The Community Orchard update

Some villagers may have already said hello to Tara, our Gardener, when she has been working in the Orchard over the last few months. Yarnton Parish Council hired Tara in 2025 to manage this community area and implement some suggestions from Wild Oxfordshire, who were commissioned by the Parish Council to provide guidance on how best to help assist nature in the area. Tara has been very busy getting to know the Orchard, understanding what needs to be done and has come up with a gardening plan for 2026.

To date the compost and brown bins have been reconfigured, and work continues to revitalise overgrown areas. The apple trees have been given lots of TLC, and have all been re-staked and mulched, and well watered during the hot summer. Pruning will take place after Tara attends a specialist fruit tree pruning course at Waterperry Gardens, who hold the National Apple Collection.

Also being done is a general tidy up which has been undertaken across the Orchard in preparation for winter. In the last week of November there have been several thousand daffodil, narcissi, snowdrop, bluebell and muscari bulbs planted around the orchard with further bulbs planted in the cemetery. Thank you to the volunteers who helped Tara with this mammoth task; we will all be looking forward to seeing a wonderful floral display in the coming Spring.

There is a full year plan for the Orchard next year starting with a few of the winter and spring jobs:

January – Continue clearing overgrown areas to support a balance between tidy and wilder areas. Manage areas of dense elder, while retaining some elder for wildlife value. Implement wildlife habitat – e.g. dead wood piles in shaded and sunny areas. Label tree species.

February – Dormant prune fruit trees. Clear areas around fruit trees to reduce competition for water and nutrients. Nettle, ivy and bramble management.

March – Feed apple trees. Set-up bird boxes and wildlife habitats using logs and fallen branches, plant wildflower patches for butterflies and early species of solitary bees.

April – Plant shade tolerant herbaceous plants in the north-east corner, monitor trees for pests and diseases, and an Easter egg hunt!

May – Tend wildflower areas by cultivating the flowers we want and removing the ones we don't, introduce secondary wildflower patches (for the butterflies, bees and birds) along the north wall border and plant summer flowering naturalised bulbs.

Watch this space for more spring and summer activities later in the year!

One year on.... Why reporting flooding matters for Yarnton residents

Flooding is becoming an increasing concern for many communities, and Yarnton is no exception. In September and November 2024, many homes in our village experienced flooding, yet only 25 properties officially reported it. This lack of data has serious consequences for all of us.

Why reporting is crucial

Flood Re, the government-backed scheme designed to make flood insurance more affordable, relies on accurate data to assess risk and allocate grants. If flooding incidents go unreported, Yarnton appears less affected than it truly is. This means fewer resources, less funding, and limited eligibility for grants that could help protect our homes in the future.

Reporting flooding isn't just about water inside your home. It includes:

- Driveways
- Gardens
- Outbuildings
- Any external areas impacted by floodwater

Every report strengthens the case for Yarnton to receive support, and ensures that insurers and local authorities understand the real risk we face.

New developments increase risk

With new housing developments possibly being built near our village, the risk of flooding can rise due to increased hard surfaces and changes to drainage systems. Accurate reporting helps planners and councils make informed decisions and implement proper flood mitigation measures.

Transparency when selling your home

It's equally important to be honest about flooding history when selling your property. Misrepresenting or omitting details, whether the flooding occurred inside the house or on surrounding land, can lead to legal action for misrepresentation. Buyers have the right to know the full history, and failing to disclose it could result in costly disputes later.

What you can do

- Report any flooding to Oxfordshire County Council, Thames Water for any issues with foul sewage overflows, and your insurer, even if it seems minor.
- **Keep records** of dates, photos, and any damage.
- Share information with neighbours to encourage accurate reporting across the community.

By working together and being transparent, we can protect our homes, increase our chances of securing future funding, and most importantly, maintain trust within our village.

Let's make sure Yarnton's real flood risk is recognised, because without accurate data, we all lose.

Having the Builders in Part 2. Managing the job

You've found a builder and agreed a formal building contract - the price, duration, payment schedule, and start date are all set. But even with everything in writing, a construction project remains a major challenge. Delays and unexpected problems are almost inevitable. This article looks at ways to help ensure your project is completed as quickly and efficiently as possible. Before work begins, your builder should prepare a construction program - ideally a project management bar chart. Arrange a meeting to go over this in detail, discussing how the job will be managed, including timelines, potential disruptions, and safety protocols. Clarify who is responsible for what to avoid confusion and ensure accountability. Build extra time into the schedule to account for possible weather delays. You should also confirm which areas of your property will be worked on and when, what tasks will be carried out at each stage, and how long they'll take. Find out if utilities will be disrupted or whether parts of your home will be uninhabitable during the works. Check your home insurance to see whether it covers building work and what types of projects are included.

