Reading 1 - Gn 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God added: "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9

Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.

Reading 2 - 1 Pt 3:18-22

Beloved:

Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

Gospel - Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God:

"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven: and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

Lord, hold our troops in your loving hands. Protect them as they protect us. Bless them and their families for the selfless acts they perform in our time of need.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

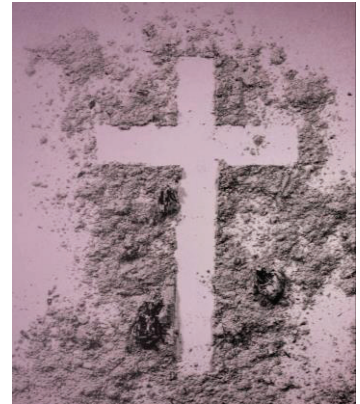

HOW TO DISPOSE OF PALMS AND OTHER BLESSED SACRAMENTALS

The practice of the Church has been to dispose of these items in a reverent way. We ask that you please do not return your used palms or sacramentals to the church but to reverently dispose of them yourself. This can be done in one of two ways. The first is burning blessed items such as used palms reverently in a fire. Just be sure to burn the items completely, even if that means disassembling the items to ensure proper burning of all the parts. The second is to bury the items, especially nonflammable ones, reverently in the ground in a place which will be undisturbed.

LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

On this first Sunday of Lent, it is a good opportunity to reflect on the three primary spiritual practices associated with the Time of Lent: prayer, self-denial (fasting), and good works (almsgiving). While these practices are always to be essential components of a disciple's life, the forty days of Lent are a time when we are asked to intensify them so as to become more faithful to God's Word as did Jesus in the desert. Deepened prayer helps us to hear the Word of God more clearly and to become more responsive in following the Lord's will in our lives. Prayer also increases our love of God by deepening our relationship with the Lord. Self-denial frees us from being enslaved by our appetites or dominated by wasteful practices. Self-denial, especially fasting, also awakens us to the needs and suffering of others and allows us to experience the frailty of the human condition so as to grow in compassion for those who live in constant need. In performing charitable works (almsgiving), we express our love of God in our love of neighbor and begin to make a practical difference in the lives of others as a witness of our discipleship. Charitable works (almsgiving) also challenge us to let go of the false security of our possessions and the illusion of self-sufficiency by our responsible care for others. Thus, these three practices are interconnected: prayer, self-denial, and good works all lead us into a practical and more profound love of God and neighbor. Lent is not so much about what we "give up", but rather what we "give to" God and others. Thus, each of these three practices (prayer, fasting, and almsgiving) is meant to deepen and sanctify our relationship with God, relationship with self, and relationship with others.



Think about it: How can I deepen my prayer life during these forty days of Lent so I can hear the Word of God more clearly as it is being spoken to me? What are some of the enslavements I experience, and how can the practice of self-denial help free me from being governed by those enslavements? (Do I control my desires or do my desires control me?) Who needs to experience my mercy and charitable works, and how can I express my love of neighbor in a practical way during this Lenten Time?

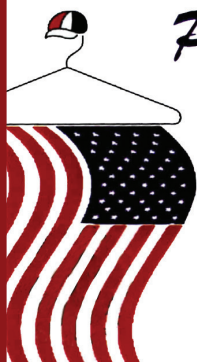

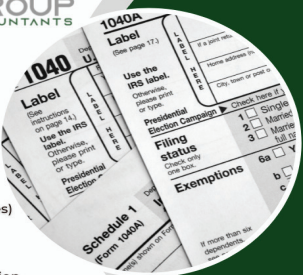

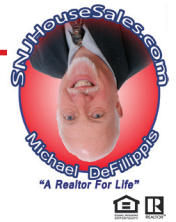
