Audiologist

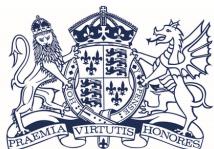

Country: China

Key Information:

- While the border is open to full-time international degree students looking to enter China, you’ll need to ensure that you’ve received your student visa before you set off on your journey.
- Around 600 of the 3,000 universities and colleges admit international students.
- The C9 League is a group of nine universities considered equivalent to the British Russell Group or the American Ivy League.
- Undergraduate programmes typically last four years. Courses are taught in Chinese (usually Mandarin) and English. If you’d like to study in English, you’ll need to check which institutions offer your course in the language.
