At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

April 27th

3:00 PM

Sunday, April 27th, is DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY. We will celebrate the Divine Mercy Novena Prayers each day this week at 3:00 PM in the church.

The big celebration will be at 3:00 PM on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 27th, at the church. To obtain the plenary indulgence, you need to be at this service, and also do the following within 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday: make a sacramental confession, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the intentions of the pope. You must be as detached as possible from all attachments to sin.

In preparation for the Feast of The Divine Mercy, the Lord asked Sister Faustina to make a novena of prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday.

These nine days of prayer before the Feast of Mercy are like the nine days of prayer in the upper room before the day of Pentecost (Acts 1:14).

For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Sister Faustina a different intention. We, too, can make a novena of prayer for these intentions and others, especially by praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
