## **Prayer for Religious Vocations**

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven: and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

#### Reading I - 2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

**Responsorial Psalm - 137:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6** - Let my tongue be silenced if I ever forget you!

#### Reading II - Eph 2:4-10

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

#### Gospel - Jn 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

#### LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

Our Scripture passage comes from the Gospel of John 3:14-21. This passage contains one of the most famous and frequently quoted passages in the Bible – John 3:16). The focus on this singular verse can sometimes cause us to miss the rich meaning in the surrounding verses. Several central themes of John's Gospel emerge for the first time in these verses and so they are an important resource for understanding the central message and ministry of Jesus.

The first verses of this passage introduce the theme of "eternal life". To fully understand this message, we need to back up two verses to John 3:12-13 where Jesus identifies Himself as the unique revealer of God: the One who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. It is one thing for Jesus to be the Revealer, but the question as to how Jesus accomplishes His revelation of God remains. That is the purpose of the first verse of this Sunday's passage: Jesus will carry out His great work of revelation as the Son of Man when He is "lifted up". The term "lifted up" (sometimes translated as "exalted") is a reference to His Crucifixion. Thus, Jesus, the Revealer and Word of God, will communicate to us most clearly who God is when He is on the Cross of Calvary. This revelation on Calvary is given for a purpose – so that we can have eternal life by believing in God present in the Crucified Jesus.

Eternal life, then, is the primary purpose of Jesus' mission; it means being drawn into the revealing love of God and united to the Lord now and forever. Eternal life, then, doesn't begin at our death; rather, it begins when we "believe" in Jesus' revelation on the Cross. It is important to note that the words "faith" or "belief" never appear as nouns in John's Gospel. Instead, the terms faith or belief only appear as verbs. That's because John wants us to know that faith is not just a collection of intellectual precepts. Faith is an active and dynamic immersion in the life of grace. To "believe" doesn't mean that we simply memorize a creed; it means that we are active participants in the life and love of God.

**Think about it:** What do most people think the term "eternal life" means? John's understanding of "eternal life" is that it begins now through our active participation in God's life and love. How does his understanding inspire me?
