Reading 1 - 2 Samuel 5:1-3

In those days, all the tribes of Israel came to David in Hebron and said: "Here we are, your bone and your flesh. In days past, when Saul was our king, it was you who led the Israelites out and brought them back. And the LORD said to you, 'You shall shepherd my people Israel and shall be commander of Israel.'" When all the elders of Israel came to David in Hebron, King David made an agreement with them there before the LORD, and they anointed him king of Israel.

Reading 2 - Colossians 1:12-20

Brothers and sisters: Let us give thanks to the Father, who has made you fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light. He delivered us from the power of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

Gospel - Luke 23:35-43

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven: and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

THE LEGION OF MARY

Are you looking for a way to serve God, your parish and the larger Church? The Legion of Mary performs the corporal works of mercy: visiting the sick and homebound, visiting the prisons, providing transportation to church for those without transportation, religious instruction, praying for the deceased and evangelization. Its primary purpose is to develop personal holiness. Active Members meet weekly for prayers, planning and discussion. They devote two to four hours per week working to save souls. There is also Auxiliary Membership which provides prayer support for Active Members. Please join us Thursday morning after the 8:30 AM Mass in the St. Joseph Room. All are welcome.

LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

Today's Gospel passage (Luke 22:35-43) invites us to reflect on two lasting lessons that Jesus gives from the Cross of Calvary. The first lesson is this: it is never too late to ask for God's mercy. The Good Thief turned to Jesus in his last moments of life and Jesus accepted his act of faith. Regardless of what the Good Thief had done, it is this final act of faithful petition and acknowledgement of his need for God's mercy that our Lord hears and to which our Lord responds. It would have been easy for the Good Thief to give into despair or desperation in his final moments. It would also have been easy for the Good Thief to believe that his sin was beyond forgiveness and his life beyond redemption, but he didn't do that. Instead, the Good Thief made an act of faith and hope in God's mercy at the last minute, and Jesus granted that mercy. This scene teaches us that it's never too late for us to seek God's mercy either and that there is no reason to ever despair or think that we are beyond redemption. Jesus is a king who wants every possible subject to be with Him in paradise forever and He simply waits for us to ask for that privileged sharing in eternal life. The Good Thief knew that he did not deserve such mercy and so he could receive it as a pure gift from God. That is an example for us to imitate and celebrate when it occurs. The second lesson is this: love never dies. Because God is love, any action done with love is done with God and is eternal. The love of Jesus manifested for us on the cross is an eternal witness of God's love for His people. That witness never dies and has inspired generation after generation of heroic saints and martyrs to imitate the love of Jesus on the cross. That love inspired men and women to lay down their lives day after day in faithful service to others. Any truly loving action reflects this love of God and partakes in the love of Jesus manifested on the cross. The love of Jesus conquered sin, death, and hatred. The love of Jesus forgave, reconciled, and redeemed. The mission of the Church is to live in the shadow of the cross and to make this divine love known to all humanity throughout history. The Church, then, is commissioned to love as loved.

Think about it: Why do I think Jesus wanted the reconciliation with the Good Thief to be the last ministry He accomplished on earth?
