Last week on 10th October, it was World Mental Health Day. This year's theme set by the World Federation of Mental Health is workplace mental health. The theme highlights the importance of addressing mental health and wellbeing in the workplace, for the benefit of people, organisations, and communities.

Key Information:

- Germany is home to more than 380 higher education institutions, which collectively offer around 20,000 study programmes. Of the impressive 48 featured in the [QS World University Rankings 2025](#), three appear in the top 100.
- Study programmes in Germany are similar to those in the UK. Undergraduate degrees are available as Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BSc), and Bachelor of Engineering (BEng), and generally require a minimum of three years to complete.
- Every year, Germany attracts over 380,000 international students. One of the main reasons is that most publicly funded universities are free to attend, with the exception of a small semester contribution of up to €350 (£297) to cover basic administrative and registration costs.
