

The Rule: 7-5-(7 thru11)

- It is forward-pass interference if any player who is beyond the neutral zone interferes with an eligible opponent's opportunity to move toward, catch or bat a pass.
- There must be contact to have DPI (i.e. face-guarding is legal).
- Can only have DPI if ball is in the air and pass (untouched by B) crosses the neutral zone.
- Catchability is NOT a factor.

...it is not DPI if...

- Unavoidable contact occurs when two or more eligibles are making a simultaneous, bona fide attempt to move toward, catch or bat the pass.
- Contact by B is obviously away from the direction of the pass.





Processing the Action: Categories of DPI

- Early Contact
- Playing thru the Back
- Grabbing a Receiver's Arm
- Arm Bar
- · Cut-Off
- Hook-AND-Turn

MAKE IT BIG...we want clear and obvious material restriction!







...but not DPI if...

- Incidental Contact
- Inadvertent Tangling of Feet
- Hands on Receiver/Hand-Fighting
- Defender Gains Position
- Bang-Bang





Points of Focus:

- Have a high football IQ
- Know your personnel
- Be situationally aware
- Identify defensive scheme pre-snap (zone vs man)
- Offensive formation and receiver positioning
- Strike zone is shoulder to waste
- Look for clues: defender beat and not playing ball; one-armed receiver; unnatural body movement

Remember, we want clear and obvious material restriction for a foul. MAKE IT BIG...MAKE THERE BE A VICTIM!
