



Full Report: In Conversation with the British Hindus

UK Parliament, Churchill Hall – 1st September 2025

Executive Summary

On **1st September 2025**, the UK Parliament hosted *In Conversation with the British Hindus*, a first-of-its-kind gathering that brought together **30+ MPs** and **50+ community leaders** representing more than **65% of British Hindus**. Organised by **Action for Harmony**, this event marked a historic moment for the Hindu community in Britain, enabling structured dialogue with policymakers in the heart of Westminster.

The programme, hosted across **two sessions**, combined spiritual reflection, cultural expression, and policy dialogue. It highlighted the **immense contribution** of British Hindus to national life while setting out **key community concerns** around identity, security, education, representation, and social inclusion.

The event received **cross-party support**, with presentations from parliamentarians including **Baroness Verma**, **Lord Sewell**, **Bob Blackman MP**, **Gareth Thomas MP**, **Jack Rankin MP**, **Lord Popat. Full list of attendees is attached**.

This event created a **new precedent for Hindu–Parliament engagement**, establishing the Hindu community as a collaborative and constructive partner in shaping the UK's multicultural future.

Background & Purpose

British Hindus make up over **1.2 million people** (approx. 1.7% of the UK population), contributing significantly to the economy, healthcare, education, business, technology, and cultural life. Despite this, the community has often felt **underrepresented in policymaking** and **misrepresented in public discourse**.

Key catalysts for this event included:





- The Leicester disturbances of 2022, where Hindu voices were sidelined.
- Exclusion from critical policy consultations (e.g., cremation laws, religious provisions).
- Media narratives that often generalise Hindus within the broader "Asian" label.
- Increasing concerns over hate crimes, safeguarding of children, and representation in schools.

Action for Harmony, established in 2023, sought to address this gap by creating a professional and representative voice for British Hindus. The *In Conversation* event was designed to:

- Showcase Hindu contributions to British society.
- Articulate community needs and challenges directly to parliamentarians.
- Foster partnerships for long-term collaboration.
- Launch a platform for ongoing dialogue and representation.

Attendance Highlights

- MPs Confirmed: 27+ across Conservative, Labour, SNP, and Liberal Democrats
- Community Leaders Confirmed: 45+ representing temples, cultural bodies, interfaith organisations, and educational institutions
- Representation spanned London, Midlands, Scotland, and beyond.

Key Messages from the Event

1. Hindu Contributions to British Society

- Over 100,000 Hindus in the NHS and healthcare sector.
- Significant contributions in business, finance, and technology (including founders of major UK firms).
- Cultural events like Diwali at Trafalgar Square and the upcoming Royal Albert Hall Diwali Celebration.
- Grassroots **volunteerism and interfaith work**, reflecting values of *Seva* (selfless service) and community harmony.

2. Concerns & Community Needs

Identity





- Hindus seek recognition as British Hindus, not under a generic "Asian" category.
- Policies and data collection should reflect specific identities.

Security & Justice

- Release the Leicester riots report in full to restore confidence.
- Stronger police response to anti-Hindu hate crimes.
- Equitable funding for security of Hindu temples.

Education & Media

- Improved RE curriculum and teacher training on Hinduism.
- Greater accountability for media misrepresentation of Hindu practices and values.
- Optional teaching of mother languages for Hindu children.

Safeguarding & Social Issues

- Addressing targeted grooming of Hindu girls.
- Culturally appropriate foster care placements.
- Greater support for **elderly care**, heating, and home assistance.

Religious Practices

- Inclusion in consultations on cremation policies.
- Visa access for priests to serve in UK temples.

Political Engagement & Responses

• Baroness Verma urged deeper recognition of Hindu voices beyond election cycles.





- Gareth Thomas MP highlighted opportunities for inclusive policy development.
- Vinay Tanna & Dr. Mayank Shah stressed the need for proactive Hindu engagement in politics.
- Nitin Palan & Nilesh Solanki presented the Action for Harmony vision, urging structured collaboration with government.
- Lord Sewell commended Hindu values of Family, Religion, Education, and Entrepreneurship as guiding principles for integration.
- Bob Blackman MP reaffirmed the APPG for British Hindus' commitment to amplifying Hindu concerns in Westminster.

Notable MPs such as **Seema Malhotra**, **Baggy Shanker**, **Louie French**, **Jack Rankin** and **Lord Popat** also lent their support, signalling broad cross-party recognition.

Impact & Outcomes

Immediate Impact

- **Visibility**: Hindu issues and contributions formally discussed in Parliament for the first time at this scale.
- Unity: Representation of over 65% of British Hindus through Action for Harmony.
- **Policy Engagement:** Key asks placed directly before MPs, including on security, education, and community recognition.

Long-Term Outcomes

- Strengthened APPG for British Hindus with renewed purpose.
- Commitment from MPs to engage with Hindu representatives at **both national and constituency levels**.
- Momentum for upcoming events, including the National Hindu Conference (Sept 2025) and Diwali at Royal Albert Hall.
- Established a framework for annual Hindu-Parliament dialogue.

Conclusion & Next Steps

The *In Conversation with the British Hindus* event was a **historic success**, laying the foundation for deeper, more constructive dialogue between British Hindus and Parliamentarians.

Next Steps:

- **Formal Report Submission** sharing this document with MPs, government departments, and community organisations.
- **Follow-Up Consultations** on Leicester report, education, temple security, Islamophobia a legislation to be inclusive of all religions and safeguarding.
- Identity

 Being branded as ASIAN, Anti Hindu Hate and Hindutva Narratives
- Strengthen APPG Engagement ensuring Hindu perspectives are represented in debates and inquiries.
- Annual Dialogue institutionalising this event as a recurring fixture in Parliament.
- **Crematorium** Work with Lord Popat with need for further Hindu Crematoriums and pick up the conversation from 3 years ago
- Action For Harmony to begin the process of setting up relationships in Education, Foreign, Health and other departments so there is an awareness of issues that we can enter into a dialogue with.

British Hindus left Parliament with a renewed sense of recognition and commitment, confident that their voice is being heard. The message was clear: **British values and Hindu values are one and the same** —
