appropriate opportunity to hear and reflect on the Gospel. Family Faith Formation also continued to be an active presence throughout the parish, creating opportunities for children and families to gather, serve, learn, and grow together in faith.

The ministry participated in and supported many parish-wide events and outreach opportunities throughout the year. Highlights included our Seagate outreach, arts and crafts at the parish picnic, and co-hosting the Christmas Breakfast with St. Nick by helping decorate the tables and providing craft activities for children. We also celebrated our annual May Crowning, honoring Mary.

After a year away, we were especially excited to bring back Vacation Bible School. This summer, 55 children participated as campers, supported by 26 enthusiastic youth volunteers and 10 adult volunteers. Vacation Bible School provided a joyful week of faith, fellowship, service, and fun, while giving our parish's young people an opportunity to share their gifts and leadership with younger children.

Through faith formation, sacramental preparation, Children's Liturgy of the Word, parish events, outreach, and Vacation Bible School, Family Faith Formation continues to create opportunities for children and families to encounter Christ and grow together as a community of faith.

Youth & Young Adult Ministry

The 2025-2026 school year brought about many moments for our Middle and High School students to live out their faith in a variety of ways, through our **Youth Ministry**. Not only did they study more in depth about our Catholic faith in the "classroom" through programs like "Who am I?", "System Reset", studying the Psalms and even "Bibles on the Beach", but also brought that knowledge to life in their service to others by helping serve receptions for our Music Ministry, participating in Kristallnacht with the Catholic Jewish Dialogue, offering a Bagel Bar after the 9 & 11am Masses and even putting on a production of the Living Last Supper just prior to the Triduum.

We experienced 66% growth in our High School program from the previous year, and over a 100% increase in growth in our Middle School program.

We were also pleased to reintroduce the Youth Mass on Sunday nights after quite a hiatus. Our Middle and High School students both participated in the Masses as lectors, bringing up the gifts, reading the prayer intentions, and playing music for the Mass.

Our **Young Adults** kept the tradition of Monday night Bible study alive and came together for an Advent/Christmas gathering with some of our local religious speaking at it. More Young Adult gatherings are planned for the future as we look to implement Theology on Tap on a regular basis once again at a local parish family-owned restaurant.

We are all excited to see how God will move in these three groups and the lives of the people in them, over the course of the weeks and months ahead!

Ministry Reports

Music Ministry

The mission of our music ministry is to glorify God, encourage worship, and inspire and support the congregation. Rooted in the rich and broad traditions of the Catholic Church, our music program combines chant, hymnody, classical sacred works, and contemporary liturgical music to support the celebration of the Mass as well as diverse liturgical events throughout the year.

The music program at Saint William has been blessed in so many ways over the past year. The adult choir sang regularly at the Sunday 11 AM Mass, as well as feasts and celebrations, in a broad variety of choral music, hymns, anthems and motets, achieving an extraordinary musical level.

In addition, the adult choir presented a beautiful Advent Concert, acted and sang in the moving religious opera, *Amahl and the Night Visitors* (a premiere at Saint William Church), as well as ably presented selections from Handel's eternal masterpiece, *Messiah*, with professional soloists and orchestra in the sanctuary on Palm Sunday.

The children's chorus had an increase in membership and gave regular presentations at the Sunday 9 AM Mass as well as at Easter and Christmas Masses, in addition to participating in *Amahl and the Night Visitors*.

We were fortunate to add some new and talented cantors and section leaders to our roster, who assisted our chorus and helped lead our congregation. And finally, the exceptional organ at Saint William was highlighted at Mass as well as in diverse preludes and postludes.



Ministry Reports

Council of Catholic Women (CCW)

The mission of the **Saint William Council of Catholic Women (CCW)** is to help the people of our parish, our community and beyond realize a better quality of life through our prayers, volunteer work, financial support, and by example, our spiritual life.

- **Ministry Overview:** During the past year, the CCW continued its 51-year tradition of service to our parish and community. Through the dedication of our volunteers, the CCW remained active in spiritual, charitable, educational, and social outreach.



