At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - The name of the Lord has become like fire burning in Jeremiah's heart (Jeremiah 20:7-9).

THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. AS it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

OUR LADY OF KNOCK

In 2017, I was attending a magic convention in Liverpool, England. One of parishioners, Sally Carr, invited me to spend a few days with her in Ireland. I happily agreed and also made arrangements to spend a few days at the Shrine of Our Lady of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland. To me, this is one of the most beautiful apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary and I want to share the story with all of you.

On the evening of August 21, 1879, fifteen villagers in Knock, Ireland, witnessed a silent apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph, Saint John the Evangelist, some angels, and the Lamb of God, on an altar with a cross.

On that rainy evening in Knock, County Mayo, Ireland, around 8:00 PM, Mary Byrne, Mary McLaughlin, and other villagers saw three life-size figures at the gable of St. John the Baptist Catholic Church. The figures were Our Lady in white with a crown, St. Joseph bowing slightly, and St. John the Evangelist holding a book and pointing toward heaven. In front of them was a plain altar with a cross and a lamb, surrounded by angels, all raised about two feet above the ground, yet the gable remained dry despite the rain. The vision lasted for nearly two hours, and witnesses ranged in age from 5 to 75 years old, including children and adults from the village and surrounding area.

Fifteen official witnesses gave detailed accounts to a Commission of Enquiry in October 1879. Among them, 11 year-old Patrick Hill provided one of the most vivid descriptions, noting the figures appeared alive and full-bodied, yet silent. The testimonies were judged trustworthy and the Catholic Church later recognized the apparition officially in 1979.

Although the figures spoke no words, the apparition conveyed rich biblical and liturgical symbolism. The Lamb on the altar represents Christ's sacrifice. The silent nature of the vision emphasized hope, divine comfort, and the Eucharistic presence, particularly meaningful to Irish Catholics recovering from the Great Famine and enduring economic problems in the 1800's.

The fifteen witnesses of the apparition were ordinary villagers, ranging in age from 5 to 75 years old. Among them were:

Mary Byrne, one of the most well-documented witnesses.

Patrick Hill, a young boy whose vivid testimony strengthened the case for Knock's authenticity.

Bridget Trench, who famously tried to touch the apparition, only to feel nothing but air.

Their consistent testimonies remained unchanged for decades, and none of them sought personal gain from the event. Most of the witnesses are buried in simple graves in the village of Knock.
