Once again, we have the honour to be asked to judge the cake stall at the fete at William Fletcher School. I am sure it will be a tasty afternoon treat.





#### **Cassington Road closure**

Ian Middleton, one of our Parish Councillors, posted the following on the Yarnton Village Community Group Facebook Page early in June.

People will have noticed that the Cassington Road section towards the A44 is now closed. This is due to additional problems with the partially collapsed sewer in that area that has necessitated the almost permanent siting of a sewage tanker at the Turnpike pub. The situation recently suddenly worsened with some further subsidence in the road near the pipe, which meant it needed to be closed for safety reasons.

It's now been announced that the road will be closed until  $10^{\text{th}}$  September 2025 while they hopefully deal with this problem once and for all, although we can hope that it will be completed before then.

Whilst this will be frustrating for motorists, it will provide some relief for residents who have been dealing with the impact of this restricted drain for some time. It was really only a matter of time until this happened.'

#### St. Bartholomew's July update

#### Village Prayers

On 8th June, the festival of Pentecost, we followed up our morning worship with a 'Village Prayers' gathering. This was followed by tea and cake in the churchyard, with children's activities and a churchyard wildlife trail. We invited friends from other churches to gather and pray for our village. The day of Pentecost in the Acts of the Apostles marked the 'birth' of the church and expressed a remarkable moment of unity. It is a traditional day for those from different churches and denominations to come together in prayer and fellowship. The various churches represented were keen to meet again in similar fashion. The hope would be to invite all churches represented in Yarnton to meet perhaps once or twice a year, and we look forward to deepening friendships.

#### **Building update**

In July we trust that scaffolding will go up on the north and south sides of St. Bartholomew's. This has been awaited since February, and will enable minor repairs to the Spencer Chapel roof and masonry to be carried out. The completion of the minor repairs will be a prelude to the next stage of work to the Spencer Chapel roof. Further fundraising will be needed, and we will report on this after the minor repairs.

#### **Vocations**

As this issue of Village News is delivered, three people who have spent time on placement at St. Bartholomew's will be beginning ordained ministry in the Church of England. We have greatly enjoyed welcoming Peter Balchin and Sam Haiser on placements from Wycliffe Hall this academic year, and both are being ordained as deacons on 29th June. Peter is being ordained in Southwell Minster to serve in the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham. Sam is being ordained at Holy Trinity, Brussels and will serve in the Anglican Church in Austria within the Church of England's Diocese in Europe. Oliver Wright, who was on placement in 2020 as we emerged from the first lockdown, is being ordained in Christchurch Cathedral on 5th July to serve as a curate at St. Clement's, Oxford.

We have been thankful for the gifts of these three ordinands, and we are cheering them on as they begin a new adventure. They are charged to begin a life of service, looking to the example of Jesus Christ. In the ordination service the bishop states: 'Deacons are ordained so that the people of God may be better equipped to make Christ known. Theirs is a life of visible self-giving. Christ is the pattern of their calling and their commission; as he washed the feet of his disciples, so they must wash the feet of others.'

Alongside this, the Church is a community which understands that all are called by God, and given gifts for service. The ordination service also states: 'The Church is the Body of Christ, the people of God and the dwelling-place of the Holy Spirit. In baptism the whole Church is summoned to witness to God's love and to work for the coming of his kingdom.' St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 12, expresses the conviction that each person has gifts, and all are significant within the Church community, which is called to strive for unity. I am ever thankful to our community for their care for one another and for our common life. St. Paul also writes of a well lived Christian life revealing the Spirit of God at work: 'By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.' (Galatians 5.22). I am thankful indeed for these gifts which many reveal, often quietly and in hidden ways, to support our communities and build up the common good.

We wish all in our village a peaceful and restful summer.

Village residents: £11.00 Non Village residents: £13.00 **Kitchen**: £8.00 - per session



#### Yarnton Netball Club





#### Gardening in July

Heading into the hottest months of the year, we need to be looking out for our local wildlife that could be harmed by the heat. Fortunately, there are lots of easy ways to lend a helping hand.

Even the most heat-loving species can suffer without enough to drink, so consider providing a shallow bath of water in your garden. Add some stones around the dish so that bees and butterflies can climb out if they fall in.

It's also important to provide some shade in your garden. A small pile of logs can be a great hiding place from the sun for insects .

Make sure you're also helping your grass and flowers survive the heat, as grass can reduce surface temperatures by  $10^{\circ C}$  compared to concrete, and flowers are a vital wildlife food source in the hot weather.

#### **Happy Swift Awareness Week!**

#### **About swifts.** To celebrate swift awareness week, here's some interesting facts about swifts.

These birds are the TopGun 'Mavrics' of the bird world, as they can do almost everything in the air! Swifts' feet and legs aren't designed for sitting on the floor or a perch. They can perch vertically but they can't sit like a robin or pigeon for example, as their wings are far too long. They are perfectly designed for flight, and this means they do everything whilst flying - drinking, eating and even mating! True acrobatic flyers.

Swifts have one of the longest migration journeys in the world! Our swifts migrate approximately 14,000 miles to return to our swift boxes in Oxfordshire every year! What a journey - really makes us think of 'home sweet home'.



The swifts we see in our towns and villages have overwintered in Africa and come back each summer to nest and raise their chicks. Once the chick(s) leave the nest, they're off - they will never return to the family nest again.

On Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> July we shall be having a Military Day. Look out for the camouflage man - if you can find him. There will be displays of weapons, aircraft, Land Rovers, artillery, camouflage, military uniforms, and lorries. A World War I model T Ford with a Vickers machine gun on the back will be attending. One of only two in the country! There will be a display of aircraft relics from the Battle of Britain, a collection of airships from the 1900s, which includes pictures, relics and memorabilia from Zeppelins and the R101. There will also be a cockpit instrument display from WW2 fighter aircraft. The Home Guard will be demonstrating army drills and will show and talk about Home Guard activities during World War II.

For the children, and possibly adults, there will be paper aeroplane making, and then flying them to land on a simulated aircraft carrier.

150 years ago this year the Penny Farthing was at its most popular, but not everyone fancied riding one! Inventors had already designed several tricycles, but none had become popular enough to put into production.

In 1876 J.K. Starley of Haynes and Jefferis in Coventry invented a 'modern' tricycle which was the first to be put into mass production. It was patented the following year. Tricycles today have developed to have three wheels of equal size. They did not start like that. The pictured Coventry Lever Tricycle had one large 50inch (1.27 metre) driving wheel in the middle of one side and two smaller wheels fore and aft, both of which were steerable via a tiller. The rider propelled the machine forwards using levers.

Later the levers were replaced by rotary cranks, and the tiller was succeeded by rack and pinion steering. It became known as the Coventry Rotary and later the Rudge Rotary.



In 1877 Starley added a second large wheel at the side and, with a second seat and set of pedals, created the Coventry Sociable; the first sociable tricycle for two riders. One of these is on display in the museum. It employed two driving wheels, with each rider driving one wheel. If one rider pedalled faster than the other, it became unstable. This led Starley to design and add a balance gear or differential, which allowed the two wheels to revolve at different speeds when cornering. Modern cars have differential based on the same concept!

We shall be running heritage bus rides on 6th and 13th July.