- **Gift Shop Ministry:** The CCW Gift Shop continued to serve parishioners and visitors throughout the year by offering a variety of religious articles, meaningful gifts, sacramental items, and seasonal merchandise. The Gift Shop provides a valuable service to our parish community while generating proceeds that help support the CCW's charitable outreach and scholarship programs.
- **Scholarship Program:** \$50,000 awarded to Ten Catholic high school and college students each received \$5,000 scholarships to Catholic schools.
- **Community Financial Support:** The CCW provided quarterly stipends and additional assistance to:
 - St. Vincent de Paul Society
 - HOPE Homeless Ministry
 - Sunlight Home
 - Providence House
 - Community Pregnancy Clinic
 - St. Matthew House
 - Diocese of Venice Seminarian Fund
- **Parish Support:** CCW volunteers provided assistance at numerous parish events and ministries, including:
 - First Holy Communion Reception
 - Confirmation Reception
 - Parish Picnic
 - Ministry Fair
- **Annual Spring Fashion Show:** The February 2026 Fashion Show and Luncheon was successfully held in the Church Hall with strong parish participation. Proceeds support the charitable works of the CCW.
- **Toiletry Drive:** The CCW holds an annual Toiletry Drive to benefit HOPE Homeless Ministry. Parishioners generously donate toiletry items, which are collected by the CCW and delivered to HOPE for distribution to individuals in need.

Catholic Charities HOPE Naples



Catholic Charities HOPE Naples (Homeless Outreach Program for Empowerment), in collaboration with Saint William Parish, goes beyond providing food, clothing, and supplies. It places a strong emphasis on fostering dignity and trust.



Every Tuesday, approximately 100 homeless individuals are warmly welcomed by volunteers with prayer, compassion, and hospitality. By building personal connections, we strive to create lasting change. From July 2025 to June 2026, HOPE Naples achieved remarkable results. It successfully housed 11 individuals, with many more individuals waiting for housing. This is an immense milestone for HOPE. In addition to housing, we continue to offer essential services such as bus passes, bicycles, tricycles, personal care items, camping gear, work boots, clothing, food, and hospitality. These essential services were provided to just under 800 neighbors throughout the year.

Empowering our neighbors is crucial in helping them achieve stability. This year, HOPE Naples expanded its range of essential services. We are delighted HOPE Naples has added additional medical services to its offerings. Dedicated nurses are now part of our team, providing invaluable support to our population. They not only address chronic health issues but also ensure timely access to medical care every day of the week. The assistance with prescriptions, medical appointments, and hospital stays has been life-saving. Even our furry friends are not overlooked, as HOPE Naples provides veterinarian care and pet food to all. We are thrilled to now have a hairdresser on staff as well. Being clean and presentable enhances the dignity of our neighbors and prepares them for job interviews by providing appropriate clothing and hygiene supplies.



Case workers, who have doubled in number over the past twelve months, are working harder than ever. They provide counseling, assistance with IDs, food stamps, prescriptions, employment, and financial assistance, when available. They are now working five days a week. In all, volunteers have sustained this ministry with love and patience, exceeding 11,000 hours!

Looking ahead, HOPE Naples is collaborating with the county to assist released inmates in reintegrating into our community. This involves bridging the gap between the jail system and the homeless program. HOPE Naples aims to facilitate access to community resources for inmates, enabling them to successfully reenter society. For a successful reentry, the medical and behavioral needs of the inmate must be met to ensure continuity of care and access to essential resources such as food, clothing, and personal care.

Collier County Homeless Stats

Nightly 650 individuals are sleeping in places not fit for human habitation.

Homelessness in Collier County has increased by 52% in recent years.

Senior homelessness has seen a 230% increase since 2018.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul

Mission Statement

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is a Catholic lay organization inspired by the Gospel and inspired by our Founder, **Blessed Frederic Ozanam**, and our Patron, **St. Vincent de Paul**. Together, members grow spiritually by offering **person-to-person service** to neighbors in need, building relationships rooted in compassion and dignity.



