Country: Norway

Key Information:

- Norway has three types of state-owned higher education institution. These include universities, university colleges and specialist colleges. The country also has a number of private higher education institutions.
- Higher education institutions in Norway follow the Bologna Process, so the type and structure of programmes are similar to those in the UK.
- Bachelors courses usually take three years to complete and are available in a variety of subjects.
- International students from outside the EU are required to pay tuition fees to study in Norway. These fees are determined by each institution and may vary depending on the course. They range from approximately 125,000 to 370,000 Norwegian Krone (NOK) per year, which is around £8,837 to £26,159.
