MISSION STATEMENT: To serve the needs of the growing faith community in this part of Southern Nevada, composed of residents, weekend visitors and snowbirds who pray together, work together so as to build up the body of Christ; to be witnesses likewise, to the historical legacy of the first recorded Catholic Mass in Nevada celebrated in Laughlin in 1776 by Father Francisco Garces, a Franciscan missionary.

Weddings: Weddings are normally celebrated on Saturdays. *Registered and active parishioners* should contact the priest **at least six months in advance** to make the arrangements.

Directions to St. John the Baptist Church: From Casino Dr. go west on Bruce Woodbury Drive (across from the Edgewater Hotel). Continue approximately 3 miles to Needles Highway, turn left. At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - As the prophet Samuel anointed David with oil, the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David (1 Samuel 16:1b,6-7, 10-13a).

Psalm - The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want (Psalm 23).

Second Reading - You who were once darkness are now light in the Lord (Ephesians 5:8-14).

Gospel - The man who had been blind from birth proclaimed: The one called Jesus made clay with his saliva, anointed my eyes with it, and told me to wash (John 9:1-41).

NEW VISION

Jesus proclaimed that he came into the world to make the sightless see and the seeing blind. A difficult saying! But surely it must mean that Jesus intended to take our ordinary ways of looking at things and turn them inside out. Jesus came to change our perspective.

When the prophet Samuel went out to select the new king, he chose a young man who had the look of royalty about him. But God told him not to judge by appearances. God told Samuel-and today tell us-to change our perspective and to look at things and people differently.

We are like the Ephesians, whom Paul urged to live as children of the light. With the light of faith, we have a new way of looking at things, and we are called to bring that new vision to the world around us. This is a great vocation, a calling to wake people up to what's really important.

RELICS OF CHRIST'S PASSION

Sunday, March 15th

3:00 PM

Please join us at St. John the Baptist Church on Sunday, March 15, 2026 at 3:00 PM for an encounter with nine rare Relics of Christ's Passion. Having the opportunity to meditate on the Passion in the presence of these holy relics is sure to enhance your Lenten experience.

Take advantage of what is likely to be a once in a lifetime opportunity to engage in a meditative walk to Calvary and venerate these rare and holy relics. This powerful program is a 90-minute meditational experience supported with Eucharistic Exposition, music and prayer, culminating in relic veneration.

A collection such as this is generally seen only in Rome or the Holy Land. This presentation is being brought to us as part of a collaborative initiative with the Knights of Columbus and the Apostolate for Holy Relics.

The Relics of the Passion collection includes:

A piece of the True Cross which was discovered by St. Helena.

A piece of the Holy Table from the room where the Last Supper took place.

A piece of the Column of Flagellation.

A piece of the Crown of Thorns.

A replica of the Holy Nail, fashioned using filings from the true nails.

A relic (bone) of St. Longinus, the centurion who pierced the side of Christ.

A picture of (the effigy of) the Veil of Veronica touched to the original with a Vatican seal attesting to the fact.

A piece of the exterior wrapping for the Shroud of Turin.

Relics of the Holy Apostles.

COLORADO RIVER HOLY WATER

In honor of Fr. Francisco Garces, for whom our Garces Center is named, we have blessed & packaged special containers of holy water using water from the Colorado River, the very same source of water that Fr. Garces used for blessings & baptisms almost 250 years ago. Each bottle also contains chips of real turquoise which was revered by the local tribes as a sign of peace, health & life.

We cannot sell the holy water because it is blessed, and a blessed item cannot be sold. But if you would like one, a donation of \$3.00 will cover the cost of the bottle & turquoise chips. Anything extra will be given to the Garces Center.

If you would prefer to bring your own water in your own containers, Fr. Charlie will be happy to bless the water at no charge. Not a bad idea to keep some holy water in our homes during these tumultuous times.

TIGER MASSES - You need to be "tough as a tiger" to attend Mass at 6:00 AM on the Fridays of Lent, but you collect "real" tiger tails! There are 6 Tiger Masses beginning on Friday, February 20th, at the church.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS - Pray and follow Jesus' journey to the cross at 6:00 PM each Friday of Lent at the church with a simple soup supper following the service.

ABSTINENCE is not eating meat or meat products. Catholics do not eat meat on **ASH WEDNESDAY** and on the **FRIDAYS OF LENT**.

FASTING means eating only one full meal. Catholics observe **FASTING** on **ASH WEDNESDAY** and on **GOOD FRIDAY**.

MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE - Please take home one of our special containers and donate your coins during Lent to help pay the mortgage on the Garces Center. Every little bit helps!

CONFESSIONS are heard 20 minutes before **EVERY MASS** at the church and the Riverside. Please don't wait until the last minute to make a good confession.