Highlights and Accomplishments

Families served and assistance provided were lower than last year largely due to the outward migration of working-class families from our community. Persistent inflation and housing affordability in particular continue to challenge these neighbors. We were also spared the impact of hurricanes. Those you helped by your generous support acknowledge the difference you have made in their lives. Thank you for enabling us to serve the families in need in our parish.



Looking Ahead

The numbers will generally be the same. Their stories will not. For families living on the edge, paycheck to paycheck, it does not take much to derail them financially. We are also seeing more seniors, mostly on fixed incomes, succumbing to higher costs of living. It seems the need is always before us. Please continue to support our mission. We cannot do what we do without you. Thank you.

Knights of Columbus

Mission Statement

The Knights of Columbus at Saint William live by their guiding principles:

Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.

Charity

In 2025-2026, the Knights donated or sponsored over \$62,000 to local charities. This included Catholic Charities HOPE, Catholic Charities Food Pantry, support to seminarians, STARability, Special Olympics, Sunlight Homes, NAMI, St. Vincent de Paul, Shelter for Abused Women, Habitat of Humanity, and Laces of Love. We donated to the Saint William Rosary Makers which helped them ship thousands of rosaries around the country.



Fraternity

Fraternity is lived through brotherhood in action, rooted in our Catholic call to serve Christ by serving one another. The Knights supported parishioners in need and offered prayerful, compassionate assistance to families during funeral and memorial ceremonies. This year, seventeen new members joined our council, strengthening our ability to support the Parish Picnic, the homeless mission, family food pantries at St. Vincent de Paul and Catholic Charities, and hands-on service projects with Habitat for Humanity and Sunlight Homes. Through these works of mercy, we sought to bring comfort, dignity, and hope to our parish family and to the wider community. This includes sponsoring the new Columbiette Auxiliary, the first at Saint William.



Unity

The Knights strengthened the parish community by helping create welcoming opportunities for fellowship, faith, and service. Monthly Pancake Breakfasts, Potluck Dinners, themed Dinner Dances, Fish Fry Fridays during Lent, and the Parish Picnic brought parishioners together with our priests in a spirit of joy, hospitality, and Christian charity. These gatherings raised funds to serve those most in need. Through the generosity of our parishioners, the Knights helped raise more than \$25,000 for a Mobile Ultrasound Vehicle, supporting mothers and fathers as they choose life for their unborn children. We also co-sponsored Breakfast with St. Nick with the Youth Group, giving parishioners of all ages a joyful celebration of faith, family, and community.



Columbiettes

The **Columbiettes** were installed at Saint William on January 10, 2026, as an auxiliary to the Knights of Columbus. Rooted in Catholic faith, service, and fellowship, the group has quickly become an active presence in parish life by supporting the mission of the Church, assisting the Knights, and responding to the needs of the wider community.

Catholic Identity and Mission

The Columbiettes seek to live out the Gospel through faithful service, prayerful witness, and charitable action. Guided by their patronesses—the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Thérèse of Lisieux, and St. Joan of Arc—the members strive to imitate Christ by serving others with humility, courage, compassion, and devotion to the Church.

Parish Support and Fellowship

Since their installation, the Columbiettes have provided dependable support for parish and Knights of Columbus activities, including fish fries, pancake breakfasts, dances, and other fellowship events. Their participation reflects a spirit of Catholic hospitality and strengthens the bonds of community within the parish.

Community Outreach

A recent focus of the Columbiettes' service was hands-on support for Sunlight Home. Members helped prepare a room for a new mother and child, assisted with cleaning, and supported backyard planting efforts. This outreach reflects the Catholic commitment to protecting life, supporting families, and serving those in need with dignity and love.

Member Involvement in Parish Life

Members also serve the parish through a variety of ministries, including Eucharistic Ministry, Altar Servers, Ushers, Armathean ministry, Homeless ministry, Catechesis, Funeral and Wedding support, Choir, and other parish needs. Through these ministries, the Columbiettes contribute not only to events and outreach but also to the spiritual and sacramental life of the parish.