Good pre-project planning should cover any need for temporary partitions, doors, screens, or barriers to separate construction zones from living areas. These help contain dust and stop children, pets, or guests from accidentally entering potentially dangerous areas. Label off-limits areas clearly and use high-visibility barriers. Make sure builders keep access points to these zones securely closed when not in use.

Take steps to protect your belongings from damage or theft. Move furniture and valuables out of the work area completely - dust sheets alone are not enough. Store small valuables and important documents off-site or in a locked safe. Consider installing security cameras to spot unapproved visitors. Limit access to keys if builders will be working in your home when you're not there. Once the job is finished, change the locks.

Once building work begins, expect your home to become chaotic - builders, plumbers, electricians and others coming and going, an unbelievable amount of dust which somehow manages to get everywhere, and constant noise. The project will feel endless. For larger jobs, it can be less stressful to move out, perhaps into a rented static caravan if space allows. Builders can then work more efficiently, and you won't be constantly trying to get out of the way by 8 a.m. or spending all evening tidying up. Help the job run smoothly by removing any potential barriers to progress. Set aside a designated area for material storage, make space for delivery vehicles to unload, and allow room for the skip.

You have every right to expect your builder to arrive on time, dress appropriately, and keep the site clean. Tradespeople should show up as scheduled and complete work within the agreed timeframe and budget. A good builder minimises mess and leaves the area clean and tidy at the end of each day. If problems arise - and they will - a good builder identifies and resolves them quickly and professionally, ideally face to face. Hold regular progress meetings - weekly or bi-weekly - to track progress, adjust schedules, and deal with issues early. Your project timeline should be a living document, flexible enough to adapt but clear enough to keep things on track. When milestones are reached, recognise the builder's hard work and efforts - it helps keep morale up and motivation high.

On completion of the building work, take time to inspect the finished project thoroughly. Ensure all work meets the agreed standards and specifications. Address any snags promptly. Once satisfied, make the final payment, update your home insurance, and enjoy your transformed home, ready for you to settle back in.

Oxford Bus and Morris Motors Exhibition

A new vehicle acquired with a view to restoration

After the excitement of the New Year's Day running event with the Christmas Jumper Competition, January is a quiet month for visitors. However, the workshop volunteers are busy. Restorations continue and our South Midland minibus is having a new engine fitted in preparation for the 2026 season. Our 1948 Morris 10 Series M's full restoration is nearing completion and it should emerge from the workshop in 2026.

Some museum volunteers have clubbed together to buy, and therefore save, a 1944 Morris Post Office series Y van, GXK 685. It arrived at the museum on 8th October to be stored until restoration starts. The first task is to fit four new tyres so it can be moved more easily.



The Morris series Y 100 cubic foot vans were first used for postal work in 1939, when two were purchased. They had an 11.9hp side-valve engine and a 10cwt semi-forward-control with an all-steel construction. Interestingly, the engine was positioned to one side, allowing the driver to sit beside it with no room for a passenger.

GXK 685 is a Cowley-built Series Y van and one of a batch of 350 supplied in 1944 to Royal Mail. We understand that it spent its early years in rural Cumbria before being sold to a carpenter in Nottinghamshire where, it is believed, it was used in his business for the transportation of coffins. It was last used in 1964.

About twenty years ago, GXK685 was purchased by a local collector with the desire to save it, because it is thought that only two other Royal Mail versions of this type have survived. On learning that it was still awaiting restoration, a syndicate of seven museum members have joined together with the aim of restoring it to its original condition for the Museum.

Watch this space.



Sunday 4th January Epiphany Sunday – 8 a.m. Holy Communion, 11 a.m. Parish Communion with Junior Church

The celebration of Epiphany falls 12 days after Christmas, and is a special celebration in the church year. We keep it two days early on the nearest Sunday. Epiphany recalls the visit of the magi (or wise men) to the infant Jesus, with their prophetic gifts. Their epiphany is to recognise Jesus, the child of Mary, as the new, divine King. Recorded in Matthew's gospel (chapter 2, v.1-12), this is the occasion where Jesus was revealed as divine to those not just from his native land but to the whole world: the magi from the east are understood to represent the nations of the earth. They present their gifts and worship him, thus recognising and honouring his divinity. It is an encounter that changes their lives, diverting them from the brutal king Herod to carry their news back to their native lands. We read that '*having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route*' (Matthew 1.12).

As we move beyond the twelve days of Christmas and into a new year, Christians believe that we are invited to keep reflecting on our encounter with the child Jesus, and follow in his way of self-giving love, and the new directions it may lead. A prayer for Epiphany is below:

*O God, who by the leading of a star
manifested your only Son to the peoples of the earth:
mercifully grant that we,
who know you now by faith,
may at last behold your glory face to face;
through Jesus Christ your Son, our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and forever.
Amen.*
