## Sunday, September 20 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Matthew 20:1-16a

This narrative points out the difference between mercy and justice. When Peter asks how often he should forgive someone who wrongs him, Jesus answers, "...not seven times: I say seventy times seven times." Jesus then narrates the story of the king who was merciful to his official by forgiving him all his debts, but this same official showed no mercy to his own servant.

### **First Reading – Isaiah 55:6-9**

Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked his thoughts; let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways  
and my thoughts above your thoughts.

### **Second Reading – Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a**

Brothers and sisters: Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me life is Christ, and death is gain. If I go on living in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. And I do not know which I shall choose. I am caught between the two. I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit. Only conduct yourselves in a way worthy of the gospel of Christ.

### **Gospel – Matthew 20:1-16a**

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

### **The Nicene Creed**

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. ## LIVING AS MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

Our Scripture passage for this Sunday comes from the Gospel of Matthew 20:1-16a. In this text, Jesus teaches us about the generosity of God by using the Parable of the Vineyard Owner. This parable gives us insights into the mind of God that challenge our commonly held notions of fairness and generosity. As disciples, we are called to take on the "mind of Christ" and so this parable challenges us to think differently about how we exercise fairness and generosity in our lives. The process of thinking differently with its resultant practical change in life is more commonly known as repentance.

One thing to note is that the owner of the vineyard goes out several times to hire workers for his harvest. The owner's multiple trips could reveal how much the Lord desires that everyone be given a place in the Kingdom. According to this interpretation, the Master of the Vineyard brought in more and more people so that he could include as many people as possible. This interpretation focuses not only on the importance of the harvest but also on the importance of inclusion and involvement in the work of the Gospel. The message is this: The Lord has a place for all peoples in the Kingdom, and each of us has our part to play. This individual role is our vocation in Christ. If we feel like we haven't found our place in the Church's mission or ministry, we are like the workers still standing around at noon or the ninth hour. There is a place for everyone in the work of the Church as Saint Paul taught in his epistles. Sometimes we have to ask the Lord to help us find our place and be willing to respond generously when He calls us to offer ourselves to Him so the work of the Gospel can continue. Whatever our talents may be, God gave them to us for a reason. Our gratitude for the gift of our lives and God-given talents and opportunities is expressed in how we place our lives in the Lord's service and use those gifts to build up the Kingdom of God.

**Think about it:** Many people may be seeking a deeper connection with God through involvement in a faith community, and they are like the people who are still standing, in the town square late into the day. Who is someone I know whom I can invite to join me in the vineyard of my faith community.

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
