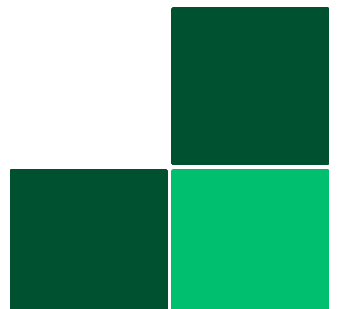

A Letter from our Executive Director

2025 was a year of steady and determined progress at Last Prisoner Project.

Behind every headline about legalization, there are still people waiting, waiting for a second look at their sentence, waiting for clemency, waiting for the chance to come home. This year, we stayed grounded in that reality. We advanced individual clemency and sentence review cases in state and federal systems, supported families navigating complex parole processes, and challenged excessive supervision that keeps people tethered to punishment long after release.

We also strengthened our policy work, advocating for retroactive relief, fairer sentencing structures, and reforms that make second chances real, not rhetorical. And internally, we invested in building a stronger foundation so our work is thoughtful, measurable, and built to last.

What I carry most from 2025 are the human moments, the calls with families, the partnerships formed, the quiet milestones that mean everything to the people living them. This work is complex, but it is deeply personal. I am profoundly grateful to our staff, Board, pro bono partners, and especially our donors. Your belief in this mission sustains it. You make it possible for us to keep showing up, case by case, policy by policy.

As we look toward 2026, our commitment only deepens. We will continue accelerating sentence relief, advancing durable reforms, and strengthening pathways home for those who have waited far too long. There is more to do, but together, we are moving justice forward.

2025 Legal Overview

The Cannabis Justice Initiative (CJI) operates at the heart of LPP's mission, **providing direct pro bono legal services to over 300 constituents. LPP has recruited, trained, and supported 379 attorneys and 73 law firms** to secure freedom for non-violent cannabis offenders through legal intervention via clemency, compassionate release (CR), resentencing, pardon, and early termination of supervised release (ETSR).

Most notably, in January of 2025, **President Biden granted clemency to 9 LPP constituents--Albert Madrid, Claudio Martinez, John Newton, Jose Sepulveda, Leonel Villasenor, Kerry Collier, Daniel Gallegos, Melvin Garland, and Robert Thomas-- eliminating a total of 53 years and 2 life terms** from their sentences. As President Trump's presidential term began, LPP continued to advocate for commutations with the Office of Pardon Attorney and Pardon Czar Alice Johnson.

Additionally, **CR was granted to 5 constituents in our legal program: Artis Slade, Michael Masecchia, Veronica Morales, Shannon Williams, and Harold Klump. ETSR was granted to 7 constituents: Ariel Pena, Andy Cox, Clyde Baer, Lesli Kennedy, John Knock, Alex Campbell, and Daverne Foy.** At the end of 2025, **LPP won pardon for Steven Kadonsky under New Jersey Governor Murphy, eliminating his life sentence of parole.**

At the close of 2025, **LPP has provided over 14K hours of pro bono legal representation, valued at over \$9.1 million dollars.** These efforts have led to **over 200 legal filings, with LPP submitting over 500 letters in support.** Collectively, **LPP's legal wins have resulted in the elimination of 358.78 years and 9 life terms** from our constituents' sentences.

In 2024, LPP partnered with Maryland Governor Wes Moore to design the largest single-day pardon proclamation in American history. It was the first pardon proclamation ever to include paraphernalia in addition to simple possession of cannabis offenses. In 2025, Governor Moore pardoned an additional 6,938 convictions, bringing the total number of pardons to over 175,000. During the legislative session, LPP collaborated with in-state partners and the Moore Administration to pass SB 432, a law that further refined the expungement process and reduced access to criminal records for cannabis-related charges, ensuring that individuals who received a pardon are shielded from the collateral consequences.

In Hawai'i, following the creation of the state's first-ever automatic expungement law, designed by LPP, the legislature further streamlined the process by passing HB 132, which ensures that all eligible records are identified and cleared. Together, the pair of laws has resulted in over 1,321 expungement orders. In the four years leading up to the pair of bills, only two people had cleared their criminal records. LPP also continues to serve on the Clean Slate Task Force, created by legislation championed by LPP, to inform the design and implementation of broader criminal record relief.

Lastly, LPP Policy Director Adrian Rocha was a featured speaker at this year's Psychedelic Science Conference in Denver, Colorado. With more than 5,000 attendees, LPP seized the moment to remind people that as the science around the therapeutic benefits of psychedelics evolves, we cannot lose sight of the individuals who have been and continue to be punished criminally for seeking access to these substances.

REENTRY SUPPORT

UNITY WEEK 2025

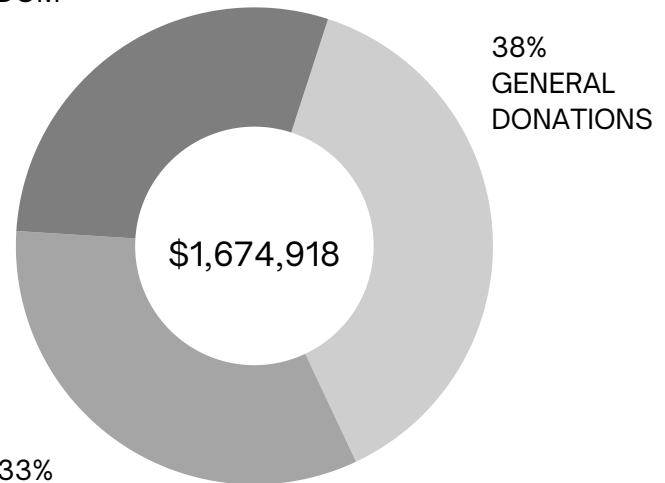

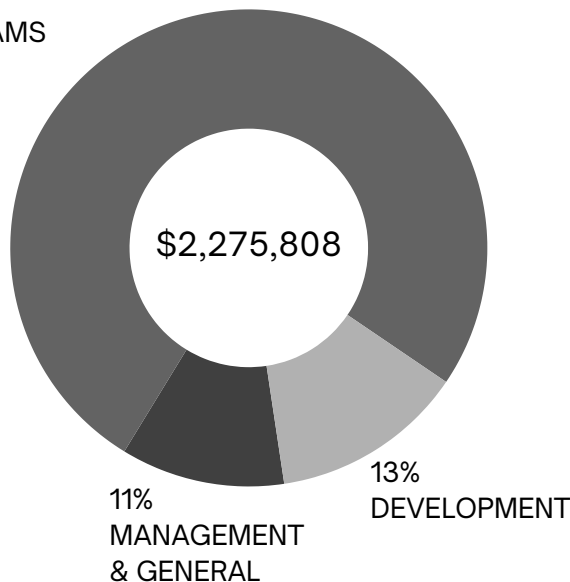
