At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - Whenever anyone who had been bitten by a serpent looked at the bronze serpent, they lived (Numbers 21:4b-9).

<u>Psalm</u> - Do not forget the works of the Lord! (Psalm 78).

<u>Second Reading</u> - Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped (Philippians 2:6-11).

Gospel - God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that those who believe might have eternal life (John 3:13-17).

BEING LIFTED UP

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds Nicodemus how Moses had "lifted up the serpent in the desert." Then Jesus says, "So must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him." The evangelist clearly saw this "lifting up" of Jesus to mean his crucifixion

That "lifting up" of the serpent by Moses is described in today's first reading. The people were attacked by "saraph serpents," and many died. God had Moses make an image of the serpent and put it on a pole and lift it up. The people who had been bitten looked at it and recovered

Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." Lifted up on the cross, he was despised and seemed the most abject of people. But it was in embracing this disgrace and painful death that he became the bearer of eternal life for all of us. His "lifting up" in shame was also his "lifting up" in glory and triumph.

BECOMING CATHOLIC - 2025

In the Archdiocese of Las Vegas, there is a program known as BECOMING CATHOLIC:

- 1. For adults who want to convert from another faith group and join the Catholic Church.
- 2. For those adults who have no religious affiliation at present and want to join the Catholic Church.
- 3. For those adults who have been baptized as Catholics, but have never received the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation.

This program will begin in October and lead to completion at the Easter Vigil in 2026 (Saturday, April 4, 2026) for those candidates who are ready at that time.

It is presumed that the first steps should be to be actively attending Mass here at St. John the Baptist, to fill out a BECOMING CATHOLIC registration form, and to arrange a meeting with Father Charlie during the month of September to finalize arrangements.

There will be a general information meeting about BECOMING CATHOLIC in the Garces Center at 2:00 PM on Sunday, September 14 for anyone wanting more information.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

In the Archdiocese of Las Vegas, the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated for those high school students who are:

- 1. Members of our parish
- 2. Actively attending Mass in our parish
- 3. Who have been baptized and have received First Holy Communion
- 4. Who attend and complete the required program of classes in preparation for the Sacrament.

If you would like to be enrolled for this year's classes which will begin in October, please fill out the Religious Education form and bring it to the church office along with written proof of Baptism, and the fee of \$25.00 no later than September 22, 2025.





COLORADO RIVER HOLY WATER

In honor of Fr. Francisco Garces, for whom our Garces Center is named, we have blessed & packaged special containers of holy water using water from the Colorado River, the very same source of water that Fr. Garces used for blessings & baptisms almost 250 years ago. Each bottle also contains chips of real turquoise which was revered by the local tribes as a sign of peace, health & life.

We cannot sell the holy water it is blessed, and a blessed item cannot be sold. But if you would like one, a donation of \$3.00 will cover the cost of the bottle & turquoise chips. Anything extra will be given to the Garces Center.

If you would prefer to bring you own water in your own containers, Fr. Charlie will be happy to bless the water at no charge. Not a bad idea to keep some holy water in our homes during these tumultuous times.

ST. CARLO ACUTIS

Blessed Carlo Acutis was canonized as a Saint on Sunday, September 7, 2025. He is the first Millennial to be canonized by the Catholic Church.

He was born in 1991 and died of leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15.

He is known for his great devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Known for his deep faith and computer skills, he used his computer skills to draw attention to Eucharistic miracles around the world. His miracles exhibit, featuring more than 100 documented miracles involving the Holy Eucharist throughout history, has since traveled to thousands of parishes across five continents.

Born in London in 1991 and raised in Milan, Carlo Acutis attended daily Mass from a young age and was passionate about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Shortly after his first Communion at the age of 7, Carlo told his mother: "To always be united to Jesus: This is my life plan."

Carlo called the Eucharist "my highway to heaven," and he did all in his power to make the real presence known. His witness inspired his parents to return to practicing the Catholic faith and his Hindu au pair to convert and be baptized.

Many of Carlo's classmates, friends, and family members testified to the Vatican how he brought them closer to God. He is remembered for saying, "People who place themselves before the sun get a tan; people who place themselves before the Eucharist become saints."

Shortly before his death, Acutis offered his suffering from cancer "for the pope and for the Church" and expressed a desire to go "straight to heaven."

Known as a cheerful and kind child with a love for animals, video games, and technology, Carlo Acutis' life has inspired documentaries, digital evangelization projects, and the founding of schools in his name. His legacy continues to resonate strongly with a new generation of Catholics.
