MISSION STATEMENT: To serve the needs of the growing faith community in this part of Southern Nevada, composed of residents, weekend visitors and snowbirds who pray together, work together so as to build up the body of Christ; to be witnesses likewise, to the historical legacy of the first recorded Catholic Mass in Nevada celebrated in Laughlin in 1776 by Father Francisco Garces, a Franciscan missionary.

Weddings: Weddings are normally celebrated on Saturdays. *Registered and active parishioners* should contact the priest *at least six months in advance* to make the arrangements.

Directions to St. John the Baptist Church: From Casino Dr. go west on Bruce Woodbury Drive (across from the Edgewater Hotel). Continue approximately 3 miles to Needles Highway, turn left. At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - The word of the Lord is very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts (Deuteronomy 30:10-14).

Psalm - Your words, Lord, are Spirit and life (Psalm 19).

Second Reading - Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15-20).

Gospel - The Samaritan traveler was moved with compassion at the sight of the man stripped and beaten by robbers (Luke 10:25-37).

GOD WANTS TO BE KNOWN

The Old Testament reading from Deuteronomy praises God for inscribing the commandments in our very bodies. God's law is not distant or foreign, but a natural part of us. In his letter to the Colossians, Saint Paul echoes Moses, praising God for becoming one of us. The truly human, flesh-and-blood Jesus reminds us that God always wants to be recognizable and familiar to us. Jesus who is also truly God, wants to be on intimate terms with each of us.

God's passionate desire to be known by us is almost too wonderful to take in. Luke's Gospel helps us understand how to respond. The Good Samaritan parable provides practical advice for those who believe in God's intimate love for them and want to share that love with others.

A DISPOSITION OF DISCERNMENT

If you're confused and unsure about your vocation, one of the very best things you can do is attend Holy Mass with a *disposition of discernment*.

The sacred liturgy imparts all the graces necessary to discern your vocation, whether to marriage, the priesthood, or consecrated life. The challenge is opening your heart to receive God's grace-then integrating it into a healthy discernment process that includes daily prayer and spiritual direction.

How do you obtain graces for discernment at Mass? Certainly not by trudging to church solely out of obligation, distractedly enduring the homily and offering a few half-hearted petitions. No, discernment during Mass requires a concentrated effort of will-an intentional, whole-hearted decision to open oneself to God as the liturgy unfolds.

Be realistic about the process of discernment. This is not a one-Mass thing. Yes, the Lord can speak powerfully during a single Mass, but normally Mass is one part of a process that takes many months. The first rule of discernment is to draw as close as possible to Jesus. Otherwise, how will you hear His gently whisper? (1 Kings 19:12). Commit yourself to daily prayer and service. Frequent the sacraments and meet regularly with a spiritual director. Seek good information about the various vocations and contact a Vocation Directory for help.

THE ROSARY, MEDITATION, AND THE VAGUS NERVE

The body and soul are deeply connected. In Ignatian spirituality, we recognize that caring for our physical health is as important as nurturing our spiritual well-being. One fascinating intersection of science and faith lies in the role of the vagus nerve. The vagus nerve is a crucial part of our nervous system that regulates stress, relaxation, and overall well-being.

Recent studies show that prayer, meditation, and breathwork stimulate the vagus nerve, promoting calmness and reducing anxiety. This is precisely what happens when we pray the Rosary. The steady rhythm of prayers and the tactile progression through the circle of the beads create a meditative experience that slows the heart rate, deepens the breath, and shifts the body from a state of stress to conditions of rest and renewal.

St. Ignatius encouraged his followers to seek moments of stillness in prayer, allowing God's presence to transform them. The Rosary provides this quiet interlude. Each repetition of the Hail Mary is like a breath drawing us deeper into God's presence, quieting the mind and easing the tension we carry.

This cause-and-effect experience stems not just from spiritual intuition; it is borne out in physiological reality. When we activate the vagus nerve through meditative prayer, we cultivate resilience, improve emotional regulation, and enhance our ability to experience God's peace. Those who struggle with stress, insomnia, or anxiety may find the Rosary to be a powerful practice—not as a rigid obligation, but as a sacred rhythm that restores balance.

In a world that often feels overwhelming, prayer becomes a reliable anchor. The Rosary is more than a devotion to Mary; as a tool for healing. It aligns body, mind, and soul with God's grace. If you seek a deeper sense of peace, consider integrating this prayer into your daily routine. As Ignatius reminds us, God meets us where we are. Often, that meeting place occurs in the quiet rooms where prayers pulse with the steady rhythm of a heartbeat. That's the place where healing begins.
