At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - Peter is an eyewitness:
The Lord is risen (Acts 10:34a, 37-43).

Psalms - This is the day the Lord has
made; let us rejoice and be glad (Psalm
118).

Second Reading - All who are baptized,
set your hearts in heaven (Colossians 3:1-
4).

Gospel - Three witnesses, Mary, Peter
and John, each responds to the empty
tomb (John 20:1-9).

PROCLAIM THE RISEN CHRIST

On Easter morning everything—the spring
weather, the flowers, birds and butter-
flies, the people around us in their finery,
the beautiful liturgy and music—everything
seems to bear witness that Jesus Christ is
risen today!

Like the eyewitness accounts in today's
scriptures, the glorious and joyful life all
around us helps us to believe the good
news of the Resurrection and sing
"Alleluia!" In the scriptures today we hear
from Peter and Paul and John. All three
speak with conviction about witnessing the
resurrected Christ. John's Gospel account
includes Mary of Magdala, who also was
privileged to witness the Resurrection and
tell others the good news. On this glorious
Easter Sunday can we ourselves give eye-
witness accounts that Jesus Christ is risen
today, alive and active in our lives?

REFLECTING ON GOD'S WORD

The conviction and enthusiasm of eyewit-
ness accounts give them a certain ring of
truth. Yet the more eyewitnesses there
are the more variance there may be in the
details reported. Different witnesses may
have seen different things-or seen things
differently-but they usually agree on the
fundamental truth about what happened.

The Easter scriptures record the eyewit-
ness accounts of Mary Magdalene, John,
and Peter. Their credibility rests not on
the precise details, but on the conviction
and enthusiasm of the eyewitnesses. It is
their belief in the Resurrection that con-
vinces others to believe.

Like these scriptural eyewitnesses, today's
believers are also "witnesses chosen by
God in advance, who ate and drank with
him after he rose from the dead" (Acts
10:41). We are called to "testify that he
is the one appointed by God" (10:42) by
giving eyewitness accounts of how the
Spirit of the risen Christ is alive today.
Our accounts may not agree in every de-
tail, but the core truth will be the same,
that Jesus Christ is risen indeed!
