TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - The Lord is not deaf to the wail of the orphan, nor to the widow when she pours out her complaint (Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18).

<u>Psalm</u> - The Lord hears the cry of the poor (Psalm 34).

<u>Second Reading</u> - The Lord will rescue me from every threat (2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18).

<u>Gospel</u> - All who exalt themselves will be humbled, all who humble themselves will be exalted (Luke 18:9-14).

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship Because with God. relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair open -minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. As Jesus tells his parable about the prayer habits of a Pharisee and a tax collector, our hearts long to become as gentle as Christ's.

ALLHALLOWTIDE

The Church traditionally held a vigil on All Hallows' Eve when worshippers would prepare themselves with prayers and fasting prior to the feast day itself.

ALL SAINTS' DAY is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1st. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven.

ALL SOULS' DAY in Roman Catholicism is observed on November 2nd to remember all the faithful departed and those who are believed to be in purgatory. The Roman Catholic doctrine says that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help cleanse these souls in order to be pure and fit the Beatific vision.
