





“We shine like stars to achieve and make a difference in the world, knowing that with God, all things are possible.” Matthew 19:26

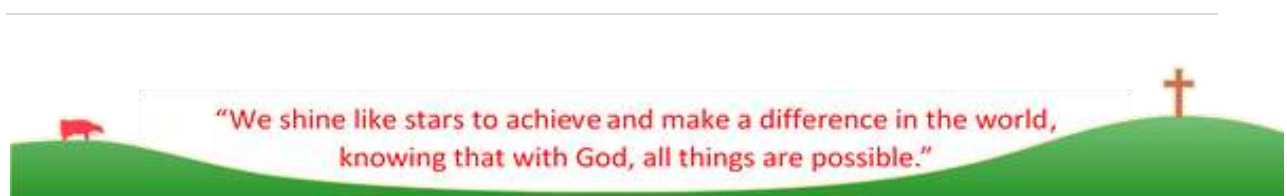
We live out our school vision in all that we do at Aspull Church Primary School. We are passionate about providing an outstanding educational experience for all our children, with Christianity at the heart.

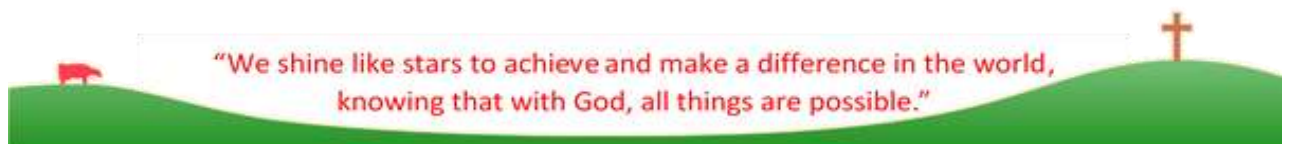



Religious Education & Collective Worship

As a Church School, we place great emphasis on the teaching of Religious Education - in the main this is provided within guidelines from Liverpool Diocese and Methodist Units of work.

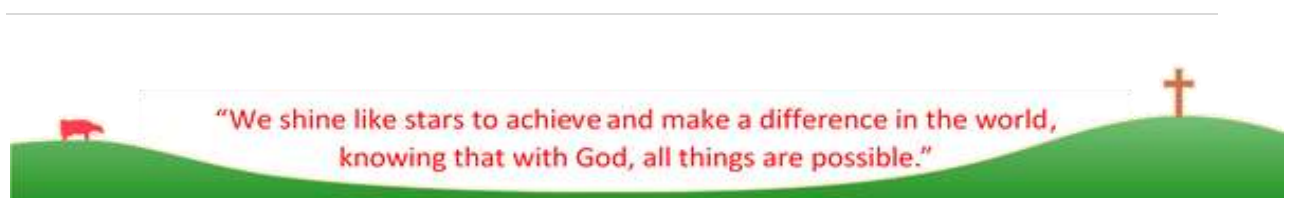
of which are further developed in class time. Acts of Collective Worship are Christian but non-denominational in character.

Celebrations


A weekly celebration assembly is held each Friday afternoon for approximately 30 minutes. During this time your child's achievements both at school and outside school, are celebrated. Your child may wish to bring certificates, awards and trophies to this celebration and these will be celebrated in front of the whole school.

Each week a 'Shining Star', a 'Maths Magician', a 'Reader of the Week' and a 'Writer of the week' are chosen from each class and parents are invited to attend this celebration to see their child receive their award.

In addition to this, there are a range of events and activities throughout the year that celebrate the successes of school and wider school life.


Our KS1 areas are spacious with fantastic weatherproof outdoor learning facilities. In addition to this, the updated EYFS area allows pupils to explore and learn in a safe, stimulating and purposeful environment. Both of our playgrounds have engaging, vibrant markings on and these continue onto our Aspull mile track.

Our school grounds are something we are very proud of, with a range of facilities that enhances learning and promotes positive play. Our Key Stage two classrooms are modern, bright and installed with HD learning screens. We also have a large bank of technology that supports teachers and pupils in adapting to the changes of our modern world.

We have a school library in our 'Learning Lodge' building, multisports ball shooters, trim trail, MUGA (multi use game area), an outdoor prayer space, minibeast hotel and a scooter/bike rack.

Inclusion

Aspull Church Primary School is an inclusive school, where we provide the best possible learning experiences for every individual. We provide a welcoming, supporting environment where our Christian values are woven into all that we do. At Aspull Church Primary School we aim to meet every child's need to make sure that all of our children achieve to the best of their ability. We continually monitor children with Special Educational Needs and provide additional support to children and families where and when necessary.



School Uniform

Aspull Church Primary School feels that the uniform adds to the school identity and gives the children a sense of belonging.

EYFS

- Plain black tracksuit bottom/leggings
- White polo shirt
- Red V neck cardigan or V neck jumper, branded with school logo- required
- Grey, white or black socks/tights
- Footwear – plain black velcro trainers
- Red/white gingham dress or plain black jersey shorts (summer uniform)

KS1

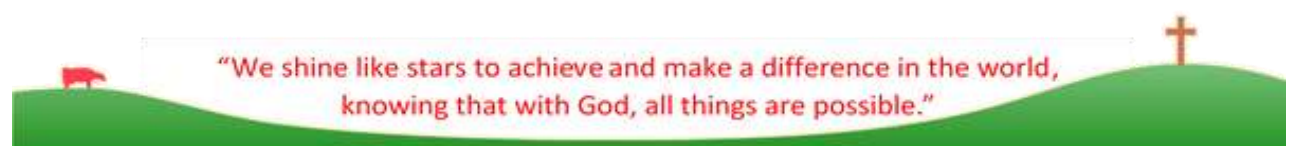
- Charcoal grey trousers or shorts
- Red tartan pinafore or skirt
- White polo shirt
- Red V neck cardigan or V neck jumper, branded with school logo- required
- Grey, white or black socks/tights
- Footwear – black shoes, no heels, no trainers, no boots
- Red/white gingham dress