In a short time, the **Columbiettes of Saint William** have established themselves as a faith-filled and service-oriented organization. By supporting the Knights of Columbus, assisting parish ministries, and serving the vulnerable in the community, they continue to advance their mission of living the way of Christ through charity, unity, and faithful Catholic witness.



St. William Catholic Church Profit & Loss July 2025 through June 2026

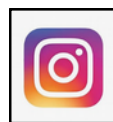

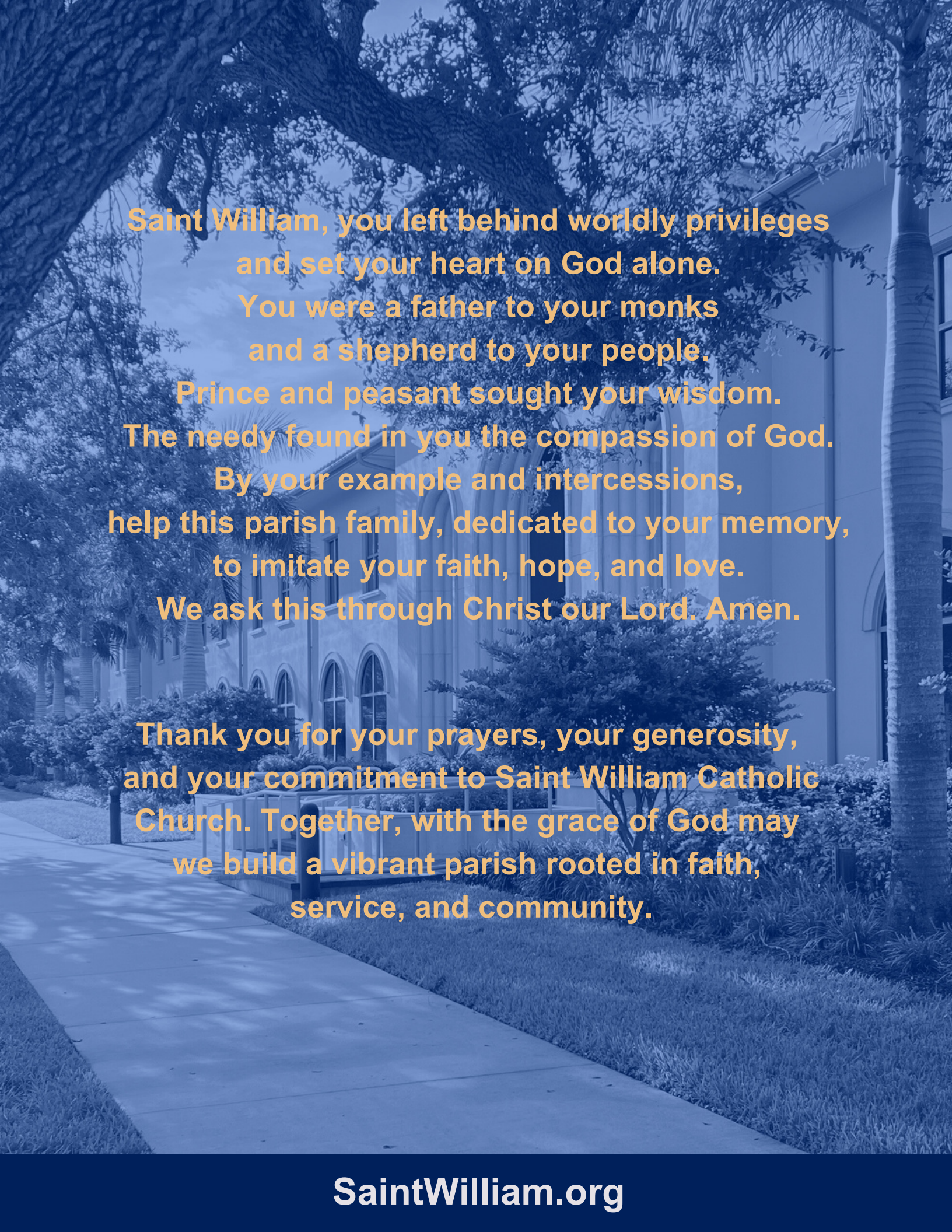
