Key Information:

- Bulgaria is becoming an increasingly attractive study abroad destination for international students, with British students making up the largest contingent of foreign students studying in the south-eastern European country.
- A big attraction is that many Bulgarian higher education institutions are now offering the chance to gain a double degree, with one from the UK or another country, as well as a degree or diploma from inside the European Union.
- You should apply directly to your chosen Bulgarian university. Most Bulgarian universities require international applicants to provide copies of relevant documents.
