Vehicles are not allowed beyond the car park and on the reservoir dam.

We have very limited parking space so parents will not be able to remain on site during the day.

Please bring a packed lunch, a drink and snacks.

During the event; the InTouch Number will be 07764 162444 (Howard Nelson) please be aware, he may be on the water, and replies may come at the next break time.

The days will include Sailing for one session and SUPs / paddle sports for the other. The event is designed to have a taste of water sports. You won't be able to take part in the activities without a completed health form and a leader present (for U18).

Directions

Splash is being held at Whitewater Activity Centre Off Racecourse Road Stamford PE9 3JD. The gate can be found at what3words [///cones.fend.oven](https://www.what3words.com/#!/cones.fend.oven)



From the A1 (Northbound or Southbound):

Leave the A1 at the Stamford (Carpenters Lodge) junction.

If coming from the North, turn right over the A1 towards Stamford.

If coming from the South, turn left towards Stamford.

Follow the B1081 (London Road) into Stamford.

After approx. ½ mile, turn left onto A43 Kettering Road towards Easton on the Hill. Pass by Stamford Junior School, Under the A1 and continue on Kettering Road (A43) until you reach Racecourse Road.



Turn Left onto Racecourse Road and continue along Racecourse Road until you reach the turning for the Whitewater Activity Centre (see picture above).

*The medical profession take the view that the parent's consent to medical treatment cannot be delegated. The view is explicit in the children's act 1989. Thus the medical consent forms have no legal status and a doctor/nurse insisting upon parents' consent to a particular treatment has the right to do so. For this reason we do not insist on a parent signing the above consent. However, it can be a comfort to medical staff to have general consent in advance or to have the leader on hand to be able to sign forms required by the medical authorities.
