RAF GRIMSBY (WALTHAM) MUSEUM



The museum is part of the Waltham Windmill site. During the Second World War the mill was used as a Home Guard look-out post with a view over the River Humber and had a narrow escape when the RAF wanted to demolish it as a hazard to aircraft.



Experience an original nissen hut from the Second World War. The museum is housed in the WAAF's mess, which was part of RAF Grimsby in the Second Worl War.

During WW2 RAF Grimsby, was the base for 142, 100 and 550 heavy bomber squadrons. The museum houses a variety of memorabilia of these squadrons.









Waltham was also the home of four "ton Up" Lancasters, each clocking up over 100 missions.

Crew members can be traced from most of the aircraft that flew from RAF Grimsby and the museum has a large variety of photographs and other documentation relating to the wartime station.

There is a large display of other memorabilia from WW2 including:

- Gas masks
- A local air raid siren
- Ration books
- Uniforms
- Wartime equipment (RAF & Army)
- Parts of crashed aircraft
- Bombs and bullets
- Christmas cards from Adolf Hitler and Grossadmiral Donitz
- Aircraft models
- A large variety of books relating to the RAF

The museum also contains some later items like an air-to-air missile and an ejector seat from a Lightning fighter which younger visitors can be strapped into wearing a pilot's hat.