KS2

- Charcoal grey trousers or shorts
- Red tartan skirt
- Plain white short sleeved shirt
- Red v neck cardigan or v neck jumper, branded with school logo- required
- Red school tie, branded with school logo- required
- Grey/white or black socks/tights
- Footwear - black shoes, no heels, no trainers, no boots
- Red/White gingham dress

PE Kit (for KS1/KS2)

- Flat black trainers





- Aspull Church School T-shirt (white with red sleeves), branded with school logo- required
- Red Shorts or plain black jogging bottoms
- Aspull Church School PE hoody, branded with school logo- required

PE kits are to be worn to school on the class PE day.

Please do not send large sport bags to school as they cause problems for storage.

Hairstyles and Jewellery

- Extreme hairstyles including No 1 haircut and inappropriate colour are not allowed
- Tram lines cut into the hair are not acceptable
- Makeup/nail varnish is not allowed
- Long hair should be tied back with small, plain/tartan bobbles only
- Plastic headbands can be dangerous, please use material headbands

Due to Health and Safety reasons no jewellery except for watches can be worn for school. This includes all types of earrings. Ear piercing should be done at the beginning of the summer holidays so that children can take earrings out for school.

Our School Day

The compulsory school day runs from 8.55am to 3.25pm, totaling 32.5 hours each week.

Start of the day

The gates open at 8.35am for parents and pupils to come onto school grounds.

Children should not arrive before this time as no supervision is available.

The school bell will sound at 8.45am and children make their own way into their classrooms. All pupils should be in school by 8.55am for the start of the school day. Morning tasks ensure that children make a productive start to their learning from the very beginning of the day.

Morning worship takes place for all pupils during the morning session, and there is a morning break at around 10.30am. We encourage children to eat healthy snacks at morning break. This might be a piece of fruit, a snack of vegetables or toast is available at an additional cost.

We do not allow sweets and chocolate as a break time snack.

Lunch

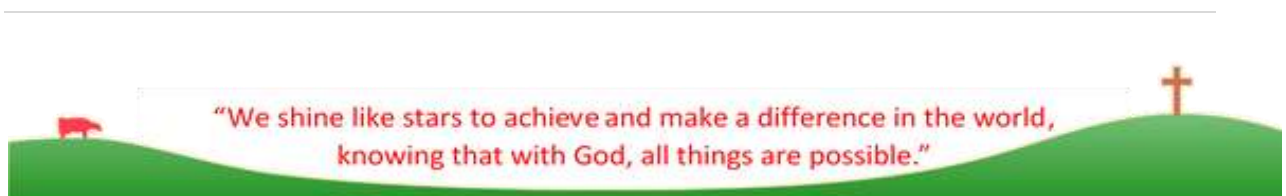
EYFS and Year 1 have lunch between 11.45am and 1.00pm.

Year 2 and Key Stage 2 have lunch between 12:00pm and 1:00pm.

Children can purchase a hot school lunch which is ordered each morning in the classrooms and is provided by Local Kitchen. Alternatively, you may provide a packed lunch from home.

Lunch boxes should be small and clearly marked with your child's name. Fizzy drinks, glass bottles, breakable flasks and cans are not allowed. Due to the increasing number of children with severe allergies, nuts must not be brought into school.

Currently, the government provide all children in Year R, Year 1 and Year 2 with free school meals.





Children entitled to a free school meal will be provided with a hot meal each day. If you feel that your child may be entitled to free school meals, please do not hesitate to ask for an application form from the school office. It really helps the schools funding if you register for free school meals even if you do not intend to take up the meal each day.

End of the day

The school day ends at 3.25pm for KS2 (Years 3 to 6) and 3.30pm for EYFS and KS1 (Years R to 2), when children will be dismissed via the exits onto the main playground.

Parents are invited to wait on the playground to collect their children. For children up to Year 4, we ask that an adult is available to collect children every day. From Year 5, parents may choose to let their child walk home unaccompanied. Written permission will be required.

If you need to make changes to your child's collection arrangement, please contact the school office with plenty of notice, and before 3pm at the latest.

Admission Policies and Procedures

By law, parents must arrange for their child to start school at the beginning of their term of their 5th birthday, unless they have made other suitable arrangements, which have been approved by the Local Authority.

Aspull Church Primary School has provision for 30 Reception age pupils.

Admission Criteria

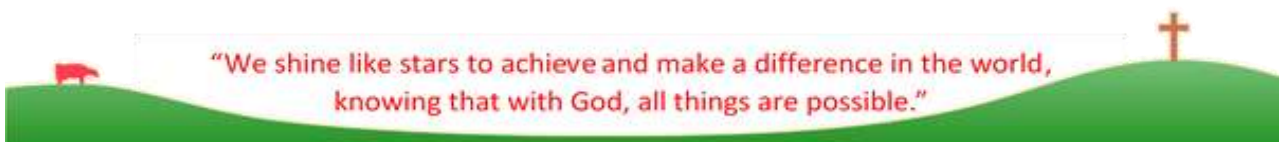
Admission criteria are used to allocate places when the number of applications for a school exceeds the number of places available.

The admission criteria for schools in this section are:

1. Children in public care and previously looked after children
2. Children with proven special educational, medical or social needs.
3. Children with siblings who attend Aspull Church Primary School at the time of admission.
4. Children who, with their immediate family regularly attend St Elizabeth's Church, Aspull or Aspull Methodist Church.
5. Children who with their immediate family regularly attend other Christian Churches.
6. Children living closest to the school.
