

MISSION STATEMENT: To serve the needs of the growing faith community in this part of Southern Nevada, composed of residents, weekend visitors and snowbirds who pray together, work together so as to build up the body of Christ; to be witnesses likewise, to the historical legacy of the first recorded Catholic Mass in Nevada celebrated in Laughlin in 1776 by Father Francisco Garces, a Franciscan missionary.

Weddings: Weddings are normally celebrated on Saturdays at 11:00 a. m. Registered and active parishioners should contact the priest at least six months in advance to make the arrangements.

Directions to St. John the Baptist Church: From Casino Dr. go west on Bruce Woodbury Drive (across from the Edgewater Hotel). Continue approximately 3 miles to Needles Highway, turn left. At El Mirage Way (the first traffic light), turn right. Drive approximately 2 blocks, St. John's is on the corner of El Mirage Way and Banyon Drive.

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

TODAY'S READINGS

<u>First Reading</u> - The Lord said to Cyrus, his anointed, "I am the Lord, there is no other" (Isaiah 45:1, 4-6).

<u>Psalm</u> - Give the Lord glory and honor (Psalm 96).

<u>Second Reading</u> - Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to the church of the Thessalonians: We thank God always for all of you (1 Thessalonians 1:1 -5b).

<u>Gospel</u> - Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's (Matthew 22:15-21).

IN GOD ALONE

Isaiah speaks to us today of Cyrus, King of Persia, anointed by the Lord. God calls Cyrus by name and leads him in service to the Israelites. In this passage we hear that it is the Lord who gives Cyrus his title, who arms him against his enemies, and who opens doors and unbars gates before him. And God does all of this so that the people will know that "I am the Lord," and that "there is none besides me" (Isaiah 45:6).

Paul opens his letter with essentially the same notion-that in God alone we find our grace and peace. Paul also gives thanks to God on our behalf, calling to mind our work of faith, hope, and love. And in the familiar Gospel reading, Jesus tells the Pharisees to give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.

If you would prefer to bring you own water in your own containers, Fr. Charlie will be happy to bless the water at no charge. Not a bad idea to keep some holy water in our homes during these tumultuous times.

All Masses on November 1st and 2nd will be at the church.

ALL SAINTS DAY - Wednesday, November 1st is a HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION on which all faithful Catholics are expected to attend Mass. This is as real an obligation as the obligation to attend Mass every Sunday throughout the year, except in cases of sickness or real necessity. All Masses for ALL SAINTS DAY and for ALL SOULS DAY will be at the church. No Masses at the Riverside on these two days.

<u>ALL SOULS DAY</u> - Thursday, November 2nd is a special day for remembering our deceased relatives and friends.

There is a very long tradition of praying for those who have died. This concept predates Christianity. All cultures have some form of remembrance of those who have died. In the Catholic Church, we observe November 2nd as All Souls Day, a day on which we remember and pray for our deceased relatives and friends. We really believe in the Communion of Saints-the unity that exists among those of us still living here on earth, those who have died and are being purified in purgatory, and those who have reached their final goal of eternal happiness in heaven.

There is a long tradition of visiting churches on All Souls Day, and of visiting cemeteries, which are where the bodies or cremated ashes of our loved ones are placed after their funerals. In some cultures, a special meal is prepared and eaten in remembrance of those who have died. It is a beautiful day to call to mind those memories of the people we have loved and cared about in the course of our lives. There can be great joy in talking about and remembering the details of the lives of those who have gone before us.

In 1915, Pope Benedict XV granted to all priests the privilege of celebrating three Masses on All Souls Day-one for a particular intention, one for all the Faithful Departed, and one for the intentions of the pope. The only other day on which this privilege is granted to priests (other than pastoral necessity) is Christmas Day. Here at St. John the Baptist in Laughlin, we will celebrate the three All Souls Day Masses consecutively beginning at 8:00 AM. The first Mass will be for the the second Mass will be for all the Faithful Departed, and the third Mass will be for the Intentions of Pope Francis.

Please return your ALL SOULS DAY envelopes to the church PRIOR to November 2nd, so we can have them on the altar for all three Masses.

While it is NOT an obligation to attend Mass on All Souls Day, we hope that many people will honor their families and friends who have died by joining us for one of the Masses on All Souls Day.

Please feel free to bring a photo of your deceased loved ones to the All Souls Day Mass you are attending. We will have a table prepared for these honored photos in front of the image of St. Joseph, the Patron of a happy death. You may bring them home with you after Mass.
