Chiropractic focuses on diagnosing and treating musculoskeletal disorders through manual techniques, including spinal adjustment and joint manipulation, addressing their impact on nervous system function and overall health.


Education & Training

- Chiropractors complete 4,200+ hours of clinical and classroom instruction.
- Like an MD or DO, chiropractors earn a 4-yr professional doctorate, including comparable education to medical doctors in the rigors of anatomy, physiology, neurology, and diagnosis.
- Chiropractors require supervised clinical training and gain significant hands-on training.

Provided Healthcare

- Chiropractors perform diverse clinical functions, including patient assessment, case management, communication, and treatment.
- Chiropractors are board-certified and licensed to diagnose and treat patients without a referral.




Loss of Patient Choice

Consequences of Disparities in Reimbursement

- · Reduced access to care
- Loss of options for conservative, non-drug, non-surgical care
- Continuity of care suffers from network limitations & reimbursement disparity
- Disproportionate Impact on Vulnerable Populations
 - Elderly, Low-Income, Veterans, Disabilities
- Patients may be forced to travel farther or delay treatment
- Increases long-term healthcare costs across Iowa
- Loss of integrative healthcare approaches that combine chiropractic care with other therapies

Fair, Reasonable, and Equitable

- It is vital to create fairness and consistency in reimbursement across the sector and avoid arbitrary decisions that could negatively affect healthcare providers and ultimately their patients.
- The state of Iowa supports equitable and fair practices within our healthcare and insurance industry. This includes ensuring that all providers, including Doctors of Chiropractic (DCs), are paid fairly and consistently.
- It is important to ensure that the fees for services for DCs are not reduced, maintaining the integrity and viability of their practice within the healthcare system.
