TODAY'S READINGS

<u>First Reading</u> - Woe to the complacent, stretched comfortably on their couches! Their wanton revelry shall be done away with (Amos 6:1a, 4-7).

Psalm - Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).

<u>Second Reading</u> - Compete well for the faith. Pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness (1 Timothy 6:11-16).

<u>Gospel</u> - There was a rich man who dined sumptuously each day. Lying at his door was a poor man named Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31).

HOW GOD INTENDS US TO LIVE

Today's readings are again directed to believers, communities of faith. As in last week's reading, Amos confronts us with a condemnation of those whose lives are focused on pleasure and self-absorption. The psalm contrasts that focus with the Lord's-justice for the oppressed; food for the hungry; freedom for captives; sight to the blind, raising of those who are bowed down; loving the just; protecting strangers, orphans, and the widow; and by doing so, thwarting the way of the wicked. St. Paul urges Timothy to pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Luke tells the familiar tale of the wealthy man and the poor beggar at his doorstep, who experience life very differently in this world and in the next. We are once again being given clear indications about how God intends for us to live our lives. reminds us that we dare not The Gospel ignore the needs of others, acting as though we don't notice their suffering. God's call to us is much too clear to disregard for even one more day.

All Hallow's Eve (Halloween), All Saints Day & All Souls Day will be here soon, and the popular female grim reaper character known as Santa Muerte will be everywhere. Here's something you might not be aware of. Santa Muerte means "Saint of Death" and is a cult! This female grim reaper is NOT part of the Catholic Communion of Saints; it is a demon which is worshipped and invoked by the cartels for protection. The origin can be traced to Mexico around the 1960's, but some claim it comes from the Aztec and Mayan indigenous people, and others claim other origins for this destructive cult.
